SIR,—Her Majesty's Government have received through Her Majesty's Charge d' Affaires at Washington, a copy of a Circular issued by the United States Government respecting the necessity for vessels bound for the United States being provided with full manifests of cargo.

The Board of Trade have reprinted that circular, a copy of which is enclosed, and have caused it to be distributed at the Ports in the United Kingdom; and I have to request that you will take such steps as may be necessary for bringing it to the notice of persons interested in shipping in the colony under your government.

Your attention is called to the 25th section of the Act entitled An Act further to prevent Smuggling, and for other Purposes, approved July 18, 1866, which is as follows:—

"Sec. 25. And be it further enacted, That, on and after the first day of July next, the several provisions of the Act entitled An Act to regulate the collection of Duties on Imports and Tonnage, approved March two, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, relating to manifests, shall apply as well to vessels owned in whole or in part by foreigners as to vessels of the United States; and that the Secretary of State send copies of this section to all consular officers of the United States in foreign countries."

Your attention is also called to the fact that, by section 3 of chapter 42 of the laws of the second session of the 30th Congress, the section above quoted was amended by inserting the word "March" in place of the word "July" therein.

It will be seen that the law has already gone into effect, which places vessels owned in whole or in part by foreigners upon the same footing as vessels owned by citizens of the United States, so far as the production of manifests is concerned.

You are, therefore, instructed to inform the masters of all vessels leaving your port for the United States, that they are required to produce manifests in accordance with the provisions of section twenty-three (23) of the Act to regulate the collection of duties on imports and tonnage, approved March 2, 1799, a copy of which is hereto annexed. (Statutes at Large, vol. i. p. 644.)

And be it further enacted, That no goods, wares, or merchandise shall be brought into the United States from any foreign port or place, in any ship or vessel belonging in the whole or in part to a citizen or citizens, inhabitant or inhabitants of the United States, unless the master or person having the charge or command of such ship or vessel shall have on board a manifest or manifests in writing, signed by such master or or other person, containing the name or names of the port or port or place or places, where the goods in such manifest or manifests mentioned shall have been respectively taken on board, and the port or ports, place or places, within the United States, for which the same are respectively consigned or destined, particularly noting the goods, wares, and merchandise destined for each port or place respectively, and the name, description, and build of such ship or vessel, and the true admeasurement or tonnage thereof, the port or place to which such vessel belongs, with the name or names of each owner, according to the register of the same, together with the name of the master or other person having the charge or command of such ship or vessel, and a just and particular account of all the goods, wares, and merchandise so laden or taken on board, whether in packages or stowed loose, of any kind or nature whatsoever, together with the marks and numbers as marked on each package, and the number or quantity and description of the packages, in words at length, whether leaguer, pipe, but, puncheon, hogshead, barrel, keg, case, bale, pack, truss, chest, box, bandbox, bundle, parcel, cask, or package, of any kind or sort, describing the same by its usual name or denomination, together with the name or names of the several passengers on board the said ship or vessel, distinguishing whether cabin or steerage passengers, or both, with their baggage specifying the number and description of packages belonging to each, respectively, together with an account of the remaining sea stores, if any; and a

The following additional information, having reference to the navigation of the Inner route to Torres Strait, and corrections for the charts of the east coast of Australia, has been received from Commander George S. Nares, of H.M.S. Salamander, 1987. 1867 :

SHRET XVI.-MAGNETIC ISLAND TO DOUBLE POINT. The Zebra Shoal, and the shoals maked "E.D." (or existence doubtful), and "P.D." (or position doubtful), in its neighbourhood, have been carefully looked for in fine clear weather without success.

The discolored water, which is very prevalent in this part of the Inner route, has been, it is believed, frequently mistaken for

reefs.

Northward of Brooke islands a current sets to the northward with varying strength, dependent on that of the S.E. trade wind.

Southward of the islands the tides are regular, the flood

setting to the southward.

SHEET XVII .- DOUBLE POINT TO CAPE TRIBULATION. vessel coming from the N.W. in misty weather, which is very prevalent on the whole of the coast, is liable to mistake the point west of Cape Grafton for the real cape.

This point is therefore now named False Cape, and the hill, 1,371 feet high, immediately S.W. of Cape Grafton peak, Grant hill.

The Trepang fishers frequenting this part of the coast have lately reported a harbour a few miles northward of Double point, but it was not examined by Commander Nares. Commander Simpson, R.N., who assisted in the survey of this coast, in H.M.S. Rattleenake, states that there was only one fathom water on the bar.

The current running to the northward towards Green island reef and the Trinity opening is very dangerous, and requires to be guarded against in misty weather or at night. Green island and the vegetated sand-bank N.W. of it are good marks by day.

Vessels proceeding by the route between No. 1 reef (dry) and Lookout point, should, in order to clear the shoal north of Cape Flattery and the foul ground south of No. 1 reef, keep Capes Bedford and Flattery in one until High rock is seen between South Direction island and Rocky islets (wooded); then steer west until the Two isles (low and wooded) touch Cape Flattery; then N.W. for Lookout point, passing about a mile from the point, or midway between the point and saud-bank.

Round hill kept on with "End of Range" westward of it clears the shoal ground on the north side of Lookout point; when Lookout peak is seen between the two peaks of Cape Flattery, keep it so, and this mark will lead up to the Howick group.

There appears to be a good channel between No. I sand-bank and No. III. reef (covered), but it requires to be examined. No. II. reef, which formerly appeared on the charts, does not exist.

No. II. reef, which formerly appeared on the charts, does not exist.

The sand-bank on No. 1 reef shifts; it usually shows well above water, but it may occasionally be covered at high tide.

All the sand-banks on the reefs in the Inner route that are not vegetated are liable to shift; therefore complete dependence cannot be placed on thom as sea marks. They are sometimes seen well above high-water, and on again passing in a month's time, the sand having been distributed over the reef, the bank is scarcely seen, even at low water.

The sand-patch on the coast inside Lookout point is not readily distinguished from a number of similar ones, except when seen from the northward.

The neighbourhood of the Megæra rock, whose exact position is doubtful, and the shoal marked "E.D." south of L. reef, has not been examined.

The rock reported off Barrow point has been searched for

not been examined.

The rock reported off Barrow point has been searched for without success. Commander Nares believes in its existence, having confidence in the judgment of Captain Edwards, of the ship Woodlark, who reported it.

The high rock between Cape Melville and the Channel rock is now named the Boulder rock. It is about 30 feet high, and should not be mistaken by strangers for the Channel rocks north of it.

A special look-out was kept for a newly reported rock between Clack island and Cape Flinders, whilst passing the locality at low-water spring tides on a fine day. Three patches of discolored water were seen S.W. of Clack roef, looking so like reefs that a boat was sent to examine the neighbourhood, but no shallow water could be found.

The Salamander has so frequently passed close to the spot indicated, that Commander Nares considers the reef does not

The night course from Cape Flinders round Princess Charlotte bay requires revision. Instead of turning abruptly N.W. N., as given in the chart, it is recommended to keep in 7 fathoms water, altering course as requisite, and the lead will guide the ship directly towards No. 1 islet—low and wooded. This track has been tried several times by the Salamander, and never found to fail

never found to fail.

The sets of the tide in the northern part of Princess Charlotto bay are irregular, and require care. Near the Claremont group the flood tide sets south, ebb to the N.E.

The shoal mentioned in the Australia Directory, Vol. II., page 187, and said to have been seen W. by S. ‡ S. 3‡ miles from N. sand-bank, was not seen from the Salamander.

SHEET XX.—CAPE SIDMOUTH TO CAPE GRENVILLE.

The shoal marked "E.D.," between the Dugdale and U. reef, was not seen from the Salamander, but a patch of reef extends north from the sand-banks on U. reef, or else the sand has shifted further south.

The beacon on Y. reef was standing when the Salamander passed it in July, 1867. The sand on the reef only shows at low water.

Mr. Bowman of the brig Caroline reports a rock on the following bearings:—Restoration island, W. ½ N., and Sandy isle, N. by W.

A single low mangrove bush marks the south-east extreme of the Piper islands reef, and is a good mark on entering the passage, except at high-water spring tides, when it must be covered. Allowance should be made for a strong current setting N.W. towards the Home islands. A sailing vessel should keep well to windward after passing M reef.

SHEET XXI.-CAPE GRENVILLE TO BOOBY ISLAND.

Commander Nares recommends that the track north of Cockburn reef should be continued to the eastward of the treef, the veer-lated sand-bank on the north-west end of which is a good

The north extreme of the Cockburn reef is very hadly defined The north extreme of the Cockburn reef is very badly defined as seen from the deck or aloft, and therefore extremely dangerous. The wreck of the Sir A. Compbell has long disappeared. Another wreck is on the reef 2 miles further south; strangers might easily mistake this for the one marked on the chart, and hand in too soon.

had up too soon.

As this new wreck will soon be broken up, it is recommended that it should not be marked on the chart, and that the wreck of the Sir A Campbell be expansed.

There is faul ground close to the north-west end of Z reef. The two sand-banks in latitude 10 57%, loogitude 143°9°E., have a clear passage of 1½ unles between them; but there appears to be some inaccuracies in the chart in this neighbourhood. The sand-bank marked in the chart about 2 unless est of them is placed too for west; it has two small sand-banks to the northward of it, but their positions were not determined.

The Outer barrier reef between the Olinda and Pandora

The Outer barrier reef between the Olinda and Pandora entrances are inaccurately delineated on the chart. There is no continuous reef between the two entrances, but a number of detacthed patches overlapping each other, which at a short distance at sea would appear continuous.

There is apparently deep water over the projecting reef in latitude 11° 20° S, and longitute 14° 4° E.; but the tide race was very heavy on it as the Salamander passed to leeward.

The Pandora entrance is well defined and easily found, as the continuous reef from the southward ends abruptly at a vegetated sand-bank. The instructions in the sailing directions for entering cannot be improved.

The Olinda entrance; is the northernmost opening in the Barrier reefs near Raine island passage; it is well marked by the continuous reef north of it, but this entrance cannot be recommended unless ships are very far to leeward. In entering, the teefs on the north side of the entrance should be kept close on brard on the starboard band; with a good look-out from the mast-head a ship can safely enter any time before noon, after which the sun will be too far ahead. The Jardine river, inflatitude 10° 55′ S., longitude 142° 13′ E., has at low tide fresh water close within the east side of the entrance, when boats can fill from alongside. There is good anchorage in 6 fathoms within 200 yards of the sand spit running off the east side of the entrance, with the end of the spit bearing from South to S.W. Mootee headland, about 200 feet high, being the west extreme of the high land which extends to the S.W. from Cape York, is very consulcuous. The entrance to the river is 2½ miles west of the headland. There are no shoats south of a line from Barn island to the Jardine river; the coast may be safely approached, but between Mootee head and the river the 4.5-4thom line extends three-quarters of a mile from the shore. The sands inside the river shift with the tide, but there is no bar outside.*

The Jardine river rises on the east coast near Pudding Pan hill. It is subject to heavy floods during the N.W. mensoon (December to Murch), but when visited in the S.E. mensoon in 1836 it had an average depth of four feet above the tidal influence. Hours can only enter at half-tide, as at low-water the sand washing down by the stream forms numerous shifting bars, with not more than one foot water on them, for 3 miles from the entrance.

From latitude 25° 30° S. to 21° S., strong S.E. winds, with misty weather and a heavy sea, blow for a period of two or three weeks, and are followed by calins and light easterly winds, with very fine clear weather for about the same time. With the brometer above 30 00 inches, 8 E. winds may be expected, and when it rises to 30 20 inches, a strong breeze will set in from the same quarter for some days, usually accompanied by a bank of clearly defined white lumpy clouds with a misty horizon.

From lat 21° S. to 18° 30′ S. is a finer region, with southeasterly and northerly winds alternating.

From lat. 18° 30′ S. to 10° S. a strong S.E. trade generally blows, except from December to March, when the winds are sometimes light and variable, with rain squalls as Cape York is approached.
