NOTE.—The increase by excess of immigration over emigration during the past quarter has been—males, 1,001; females, 567; or 1,568 of both sexes. The arrivals from the neighboring colonies exceeded the departures thereto by 61, 1,738, and those from foreign ports exceeded the departures thereto by 61, but the departures to the United Kingdom were in excess of the arrivals therefrom by 281. The increase by excess of births over deaths has been—males 1,870, females 2,140; or 4,010 of both sexes.

THE subjoined Rules of the Supreme Court of Victoria having been duly laid before Parliament, are now published in accordance with the requirements of the 32nd section of the Act 15 Victoria No. 10.

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA. REGULE GENERALES.

The thirtieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.*

In pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of Victoria, the 15 Victoria No. 10, section 32, W, the Judges of the Supreme Court, hereby order as follows:—

1. That in addition to the means provided by the General Rules of this Court, dated the 29th day of November, 1853, Chapter 8, Section 7, for sureties to administration bonds and the execution of administration bonds, such sureties may justify by affidavits made in Victoria, out of Melbourne, before and such bonds may be executed by all or any of the parties thereto in the presence of and attested by any Commissioner of this Court for taking Affidavits in Victoria, not being the proctor or the partner or clerk of the proctor of the person or persons applying for such administration. Provided always that every such affidavit shall specify the particulars of the property of the person or persons making the same, and the values of such particulars over and above his just debts and liabilities respectively; and such affidavits shall be filed in the office of and be laid before the Master-in-Equity, who, if not fully satisfied therewith, may require further information or assurance as to the sufficiency of the security, either by further affidavit made as hereinbefore provided or by the personal attendance and examination upon oath of the proposed surety or sureties.

2. That the Seventeenth Section of the said Rules, Chapter 8, be repealed as to all administrations to be hereafter granted, and that all executors and administrators do and shall make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the lands, goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of them respectively, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them respectively, and the same so made to sign with their proper handwriting (or mark if illiterate), and do and shall exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same inventory to the office of the Master-in-Equity within three calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate or letters of administration respectively; and further do and shall respectively make or cause to be made a true and just account of their administration of the estate which they have undertaken as to their receipts and disbursements and as to what portion is retained by them and what portion remains uncollected, and the same so made to sign with their proper handwriting (or mark if illiterate); and do and shall respectively exhibit and deposit or cause to be exhibited and deposited the same account to the said office of the Master-in-Equity within fifteen calendar months next ensuing the order granting probate or letters of administration respectively. Provided that this Court may under special circumstances by order dispense with the performance of this rule, or excuse the omission to have performed it, as to allowing administration bonds to be put in suit.

3. That all administration bonds under orders to be made hereafter shall by condition (amongst other things) provide for compliance with the last rule as to exhibiting and depositing inventories and accounts.

4. That the forms of affidavits in the Schedule to Chapter 8 of the said General Rules be varied in the manner directed in the Schedule hereto annexed, and corresponding variations be made in affidavits as to administration and rules to administer for which no specific form is provided.

5. That the 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th Sections of the said Rules, Chapter 10, be repealed, save as to the number of words to be contained in a folio, and that affidavits complying with the conditions of the Common Law Procedure Act, Sections 378, 379, 380, and 381 be deemed sufficient in all branches of the jurisdiction of this Court.

SCHEDULE TO THE FOREGOING RULE NO. 4.

Executors' Affidavit that he will Administer.

(To substitute for present paragraph 3.)

That I will exhibit and deposit in the office of the Master-in-Equity a true and perfect inventory of the goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased within three months of the order for probate, and a true and just account of my administration of the said estate of the deceased within fifteen months of the said order, pursuant to the Rules of this Honorable Court.

Administrator's Affidavit that he will Administer.

(To substitute for present paragraph 2.)

That I will exhibit and deposit in the office of the Master-in-Equity a true and perfect inventory of the goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased within three months of the order for administration, and a true and just account of my administration of the said estate within fifteen months of the said order, pursuant to the Rules of this Honorable Court.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAW.—[15th August, 1867.]

At a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the Offices of the Board, Queen street, in the city of Melbourne, on the 15th day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

40. All societies entitled to the grant in aid of agricultural societies for the year 1867, shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue, until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or, in other words each pound of revenue above £500 in each case shall rate as Ten shillings.
