PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now recited Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or diminish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

ELMHURST TOWN COMMON.—Allotments 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and 8 of section 2, in the parish of Glenpatrick, and the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and constitute a town common for the use of all householders of the town of Elmhurst, viz: Commencing on the left bank of Glenpatrick Creek, at the point where the north-eastern side of the road forming the north-eastern boundary of sections 1 and 2, in the parish of Glenpatrick, abuts thereon; and thence by that road, bearing S. 30° 45' E. one hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 59° 15' E. one chain fifty links from the east angle of allotment 8 of section 2; thence by line bearing respectively N. 59° 15' E. one hundred chains, and N. 30° 45' W. one hundred and forty chains, more or less, to Glenpatrick Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek, bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, 1600 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.551.)

MEREDITH TOWN COMMON.—The Meredith Town Common, described in two several Proclamations dated respectively the 12th day of August, 1861, and the 21st day of January, 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the town of Meredith. Area, 240 acres, more or less.—(68.Q.895.)

MOORABBIN AND MORDIALLOC FARMERS' COMMON.—The Moorabbin and Mordialloc Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 18th day of March, 1861, and the 22nd day of October, 1866, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom allotments 14, 15 A, 17 and 18, at the Long Beach, in the parish of Lyndhurst, and the land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 15 A aforesaid; thence by lines bearing respectively east twenty-nine chains, more or less, and south sixty chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 64° 46' E. from the south-east angle of allotment 18; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing S. 64° 46' W. twenty chains; thence by allotments 18, 17, and 16, bearing N. 30° 35' W. fifty-nine chains thirty-two links; thence by allotment 15, bearing north-easterly five chains seventy-nine links; and thence by allotment 15 A, bearing S. 87° E. fourteen chains, and N. 3° E. twelve chains to the point of commencement.

RESTRICTION ON EXPORTATION OF ARMS AND GUNPOWDER AND OTHER WARLIKE STORES CONFINED TO SHIPMENTS TO NEW ZEALAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Customs*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the following goods may by Proclamation or Order of the Governor in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise, that is to say, arms, ammunition, and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles to be exported or carried coastwise, that is to say, being conveyed into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores; and if any goods so prohibited shall be exported from the colony, or carried coastwise, or be waterborne, to be so exported or carried, they shall be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and

sixty, the exportation of arms, gunpowder, ammunition, and other warlike stores, was restricted for the reasons stated in a previous Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of April, in the abovementioned year; And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the terms of such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby prohibit the exportation from any port or place in Victoria aforesaid to any part of the colony of New Zealand of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, military and naval stores, or any articles which may be converted to a military or naval purpose, except in manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned or referred to, that is to say:—From and after the date hereof, arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or other warlike stores, shall and may be exported to New Zealand only under license, in writing, first obtained for that purpose under the hand of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the time being, and only at the place, in the manner, and subject to the conditions (if any) specified in such license: Provided always that nothing in this Proclamation shall be construed to apply to the exportation of supplies for the use of Her Majesty's land and sea forces.
