NOTICE TO MARINERS.

WIDE BAY BAR.
Port Office, 27th April, 1868.
In consequence of the gradual shifting to the northward of the Channel over Wide Bay Bar, the following changes have been made in the leading marks for crossing the Bar:
The White Beacon on Inskip Point is moved further to the eastward, and an additional beacon, painted black, is placed on the eastern side of Hook Point, at the south end of Great Sandy Island. The Black and the two White Beacons in line lead over the Bar in not less than three fathoms at low-water springs.

Directions.—After passing Double Island Point, steer N.W. by N. some five miles, as formerly, opening out and again shutting in the entrance to Wide Bay Harbor. Continue this course until the additional Black Beacon and the two White Beacons are nearly in line, bearing about S.W. 4 W., and cross this Bar with these marks on. Immediately the Bar is crossed, haul to the southward until the points at the entrance again open out, when a vessel will be in deep water, and a course may be steered to pass the Red Buoy on the starboard hand as usual.

The Black Beacon in line with the Red Buoy points out the position of the South Channel over the Bar, in which, however, the water does not exceed two fathoms at low-water.

## WAITABA RIVER, PROVINCE OF TABANAKI.

THE following remarks on and sailing directions for the Waitara River, in the Province of Taranaki, are published for general information. NOTICE TO MARINERS.

REMARES ON THE ENTRANCE TO THE WAITARA RIVER, PROVINCE OF TABANAKI, AND DIRECTIONS FOR VESSELS APPROACHING IT.

APPROACHING IT.

The mouth of the Waitara River is about ten miles to the N.E. from the Flagstaff at New Plymouth. There is a shifting bar at the entrance, having sometimes one and sometimes two channels, the northern channel being principally used. It is high water on the bar at full and change at 9.45. The depth in the main channel at low-water spring tides is about two feet. Range of tides from seven to twelve feet.

The flood tide runs two to three knots; the ebb, three to four knots, in the entrance of the river. Along shore flood tide runs to the eastward, and ebb tide to the westward, from one to two knots.

knots.

The general soundings one mile off shore from New Plymouth to Waitara are from five to seven fathoms, sand and rocks. A submerged reef, known as the Puketapu Reef, lies about three miles to the west of the entrance, and extends to the distance of one mile from the shore. Shoal water extends, with rocky bottom, for half a mile off shore on each side of the Waitara

Wait for high water:—- A ball at each yardarm, and one on mast half the length of the yard below it.

Stand on, take the bar:—
Four balls horizontal on yard, two on each side of mast.

Bar dangerous, keep off:—
Three balls horizontal on yard, two on any one side of mast and one on the other. ...

Put to sea:—.
Two balls horizontal on yard.

No vessel should approach the shore at night within ten fathoms soundings. This depth will carry a vessel outside the points of the reef. In heavy south-west gales no vessel should approach the Waitara River. In flue weather a vessel drawing nine feet six inches may enter the river at spring tides. Vessels drawing from seven to eight feet may trade there habitually without difficulty.

## Sailing Directions for Vessels approaching.

From the North.—Bring the summit of Mount Egmont to bear S. \( \frac{1}{2} \) W, and steer on that bearing until White Bluff (Patininhi) bears N.E. by E. The vessel will then be about two miles from the flagstaff at the entrance to the river, which will bear S.E. by S. \( \frac{1}{2} \) S. and by steering on that bearing (or direct for the flagstaff) she will be brought to the anchorage, which is three-quarters of a mile from the shore, and may anchor, unless otherwise directed by the signal master.

From the South.—When abreast of the Outer Sugar Loaf Island (Motumahanga), distant quarter of a mile, steer N.E. until the flagstaff at the Waitara bears S.E. by S. § S., and then steer for the flagstaff until the Outer Sugar Loaf Island is in line with Kate Point (the western point of the Waitara bight), bearing S.W.-by W. (westerly). A vessel will then be in six fathoms, sandy bottom, and may anchor with safety three-quarters of a mile off shore. The Seal Rock (the westernmost of the Sugar Loaf group) should on no account be opened south of the Outer Sugar Loaf (Motumahanga) until the flagstaff at the Waitara bears S.E. A vessel will thus keep clear of the roll on Puketapu Rec. roll on Puketapu Reef.

Note.—During the past quarier, the excess of births over deaths amounted to 3.854, and the excess of arrivals over departures to 1.099.
