LIGHT AT BUSTARD HEAD.

ON and after the 29th instant, a dioptric light of the second order will be exhibited from the eastern headland of Bustard Head. It will show as a fixed light every alternate minute, the intervening minutes being occupied by a bright flash, preceded and followed by a short eclipse.

The tower from which the light is exhibited is painted white, and is thirty-three (33) feet high—the light standing at an elevation of three-hundred and twenty (320) feet above the level of the sea, and being visible from the deck of a small vessel about twenty-three miles.

The outer rock lying off Bustard Head bears from the Lighthouse N. five degrees E., distant about three (3) miles.

NEW ZEALAND DISEASED CATTLE ACT AMENDING ACT 1865.

Published in pursuance of "*Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865.*"

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled *The Diseased Cattle Act Amendment Act 1865*, section four, the Governor may, by any Order in Council, from time to time, annul, make void, or alter, or vary, and make anew any Orders in Council, regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or

other declarations made and published by the Governor under the authority of *The Diseased Cattle Act* 1861, or of this Act, or by the Superintendent of any Province, under or in pursuance of any power delegated to him under any of the powers of delegation contained in the said Act: And whereas by section five of the said Amendment Act, "as to regulations, appointments, and prohibitory and other declarations made by Superintendents of Provinces, in pursuance of any powers delegated under the powers of delegation contained in the said Act or this Act, the power of annulling, making void, or altering, or varying or making anew any such regulations, appointments, or prohibitory or other declarations vested in the Governor by this Act, may from time to time be delegated by the Governor in Council by warrant under his hand to the Superintendent of any Province." And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to John Parkin Taylor, Esq., so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Southland, all the powers which by the said fifth section of the said Amendment Act the Governor in Council is authorised to delegate: Now therefore I, the said John Parkin Taylor, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare, that after the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, the several colonies of Australia (that is to say) the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia, and Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Acts: and I do further proclaim and declare the following regulations for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the Province of Southland from such districts, and for the landing or driving of such cattle, and for the destroying of cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to these regulations:—

1. If any person shall import any cattle from either or any of the said infected districts into the Province of Southland, unless upon quarantine ground, and after having obtained from an inspector of cattle a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds for every head of cattle so imported into the Province of Southland.
2. If any person shall land or cause to be landed, or assist in landing, any cattle coming from either of the said infected districts in or upon any part of the Province of Southland, unless upon a quarantine ground, and after having obtained a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds for every head of cattle so landed.
3. It shall be lawful for and the duty of any inspector of cattle or police constable to destroy or cause to be destroyed any diseased cattle which shall be imported or landed contrary to these regulations.
4. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any inspector of cattle or any police constable acting under the authority of these regulations, every person so offending may be taken before two justices of the peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of Fifty pounds.
5. These regulations shall take effect from and after the date of publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

MILL SITE WITHIN THE PUBLIC RESERVOIR RESERVE, YACKANDANDAH, AUTHORISED, ETC.

THE Governor in Council has authorised the "Markham Reef Company," Hillsborough, to occupy a site within the Yackandandah Public Reservoir Reserve, at Back Creek, whereon to erect a quartz crushing mill, and to take and divert water from the aforesaid Back Creek to be used in connection with the said company's crushing machinery, subject to the following conditions:-

1. The site occupied under the authority of this Order shall be of no greater extent than is necessary for the erection thereon of the company's machinery, and the works and buildings connected therewith.

2. The quantity of water diverted and used shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand gallons per diem.

3. The water so diverted and used shall either be carried past the public reservoirs by means of an efficient race or drain, to be constructed by the company; in which case the company shall pay for the said water at such rates as may from time to time be determined by the Minister of Mines for the time being; or, at the option of the company, the water may be returned to the reserve, free from all impurity, and at such a point as to flow into the public reservoirs.

4. The operations of the company shall be at all times open to the inspection of any officer acting under the instructions of the Minister of Mines, and shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere (except as hereinbefore provided) with the purpose for which the reserve was made.

5. Previous to occupying the reserve as hereinbefore provided, the said Markham Reef Company shall deposit in the hands of the warden's clerk the sum of Fifteen pounds sterling as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, and this sum shall be held by the warden's clerk until the said company shall cease to occupy the said reserve. If the conditions be fulfilled, then, and in such case, the whole sum shall be returned to the depositors; but if any of the conditions be not fulfilled the whole of the said sum shall be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the reserve shall be defrayed out of the moneys so forfeited.

SCHEDULE B.

Referred to in the foregoing Order.

Manner in which the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, kerbed, flagged, macadamised, levelled, drained, and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole street, court, or alley, shall in no part have an inclination of less than one (1) in eighty (80), and where practicable, the entire length is to form one incline.

In laying on any stuff, it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick.

The transverse section of the street, court or alley (where the water-channels are on the sides), is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown to the water-channels shall not be less than one (1) in twenty-five (25).

Each street, court or alley shall have a bluestone pitched water-channel, either at each of its sides or in its centre, of sufficient capacity to meet the required drainage for the same, the width of said channel or channels in no instance to be less than two (2) feet.

The pitchers to be nine (9) inches wide, and from six (6) to nine (9) inches deep, and from nine (9) to fourteen (14) inches long, with upright sides, set in sand, and well rammed down to such section as the city surveyor may direct.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven (7) inches below the kerbstones of footpaths.

On either side of the roadway there is to be, where practicable, a footpath not more than three (3) feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a neatly dressed bluestone kerb from two (2) to four (4) feet long, six (6) inches wide, and fifteen (15) inches deep.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three (3) inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of one (1) in ten (10).

The roadway is to be covered with a coat of clean bluestone metal, 2½ inch gauge, nine (9) inches deep in the centre, and six (6) inches deep on the sides, and this, when necessary, covered over with a coat of good loam two (2) inches thick, and rolled with a corporation iron roller.

Whenever private residences lead from the streets, courts, or alleys, they are to be paved to the full width (of building line) with bluestone pitchers similar to those used in the channels.

All entrances from adjoining streets shall be pitched and kerbed either with four (4) inch bluestone cubes or nine (9) inch pitchers, as the city surveyor may direct, the sides being well supported with eight (8) inch stone korbings.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection, and subject to the approval, of the city surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the peculiarities of any case may require.
