WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has, by Orders severally made on the 27th day of April, 1868, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Buninyong shall, within twelve months from the 27th of April aforesaid, drain, form and metal forty-three chains and twenty links of the Rokewood Main road.

The Council of the Shire of Colac shall, within twelve months from the 27th April aforesaid, drain, form, and metal fifty-six chains of the Lower Western Main road. This Order is in lieu and substitution for a similar one dated 17th February, 1868, which is hereby revoked.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE RIDDELL CEMETERY.

BEFORE any interment shall take place application for permission shall be made to the Secretary a reasonable time previously, when an order will be given to the applicant upon payment of the proper charges.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

3. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton before sunset of the day previous to the burial.

4. The usual hours for interment will be from ten o'clock a.m. to six o'clock p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from ten o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year, except on Sundays, when the hours will be from two to five p.m. throughout the year.

5. The procession will be expected to arrive at the Cemetery at the hour appointed for the funeral.

6. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained, and kept as private burial places, and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed therein in accordance with these rules and regulations.

7. Permission to have a private burial place will be granted at the office of the secretary in the form and to the effect set forth in Schedule A annexed, upon payment of the proper fees.

8. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

10. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or tablet, and a plan of every monument, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.

12. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13. No fencing around any grave to be erected until approved by the trustees.

14. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.

15. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the grounds and a register will be kept by the secretary.

17. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
