ADJUSTMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT AND THE SHIRE OF BUNINYONG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* (27 Victoria No. 176, § 284) it is amongst other things enacted that, for adjusting the boundaries of shires and districts to those of electoral districts, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, if it shall seem fit, but so far only as may be necessary for such adjustment, to do without petition all or any of certain acts therein mentioned, and amongst other acts to take away from any shire or district any portion thereof, and to add to any adjoining shire or district or some one or more riding or subdivisions thereof the portion so taken away: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, a Road District was constituted under the designation of "The Bungaree Road District," and by another Proclamation, bearing date the second day of September, in the same year, the boundaries of the said district were altered, as therein described: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the ninth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, a Road District was constituted under the designation of "The Buninyong Road District," which district was altered by a Proclamation bearing date the second day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, as

therein described: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the said Buninyong Road District was constituted the Shire of Buninyong: And whereas it is expedient to adjust in part the boundaries of the said Bungaree Road District and Shire of Buninyong to those of an electoral district as provided by the said recited Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby proclaim that, with the advice of the Executive Council, I have taken away from the Shire of Buninyong a portion thereof, and have added such portion so taken away to the Bungaree Road District and the northern boundary of the said Shire of Buninyong to the southern boundary of the Warrenheip Division of the Electoral District of Ballarat East; and further, in order more clearly to show the boundaries of the said Road District and Shire respectively, I do hereby define the same in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the sources of the Bullarook Creek; thence by a line westerly to the north-east angle of portion 63, parish of Ballarat; thence south by the east side of the Creswick Creek road to the north boundary of the municipality of Ballarat; thence east and south by the northern and eastern boundaries of said municipality, and western, southern, and eastern boundaries of Warrenheip Electoral division, the two last being also the boundary of East Ballarat Electoral District, to the southern main Ballarat and Melbourne road; thence by a line south-easterly to the intersection of roads which form the north and west boundaries of a lot shown on the county map of Grant as immediately north of lot 32, Kerit Barret parish, and by a line continuous with the last-mentioned north boundary, to a point south of a point on the northern main Melbourne and Ballarat road, being by the last road from Ballarat municipality a distance of eleven miles forty chains, more or less; thence north to the northern Melbourne and Ballarat road; thence west to the western branch of the River Moorabool; thence northerly by the centre line of the said river to its source; thence by a line to the commencing-point.—(68.1400.)

THE SHIRE OF BUNINYONG.—Commencing at a point due west of the southern boundary of J. Winter's pre-emptive right and due south of the western boundary of section VIII. in the parish of Cardigan; thence east to the south-west angle of J. Winter's pre-emptive right; thence north to its north-west angle; thence by a line north to the south-east angle of section V. in the parish of Cardigan; thence north by the eastern boundary of said section V. to the centre of the main road from Smythe's Creek to Ballarat; thence by the centre of the said road to the southern boundary of the municipal districts of Ballarat; thence by the southern boundary of the said municipal districts, and western, southern, and eastern boundaries of Warrenheip electoral division, the two last being also the boundary of East Ballarat Electoral District to the southern Main Melbourne and Ballarat road; thence by a line south-easterly to the intersection of roads which form the north and west boundaries of a lot shown on the county map of Grant as immediately north of lot 32, Kerit Barret parish, and by a line continuous with the last-mentioned north boundary to a point south of a point on the northern Main Melbourne and Ballarat road, being by the last road from Ballarat Municipality a distance of eleven miles forty chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing south eighteen miles and twenty-five chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing west, forming for a portion of the distance the northern boundary of the Mount Mercer pre-emptive right, eighteen miles and twenty chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing north to the commencing-point.—(68.1400.)
