## TREASURY RESERVE.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act of 1865*, power is given to the Board of Lands and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of public reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. The Board, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, have made the following Regulations with reference to the Treasury Reserve.

On and after the 18th day of October, 1867, the paths in the Treasury Reserve to be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

The following acts to be prohibited:—

1. Walking on any part of the grounds except on the paths.
2. Plucking branches, leaves, or flowers from any trees or shrubs in the reserve.
3. Throwing stones.
4. Breaking glass bottles on the paths.
5. Climbing on the gates, fences, or iron hurdles.
6. The posting of notices, bills, or placards of any kind on any of the fences enclosing the reserve.
7. Interfering with the channels for drainage or irrigation.
8. No wheeled vehicles, except such as are drawn or propelled by hand, will be allowed to be brought into the reserve.

Offenders against these Regulations will, in accordance with the 67th section of *The Amending Land Act of 1865*, be liable, on conviction before any justice, to pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (five pounds) for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any regulation, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (ten pounds).

## PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

The child's clothing consisted of an inside flannel of good quality, made like a night-dress, pinned so as to answer for a napkin, a ribbed calico night-dress trimmed with two rows of insertion in front, and an old blue blanket. There was also found with the child a Stephen's feeding bottle containing milk.

On the night mentioned above, at half-past ten, two females passed the Junction at St. Kilda, one of them carrying a child, and went by Fitz Roy street and Prince's street. About an hour and a quarter afterwards (11.45 p.m.) they were seen approaching the Junction from a different direction without any child. They were then accompanied by a man. From the Junction they took a cab for Queen street, Melbourne, but dismissed it at the intersection of Bourke street and Swanston street, and turned up Bourke street to the east.

The first woman, supposed Scotch, was aged about 30, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, stout built, with a full face and fair complexion and hair. She wore a black shawl and dirty white straw hat.

The second woman, supposed English, was aged about 18, 5 feet 6 inches high, stout built, with fair hair and complexion.

## FIFTY POUNDS TO TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contracts satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11.
