I have received and laid before the Queen your despatches, of the number and dates stated in the margin, relating to the visit of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh to Victoria, in command of Her Majesty's ship *Galatea*, and describing the proceedings which took place on the occasion of His Royal Highness's visit.

The Queen has had much satisfaction in directing that a member of her family should visit her distant possessions in one of her ships of war; and Her Majesty has a further satisfaction in acknowledging, as personally grateful to herself, those demonstrations of loyal enthusiasm with which His Royal Highness has been received in every British community which he has visited.
