PETITION FOR A ROAD DISTRICT. VALLEY OF THE GOULBURN.

A PETITION has been addressed to the Governor, wherein the petitioners, fourteen in number, state that they are residents within the Valley of the Goulburn, and are holders of property liable to be rated under the 3rd section of *The Local Government Act* No. 176: that the district described by them, including the agricultural areas of Carrick O'Shanassy, Wahring, Dargalong, Bunganail, Pranjip, and a portion of Torrrensedale, contains more than forty square miles, and an amount of property liable to be rated therein over £10,000.

They describe the district as follows:—"Commencing at the north-west boundary of the Seymour road district; thence by a line to the north-east boundary of the said district; thence by a line north-east to the Sugar Loaf Hill; thence by a line north to the Broken River twenty miles above its junction with the Goulburn; thence by the Broken River to its junction with the Goulburn; thence by a line south by the Goulburn River to the starting-point."

The petitioners pray His Excellency to proclaim the above-mentioned district a Road District, by the name of "The Goulburn Valley Road District."

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said Petition be taken into consideration by His Executive Council on Monday, the 17th day of August next ensuing.

DEAD CHILD FOUND IN A QUARRY HOLE AT DOWLING FOREST.

TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS TO FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

EXTENSION OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE "ACT TO PROTECT GAME."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Act to Protect Game* (No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted that, for the purposes of the said Act, the term "game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act; and the terms "native game" shall mean and include all birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time after the passing of the said Act, by Proclamation, to name any other bird or animal which shall be included in such first or second schedule respectively, and after the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and the expiration of the period mentioned in such Proclamation for the time of its coming into operation, the birds or other animals so named shall be deemed and considered as being thenceforward included in such schedule; and it is further enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the second schedule thereof shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct; and it is also enacted that, if any person shall wilfully kill or destroy any native game within the period thereinbefore in the second section mentioned, or shall use any instrument whatever, net, or any other means within the period aforesaid for the purpose of killing or destroying any native game, such person shall upon conviction forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding the sum of Two pounds, in addition to the sum of Five shillings for each bird or other animal so destroyed: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the fourth day of December, 1867, all species of quail were named as additions to the birds mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, and the provisions of the said Act were extended to the twentieth day of December in each year as regards all the birds and other animals mentioned or included in the aforesaid second schedule: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the above-mentioned Proclamation of the fourth day of December, 1867; and with the advice aforesaid I do hereby name ALL SPECIES OF QUAIL as additions to the birds mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, and to be deemed as included therein from and after the date of the publication of this Proclamation.

And, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby extend the period of the year during which the provisions of the said Act shall be in operation as regards all the Birds and other Animals mentioned or included in the aforesaid second schedule, as herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

Birds and Animals.	Period of the year.
As regards emus, black swans, and all kinds of wild geese	In the present year, from 1st July to 20th December. In subsequent years, from 14th June to 20th December in each year.
As regards all other birds and animals mentioned or included in the second schedule of the said Act	From 1st August to 20th December in each year.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

SHIRE OF GLENELG.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE CASTERTON TOWN COMMON, APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF GLENELG.

ALL persons being resident householders on the township shall be allowed to depasture an equal number of cattle and horses, provided they are their own *bond fide* property, and fulfil all conditions connected with the same.

2. Carriers and others coming from a distance will be allowed to depasture their teams for twenty-four hours, free of charge.

3. No sheep will be allowed to depasture on the common, and no other animal without special permission; and no entire horse or bull over nine months old, without the consent of the managers.

4. All foals or calves over nine months old must be paid for as full-grown animals, and the owners of any cattle known to destroy fences or other property will be responsible for any damage done.

5. The agistment fees to be paid are as follows:—
Cattle over nine months old ... 1s. 6d. per quarter.
Horses do. do. ... 3s. 0d. "
Goats (if allowed) ... 1s. 0d. "

6. All fees to be paid quarterly in advance. The quarters to commence on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October.

7. All cattle and horses running on the common without being registered with the managers, or stock upon which the fees have not been paid, will be impounded.

8. No diseased cattle, or cattle that have been on runs where diseased cattle have been depasturing, shall be permitted on the common; and all such cattle must be removed, after notice in writing (signed by one of the managers) shall have been served on the person in whose charge they may then be, or they shall be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

9. Every care will be taken to ensure the safety of all cattle and horses placed on the common, but the managers will not be responsible for their production, or for such as may be driven off the common, stolen or strayed.

10. All cattle depastured on the common shall be distinguished by the common's brand, "T"; the branding to be done by the owners. The brand will be in charge of the herdsman, to whom, or to one of the managers, notice must be given before stock will be allowed to be removed.

11. The managers reserve to themselves the right to limit or decrease the number of cattle and horses, should there be an insufficiency of grass through fires or other causes; to levy a special rate should the fees be insufficient to pay all expenses; or to alter or amend the foregoing rules, as circumstances may require.
