REGULATIONS FOR PASSENGER SHIPS PROCEEDING FROM THE NORTH AND MIDDLE ISLANDS OF NEW ZEALAND TO OTHER PARTS OF THE WORLD.

THE accompanying Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand, under the Imperial Passengers Act 1855, is published for general information.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the Governor did declare the length of the voyage for a passenger ship proceeding from any part of the Islands of New Zealand to the respective places therein mentioned, and did declare what should be the scale of diet, and the medicines, medical comforts, and medical instruments for the use of the passengers. And whereas it is desirable that the same should be amended:

Now therefore, in exercise of all powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Sir George Ferguson Bowen, the Governor of New Zealand, do hereby revoke the hereinbefore recited Proclamation, and do proclaim and declare that for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage for a "passenger ship" between any part of either of the Islands known as the North and Middle Islands of New Zealand and the under-mentioned places respectively, shall be determined by the following scale, that is to say:—

From any part of either of the Islands known as the North and Middle Islands of New Zealand.	If the ship be propelled by sails and/or steam engines or wholly or in aid of sails by steam engines of not less power than sufficient without the aid of sails to propel the ship after the rate of five statute miles an hour.

And I do further proclaim and declare that the scale of diet for the use of the passengers during the said several voyages, shall be in accordance with the thirty-fifth section of *The Passengers Act 1855*.

And I do lastly proclaim and declare that the medicines, medical comforts, medical instruments, and other matters deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during the said several voyages, shall be such as are prescribed by the forty-third and forty-fourth sections of the said Act.

Given under the hand of His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at the Government House at Wellington, and issued under the Seal of the said Colony, this eighteenth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.

DISTRICTS ASSIGNED TO INSPECTORS OF SHEEP.

INSPECTORS of Sheep are empowered severally to act throughout the colony, and although with a view to local convenience only, a district is assigned to the special care of each inspector, yet it is to be understood that their functions are not necessarily confined to special localities.

The boundaries of the districts into which the colony has been divided, and the name and address of the inspector to whom each district is at present assigned are hereinafter set forth, and published for general information.

BALLARAT DISTRICT—Commencing at Skipton, on the Enn Creek, by the southern and eastern boundaries of the Bangamie Run to the Linton and Skipton road; thence by the road to the township of Linton; thence by a straight line in an east north-east direction to Buninyong township; thence northerly to Mount Warrenheip; thence by the Melbourne and Ballarat road to Ballan on the Werribee River; by that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range, westerly along that range to the southern boundary of the Amphitheatre Run; thence along the summit of the Main Dividing Range to the north-east angle of Moora Station; thence along the eastern boundary of the Victoria Valley Station and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Mount Sturgeon Station to the Hamilton and Ballarat road, and east along that road to the starting point. Provided that all stations intersected by that road shall belong to the Hexham district.

Inspector, **EDMUND ELLIGT, Esq.**, Ballarat.

BEECHWORTH DISTRICT—Commencing at Mount Howitt, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by the said range easterly to a point due south of the eastern boundary of Gibbo Livingstone Creek; thence to the eastern source of the Livingstone Creek; thence to the source of the Cowrang Creek; thence down that creek to its junction with the Murray River; thence down that river to its junction with the Ovens; thence along the Ovens River to the King River, and up that river to its head; thence direct to the starting point.

Inspector, **MALCOLM MCEACHERN, Esq.**, Beechworth.

BENALLA DISTRICT—Commencing at Benalla; thence along the Broken River to the Goulburn; thence down the Goulburn to its junction with the Murray; thence up the Murray to the

junction of the Ovens; thence up the Ovens to the head of the King River; thence south-west to the Broken River; thence along the Broken River to the starting point:
Inspector, RICHARD PERRY, Esq., Benalla.

COLERAINE DISTRICT—Commencing at the north-west angle of the Town Reserve, Lindsay; thence by the South Australian boundary-line north to Musquito Creek; by that creek and a line easterly to Power's Creek; by the last-named creek southerly to its junction with the Glenelg River; by that river easterly to the Serra Range; thence to the Victoria Gap; thence along the western boundary of the Moora Victoria Valley Station and the Mount Sturgeon Station to the Grange Bourne; thence along the Grange to its junction with the Wannan River, and down that river to the Glenelg, and down the Glenelg to the sea; thence northerly along the Adelaide boundary to the starting point at Lindsay:
Inspector, JOHN HUNTER KERR, Esq., Coleraine.

EAST WIMMERA DISTRICT—Commencing at the source of the Avoca River; thence down that river to the south-west corner of Bael-bael Station; thence easterly along the southern and eastern boundaries of that run; thence northerly along the boundary of that station; thence down the Loddon River to its junction with the Murray; thence down that river to the Adelaide boundary; thence south along the said boundary to the south-west corner of Sunset Run; thence in a straight line to the southern end of Lake Tyrroll; thence in a direct line to Baninyong Station; thence along the Richardson River to its source; thence south to the Wimmera, following that stream to Mount Cole; thence easterly to the south-west corner of the Amphitheatre Run where the Avoca River rises:

GEELONG DISTRICT—Commencing at Skipton; thence as described in the boundaries of the Ballarat district to Ballan on the Werribee River; thence along that river to its mouth; thence along the shore of Port Phillip Bay and the sea to Cape Otway; thence along the western boundary of the Hexham district by Lake Korangamite to the starting point:
Inspector, CHARLES PEEVOR, Esq., Geelong.

GIPPSLAND DISTRICT—Commencing at Cape Patterson; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington northerly to the south boundary of the county of Evelyn, by part of the southern, the eastern, and part of the northern boundaries of the county last named, easterly, northerly, and westerly to the Main Dividing Range; by that range northerly and easterly to a point due south of the easternmost source of the Livingstone Creek; by a line north to said source; by the Livingstone Creek northerly to its junction with the Mitamitta River; thence by a line north-easterly to the south point of the range at Gibbo Station; by that range northerly and a line east to the source of the Cowrang Creek; by that creek northerly to its junction with the Murray, by that river southerly to its source at Forest Hill; thence by the boundary-line between Victoria and New South Wales south-easterly to Cape Howe; and by the sea-coast westerly to the point of commencement; including likewise Sunday Island and Snake Island:

HAMILTON DISTRICT—Commencing at the mouth of the Glenelg River and up to its junction with the Wannan, and up that river to the Grange Bourne; thence along that creek to the south-east corner of the Mount Sturgeon Station; thence along the western boundary of the Mount Sturgeon and Victoria Valley Station to the Glenelg River at the Victoria Gap; thence along the northern boundary of the Moora Station; thence along the eastern boundaries of the Victoria Valley and Mount Sturgeon stations; thence by the eastern boundary of the Crockstone Run to the Eumeralla River; down that river to the mouth; thence easterly along the sea-coast to the starting point:
Inspector, DUNCAN MCLAR, Esq., Hamilton.

HEXHAM DISTRICT—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a straight line northerly to the most southern point of Lake Korangamite; by the east shore of said lake to the north-west angle of Watch Hill Run; by the northern boundary thereof easterly to the Woody Yallock Creek; by that creek northerly to its intersection with the south boundary of Pitfield town reserve; by the southern and western boundaries thereof and a line west and north to the south boundary of Western Piggoreet Run; by the south boundary of that run and Mount Bute Run westerly; by the western boundary of Mount Bute, part of the southern boundary of Bamjanie Run to Skipton, Mount Emu Creek; thence along the main road to Streatham, and so on to its contact with the Hamilton District; thence along the western boundary of that district to the mouth of the Eumeralla River; thence along the sea-coast to the starting point:
Inspector, JAMES FENTON SHAW, Esq., Hexham.

KILMORE DISTRICT—Commencing at the intersection of the northern boundary of the county of Bourke with the Sandhurst railway, near Woodend; thence north-easterly and easterly along the boundary of the county of Bourke to its intersection with the Sydney road; thence along the summit of the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Muddy Creek; thence still along the range to the source of the Goulburn River, near Mount Bullar; thence down the Goulburn to its junction with the Murray; thence down the Murray to its junction with the Campaspe; and thence up that river to Kyneton; and thence along the railway to the starting point:
Inspector, FARQUHAR MACKENZIE, Esq., Kilmore.

MELBOURNE DISTRICT—Commencing at Cape Patterson; thence by the sea-coast and the coasts of Port Phillip Bay and Hobson's Bay westerly and northerly (including the islands of Western Port Bay) to the mouth of the Werribee River; by that river northerly to its source in the Great Dividing Range; by that range easterly to a point where it is intersected by the Melbourne and Murray River Railway, and along the Main

Dividing Range; by that range easterly to a point thereon where the northern boundary of the county of Evelyn leaves it; by part of the northern, the eastern, and part of the southern boundaries of said county to the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington; and by that county boundary southerly to the point of commencement:

SANDHURST DISTRICT—Commencing at the junction of the Campaspe and Murray rivers; thence along the Murray to the junction of the Loddon River; thence along the Loddon to the south-east corner of Bael-bael Run; thence along the southern boundary of that run to the Avoca River; thence up the Avoca to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence along the Main Dividing Range to the source of the Campaspe; thence down that river to the starting point:

SEYMOUR DISTRICT—Commencing at Seymour; following down the Goulburn to its junction with the Broken River; thence up the Broken River to its source; thence to Mount Howitt; thence along the Dividing Range to the Goulburn; thence down that river to the starting point:

BYE-LAW PASSED PURSUANT TO STATUTE 27 VICTORIA,
No. 176, 1863.

THE business of the council at all meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall be necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct, or when the council is in committee.

2. The business of the council shall commence as soon as a quorum is present, but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for such meeting the circumstance shall be entered in the minute-book, together with the names of the councillors present; or if no members of the council are present the secretary may adjourn the meeting for a time not exceeding three days, and if not adjourned, the meeting shall lapse.

3. The first business of each meeting of the council shall be the reading of the minutes of previous meeting and their confirmation, but no discussion shall take place thereon except as to the accuracy thereof.

4. After the disposal of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business:—1st, Correspondence read. 2nd, Petitions

and memorials presented. 3rd. Reports brought up. 4th. Motions and orders of the day considered. 5th. The correspondence taken into consideration. 6th. Incidental business. 7th. Tenders and accounts dealt with.

5. Petitions and memorials shall be presented by members of the council only, who shall be responsible for their being couched in respectful language. No debate shall take place on a petition or memorial at the meeting when presented, the only question being as to whether it shall be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee for consideration and report. If not referred to a committee, notice must be given in the usual way and the subject-matter considered in the orders of the day for the next ordinary meeting.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of council, and such other business as the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

7. No motion entered on the notice-book shall be proceeded with unless the member who gives such notice is present when the motion is called, unless some other member be authorized in writing by the proposer to take up the motion during his absence; and all notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

8. No motion shall be discussed or decided, nor shall any expenditure exceeding £50 be incurred, at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the proposer, shall have been given at a previous meeting.

9. No motion proposing any bye-law or standing order shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such bye-law or standing order; and such draft shall not be taken into consideration until the following meeting of the council.

10. Notices of motion, signed by the proposer, shall be handed to the secretary during the sitting of the council, and entered in a book to be kept specially for that purpose, and the member making such motion shall read the same aloud, and state the day for bringing on such motion.

11. No motion shall be discussed or decided at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing it, shall have been given at a previous meeting.

12. No councillor when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case the councillor calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subjects entered upon.

13. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

14. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover or the mover of the amendment last proposed, unless by permission of a majority of the council; and the president or acting-chairman shall without waiting for the interposition of the council call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment.

15. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any councillor (or any councillor appearing before the council in any improper manner) shall be considered highly disorderly, and shall be liable at the discretion of the council to a fine not exceeding Five pounds. The president shall be the judge. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand while addressing the council. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order and practice. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular words employed by a councillor, immediately on the same being used.

16. Any councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

17. In taking the sense of the council the president shall put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative. The council shall in all cases vote by show of hands, and on a division the names of the members voting *pro* and *con* shall be recorded. The ruling of the president shall be final in all points of order, and shall be given without argument or comment, except by way of citing precedents. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time the president shall decide who has the first claim to be heard.

18. The last amendment moved must be put first, and if carried, must then be put as an original motion on which an amendment can be moved as before. It shall be competent for any councillor to move one amendment on any one question, but no more.

19. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for the adjournment of the council, and if, on the question being put, the motion for adjournment is negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence by the president, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried then the business undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

20. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in a case of emergency with the consent of two-thirds of the whole council.

CONTRACTS AND WORKS.

21. All works amounting to more than £50 shall be done by contract, and shall be advertised in one of the local papers not less than twice consecutively.

22. All tenders must be sent in under cover on the printed forms, endorsed with the name of the work tendered for, addressed to the president, and deposited in the locked tender-box kept for that purpose in the secretary's office. The tenders must in all cases be made up and delivered strictly in accordance with the notices and printed general conditions and forms annexed to each specification.

23. Tenders are to be removed from the tender-box by order of the president, or chairman for the time being, in the presence of the council. A correct list is to be made of the names and amounts of each tenderer for entry upon the minutes, and the accepted tender must be marked by the president or chairman for the time being, provided that if the council for any sufficient reason deem such course convenient the tender may be referred to a committee or to the surveyor for examination before finally accepting or rejecting any tender. The council is not bound to accept the lowest or any tender presented.

24. All tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, and any contractor whose tender shall be accepted by the council, but who fails or refuses to pay the deposit hereinafter referred to, and sign the contract, shall forfeit the amount of his preliminary deposit and be disqualified for twelve months from tendering directly or indirectly under the council.

25. The successful tenderer shall within six days of the date of the notification of the acceptance of his tender deposit with the council a sum equal to 10 per cent. on the amount thereof as security for the due fulfilment of his contract, such amount to be refunded to the contractor on production of the surveyor's certificate of satisfactory completion of the work under the contract, but in the event of the non-performance of such work by the contractor through any cause whatever, the council shall be entitled absolutely to forfeit such deposit as liquidated damages for breach of contract, and to retain the same for their own use and benefit.

26. Money on progress payments may be paid to contractors at a rate not exceeding ninety per cent. on the surveyor's report of work performed at intervals of not less than one month.

27. All payments above one pound shall be made by cheque, signed by the president or acting chairman and one other councillor, and countersigned by the treasurer; but no such cheque shall be given unless the amount for which it is given shall have been previously passed at an ordinary meeting of the council.

OFFICERS.

28. No councillor or officer of the council shall have any pecuniary interest either directly or indirectly in any contract under the council, nor be received as surety for any officer or servant appointed by the council or any contractor under the council.

29. No salaried officer of the council shall take any part in elections of members for this shire council, excepting giving his own vote and taking such steps as are required in carrying out the Local Government Act. Any officer directly or indirectly canvassing or using his influence with any ratepayer or non-ratepayer to take part for or against any candidate at such election, who shall be proved to have done so, to the satisfaction of the majority of this council, shall at once forfeit his situation, and shall, without further consideration, be dismissed.

30. The surveyor shall lay all surveys, plans, specifications, and estimates of works proposed to be executed, before the council, and no alteration from the surveyor's plans and specifications, when approved, shall be made unless accompanied by a report in writing from the surveyor recommending such alteration, and which, if approved by the council, shall be minuted with estimate of cost of such alteration.

31. The shire council office shall be open for business between ten o'clock a.m. and one o'clock p.m., and from two until four o'clock p.m. The days named in clause 145 of the Local Government Act and such other days as the council may name from time to time being excepted.

32. No surveyor shall be eligible for office under this council unless he holds a certificate of competency as surveyor from the Board of Land and Works.

33. The secretary shall prepare vouchers for all salaries, and submit the same when due, together with all surveyor's vouchers for work done, to the first ordinary meeting of the council, and shall examine and mark all such vouchers before the amounts are paid.

34. The president shall have power to grant leave of absence to any officer for a period not exceeding three days, but for any longer period application must be made in writing to the council.

35. The treasurer shall present to the council at every ordinary meeting a statement of all moneys received by him since the previous one, and of all moneys lodged by him in the bank to the council's credit.

36. All moneys of the council amounting to ten pounds and upwards shall, within three days after they have come into the possession of the treasurer, be paid by him into such bank as the council shall from time to time appoint for that purpose.

37. The secretary shall present a statement of the financial affairs of the council at every ordinary meeting, and shall also keep a debtor and creditor account for each division of the shire, the same to be posted up for reference at all ordinary meetings. The secretary and surveyor of the council, with all requisite books and documents, shall attend all meetings of the council at least one hour prior to the hour of meeting, to afford members any information they may desire; and the other officers, when required are to attend. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the council, and shall affix the same to all contracts in the presence of two members of the council, and attest the same, and report having done so to the next ordinary meeting of the council.

38. The surveyor and secretary shall be custodians of all plans and specifications of works executed, and to be hereafter executed under the orders of the council; and all such plans and specifications shall be the property of the council, and the surveyor and secretary shall be jointly responsible for the safe keeping of the same.

39. The valuers shall make a fair and equitable valuation of all rateable property in his division; he shall complete his valuation within ten weeks from the time he enters on his duties.

40. The collector, shall previous to the day on which the ordinary meetings of the council take place, prepare a report showing the amount of rates received by him since his previous report, the moneys paid to the treasurer, and the amount of uncollected rates, and shall deliver the same to the secretary. The collector shall in no case distrain without the orders of the council. At a period not exceeding seven days all moneys received by the collector for rates, shall be paid to the treasurer, and the collector shall take the treasurer's receipt for the same. The collector shall not be paid his salary in full until he has collected all rates due in his division; or that the council are satisfied no more rates can be collected.

41. A public works committee, consisting of five members of council, three to form a quorum, may be elected at the annual or an ordinary meeting, and continue in office until the next annual meeting. In the event of any member of the committee ceasing to be a member of the council before the next annual meeting, the vacancy in the committee shall be filled by the member of council elected in his place. The duties of the committee shall be to examine into and report upon all matters connected with public works which may be referred to them by the council, for which purpose the officers, when required to do so, shall aid, and submit all documents and necessary information within their knowledge. The reports of the committee must be confirmed by the council at its next meeting before being acted upon, unless the matter referred to, is distinctly referred to it with power to take action thereon.

42. A finance committee, consisting of four members of the council, three to form a quorum, shall be appointed at every annual meeting, and shall continue in office until the next annual meeting, with the same provisions in the event of a vacancy as in the case of the public works committee. The duties of the finance committee shall be to examine and report upon the accounts respectively of the secretary, treasurer, rate collector, and generally to conduct and watch over the financial affairs of the shire, and report their proceedings to each succeeding ordinary meeting of the council.

43. Any subject may be referred to a committee of the whole council.

44. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor by post of the day on which the order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration; and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion came under consideration, or present at the time of voting on such motion, or any amendment thereon, shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings on each occasion of absence, unless reasonable cause can be shown to the council for such non-attendance.

45. For the purposes of these bye-laws the officers of council shall consist of the secretary, surveyor, treasurer, valuer, rate collector, thistle and dog inspector, poundkeeper, and office-keeper.

46. All fines under these bye-laws shall be applied to charitable uses.

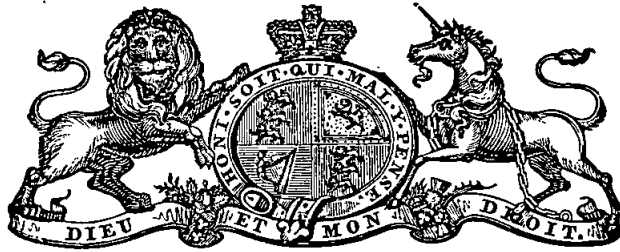
