THE BELFAST AND WARRNAMBOOL GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the seventh day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Belfast General Sessions District and the Warrnambool General Sessions District were amongst others defined: And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation hereinbefore recited, as defines the limits and boundaries of the districts assigned to the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace appointed to be holden at Belfast and Warrnambool respectively; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the districts within which the said courts shall have jurisdiction in manner following, that is to say:—

BELFAST GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at Mount Abrupt, on the Sierra Range; thence by the line:
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forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Villiers, bearing east to Back Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the Hopkins River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to Lake Boloke; thence by the south-eastern shore of that lake bearing north-easterly to the mouth of Fiery Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to the road from Streatham to Warrnambool; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the east boundary of the town of Hexham; thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the road to Woolthorpe; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the north boundary of the town of Woolthorpe; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively west, south, and east to the road to Koroit; thence by that road bearing southerly to the north-west angle of the town of Koroit; thence by the north and east boundaries of that town bearing respectively east and south to the Tower Hill Lake road; thence by that road bearing southerly to the road from Warrnambool to Belfast; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to Parke's lane; thence by that lane and a line bearing southerly to the shore of the Southern Ocean; thence by that shore bearing westerly to the western shore of Lake Yambuk; thence by that lake and the Eumeralla River bearing north-westerly and northerly to the west boundary of the town of Macarthur; thence by the west, north, and east boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, east, and south, to the Eumeralla River aforesaid; thence again by that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the town of Penshurst; thence by a line and the south boundary of that town bearing east; thence by the east and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north and west to the road from Penshurst to Dunkeld; thence by that road and the road from Dunkeld to Cavendish bearing northerly and north-westerly to the north-west boundary of the county of Villiers; and thence by the said boundary of that county bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

WARRNAMBOOL GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing on the shore of the Southern Ocean, at the mouth of the Gellibrand River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to its source; thence by a range to the source of the Pirron Yaloak Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly and north-easterly to Lake Corangamite (the river, range, and creek aforesaid, being the boundary between the counties of Heytesbury and Polwarth); thence by the western shore of the said lake bearing northerly to the west boundary of the town of Foxlow; thence by the west and north boundaries of that town, bearing respectively north and east to the Gunneest Creek; thence by that Creek and a road being part of the

boundary between the counties of Hampden and Grenville) bearing northerly to the road from Pitfield to Skipton; thence by that road and the road forming the northern boundary of the parish of Borriyalook, bearing north-westerly to the Mount Emu Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-westerly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing west to the road from Streatham to Warranbool; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the east boundary of the town of Hexham; thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of that town, bearing respectively north, west, and south to the road to Woolsthorpe; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the north boundary of the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries of that town, bearing respectively west, south, and east to the road to Koroit; thence by that road bearing southerly to the north-west angle of the town of Koroit; thence by the north and east boundaries of that town bearing respectively east and south to the Tower Hill Lake road; thence by that road bearing southerly to the road from Warranbool to Belfast; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to Parke's lane; thence by that lane and a line bearing southerly to the shore of the Southern Ocean aforesaid, and thence by that shore bearing south-easterly to the point of commencement.

SPECIAL TEMPORARY LICENSES FOR THE SALE OF LIQUORS IN THE SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to Consolidate and Amend the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public-houses and the sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality) a district or place within which may be granted by the Petty Sessions of such district or place special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities, and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant), as specified in the 17th section of the said Act, viz.:—That the licensee shall be authorized to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons, to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the district undermentioned to be a district within which may be granted by the Petty Sessions of such district special temporary licenses for periods not less than one month for the sale of liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions hereinbefore specified.

DISTRICT REFERRED TO.

The whole of the Shire of Bairnsdale (exclusive of the towns of Bairnsdale and Brutten, and a distance of five miles from any portion of either of the towns).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains un-sold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be:

And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

WABDALLAH AND BANNOCKBURN TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within that portion of section 18, parish of Wabdallah, lying on the south-west side of the Geelong and Ballarat Railway, together with the unappropriated Crown Land within the town of Bannockburn, shall be and constitute a Town Common for the use of all householders of the towns of Wabdallah and Bannockburn. Area available for commonage about 800 acres.—(68. 18,934.)

YANDOIT GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Yandoit Gold-field Common described in a Proclamation bearing date the 19th day of January, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing on the right bank of Jim Crow Creek, at a point bearing east from the north-east angle of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Yandoit; thence by the north boundary of that parish bearing east one hundred and seventy-four chains, more or less, to the west boundary of Kennedy's pre-emptive section; thence by the west and south boundaries of that section, bearing respectively south thirty chains, more or less, and east thirty chains, more or less, to the road forming the west boundary of allotment 1 of section 1 on the Limestone Creek; thence by that road bearing southerly to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 10; thence by the north boundaries of allotments 2 and 1, and by a line bearing west eighty-six chains, more or less, to Jim Crow Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing northerly to the point of commencement.—(68.Q 19,556.)

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Dunneworthy Agricultural Area Temporary Common, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 30th day of July, 1866, the 26th day of November, 1866, and the 21th day of February, 1868: And with the advice aforesaid, I do also hereby proclaim the allotments and part of an allotment of land hereinafter enumerated and comprising an area of 3584 acres, more or less, to be and constitute a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of Dunneworthy, viz.:—Parish of Dunneworthy, allotments 49, 52, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 89, 90, 93, and part of allotment 13, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(68.Q 14,719.)
