By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Mannews Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amonest other things enacted that when any Crown hand remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any municipal district, or within five miles of any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-field common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time repreciain the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or diminish (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

RESTRICTION ON EXPORTATION OF ARMS AND GUNPOWDER AND OTHER WARLIKE STORES CONFINED TO SHIPMENTS TO NEW ZEALAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Str John Henry Thomas Manning Surron, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, initiated An Act to consolidate and amount he Laws relating to the Customs, it is amounts other things emeted, that the following goods may by Prochmation or Order of the Governor in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried constwise, that is to say, arms, amountainion, and graupowder, military and may stores, and any articles which the Governor shall judge expalse of being copyerted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or nextlest stores; and if any goods so prohibited shall be exported, from the colony, or carried constwise, or be water-hother, to be so exported or carried, they shall be forfeited. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and

sixty, the exportation of arms, gunpowder, ammunition, and other warlike stores, was restricted for the reasons stated in a previous Proclamation bearing date the seventeeth day of April, in the abovementioned year: And whereas it is deemed expedient to after the terms of such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby prohibit the exportation from any port or place in Victoria aforesaid to any part of the colony of New Zealand of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, military and naval stores, or any articles which may be converted to a military or naval purpose, except in manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned or referred to, that is to say:—From and after the date hereof, arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or other warlike stores, shall and may be exported to New Zealand only under license, in writing, first obtained for that purpose under the hand of the Conmissioner of Trade and Customs for the time being, and only at the place, in the manner, and subject to the conditions if any) specified in such license: Provided always that nothing in this Proclamation shall be construed to apply to the exportation of supplies for the use of Hre Majesty's land and see forces.
