GENERAL REGULATION ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION ON 29TH APRIL, 1868.

In all schools having an average attendance of 100 or more than 100, in which there is an infant class reaching the average attendance of 25, a separate room, properly furnished, shall be set apart for the instruction of the infants, and the time table shall be so arranged as to have the said infants constantly under the charge either of a teacher or of a pupil teacher.

This Rule shall come into force on and after the 1st January, 1869.

The mortality in April was that of the average of nine years, but was relatively below it if the increase of population during the period is taken into consideration. The mean temperature was lower than usual by a degree and a half.

Deaths of males furnish a proportion of 56 per cent., and those of females a proportion of 44 per cent. to the total mortality. Deaths of children under five give a proportion of 52 per cent. to the whole against 56 per cent. in April, 1867; 54 per cent. in April, 1866; 60 per cent. in April, 1865; 62 per cent. in April, 1864; 58 per cent. in April, 1863; 53 per cent. in April, 1862; 58 per cent. in April, 1861; and 61 per cent. in April, 1860.

The days of highest mortality were the 25th, on which 20 deaths, and the 16th on which 19 deaths occurred; those of the lowest were the 3rd, for which only 4 deaths, and on the 17th and 20th, for each of which only 2 deaths were recorded.

A male died at the age of 75 years of fever, and a female at the same age of old age; a female aged 79 also died of apoplexy, a male aged 80 of heart disease, a female aged 80 of old age, a male aged 82 of bronchitis, and a female aged 82 of jaundice.

The deaths by violence numbered 18, of which, 15 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. Of the first, a laborer, aged 30, was killed by a kick from a horse; a railway porter, aged 38, by injuries to his arm caused by a train; a carter, aged 40, by being passed over by a dray; a market gardener, aged 55, by falling from a dray; a boy, aged 5, was drowned at Williamstown (found drowned); a boy, aged 6, in the New Dock; a boy, aged 9, in the Yarra; a man cook, aged 25, in the New Dock; a laborer, aged 30, in the Yarra; a lumper, aged 38, in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 42, at St. Kilda (found drowned); a storeman, aged 50, in the Saltwater River; an artist, aged 56, at Richmond; two children, aged respectively 12 days and 2 months, were suffocated in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born infant murdered by suffocation, and of a male, aged 55, who died of injuries received from a sailor (the latter was committed for trial by the coroner's jury on a charge of manslaughter, and since tried at the Supreme Court and acquitted). The suicidal death was that of a miner, who committed self-destruction by shooting.

The deaths in public institutions numbered 57, or 17 per cent. of the total; of these 38 occurred in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Military Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, and 1 in the Carlton Asylum.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census. Instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.92 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 173, of which 94, or about 54 per cent., were of males, and 79, or nearly 46 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 98 were under one year of age, 42 were between one and two years, 13 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 160, of which 93, or about 58 per cent., were males, and 67, or nearly 42 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 2 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 6 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were eighty and upwards.

Deaths from zymotic diseases, both in March and April were in a proportion of between 37 and 38 per cent. to the total mortality. The numbers however fell from 145 in the former to 124 in the latter month. A great decrease took place in fatal cases of dysentery and diarrhoea the numbers of which fell from 84 to 30. On the other hand, fatal cases of scarlatina increased from 8 to 10, those of diphtheria from 18 to 29, those of croup from 3 to 4, those of whooping-cough from 15 to 17, and those of typhoid and infantile fevers from 3 to 12.
