TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS OF LATER EURO-PEAN NEWS vid ADELAIDE AND MOUNT GAM-

HIER.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations respecting the Transmission of Telegrams of later European news (known as "Press telegrams") vid Adelaide and Mount Gambier, in addition to the Regulations published on the 2nd October, 1865.

1. The first telegram addressed to any single proprietary or agency of a public journal, publishing a daily issue in this colony, must be limited to fifteen hundred (1500) words.

2. No second telegram will be forwarded to the same agency or proprietary until at least another telegram, limited as above, shall have been transmitted, if requested, to a second or distinct agency or proprietary. BIER.

3. The telegrams will be transmitted strictly in the order of their reception at the Adelaide office; no precedence will be permitted unless as provided for by clause 2 of the general regulations referred to above.

INSPECTORS of Sheep are empowered severally to act throughout the colony, and although, with a view to local convenience only, a district is assigned to the special care of each inspector, yet it is to be understood that their functions are not necessarily confined to special localities.
