PETITION FOR THE CONSTITUTION OF A ROAD DISTRICT.

BENALLA AND THE VICINITY.

A PETITION bearing the signatures of forty-eight persons, being landholders and householders in Benalla, and the area proposed to be incorporated as a road district, has been received, wherein the petitioners pray that the area described in a plan and description previously submitted, may be proclaimed as the "Benalla Road District."

They state that the proposed district contains more than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than £10,000.

The description of the area is as follows:—"Commencing at the junction of the Ovens and Murray rivers; bounded on the

east by the Owens River, running south to the south-east corner of the Killawarra run; thence along the south side of that run to the north-east corner of the Springs station; thence along the east side of that run to the north-west corner of the Killferra run; thence along the north side of that run to its junction with the Fifteen-mile Creek run; thence south along the east boundary of the Killferra and Fern Hills runs, being the Oxley Shire boundary; on the south, in a westerly direction, by the southern boundary of the Fern Hills, Samaria, Lima, and Warrenbayne runs, being the north boundary of the Mansfield Shire; thence along the west side of the Warrenbayne run to its junction with the south-west corner of the Goomalibee run; thence along the east side of that run to the south-east corner of the Upotippon run; thence along the south side of the Upotippon, Gowangardie, and Arcadia runs to the Goulburn River; on the west by the east bank of the Goulburn River in a northerly direction to its junction with the Murray River; and on the north by the south bank of the Murray River, running east to the point of commencement."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the above-mentioned Petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council on Monday, the 20th day of July next ensuing.
