* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.09 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

During the past ten years, deaths in February have ranged from 279 in 1863 to 520 in 1867. In the month under review the mortality has been 77 above the lower and 164 below the higher of those two numbers.

The maximum temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100° 8 and the minimum was 46°. The mean temperature (65° 6') was a small fraction above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day took place on the 19th, viz.:—from a maximum of 109° 8 to a minimum of 67°. The least range (8° 9') was on the 10th, viz.:—from a maximum of 70° 8 to a minimum of 61° 9'.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Sixty per cent. were of children under five against 57 per cent. in February, 1863; 74 per cent. in February, 1867; 53 per cent. in February, 1866; 64 per cent. in February, 1865; 62 per cent. in February, 1864; 65 per cent. in February, 1863; 68 per cent. in February, 1862; 66 per cent. in February, 1861; and 64 per cent. in February, 1860.

Only one person died during the month at a more advanced age than 75 years, viz.: a female aged 77, of apoplexy.

Fifteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month. The following are the particulars:—A farm laborer aged 30, died from a fracture of the neck occasioned by a fall from a cart; a laborer aged 51, from affection of the brain caused by an accidental injury; a boy aged 2, from a sunstroke; a boy aged 5, another aged 11, another aged 14, a drover aged 25, a gardener aged 29, a ship's cook aged 29, a stevedore aged 42, and a stevedore aged 46, were accidentally drowned; a station-manager aged 52, was suffocated by smoke in a burning stable; a male infant only a few hours old, was wilfully suffocated; a cardriver aged 30, and a carpenter aged 45, the latter an inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, committed suicide by hanging.

Fifty-three deaths or 15 per cent. of the whole occurred in public institutions, viz.:—33 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Industrial Schools, 5 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 215, of which 109, or nearly 51 per cent., were of males, and 106 or about 49 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 156 were under one year of age, 37 were between one and two years, 13 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 141, of which 91, or nearly 65 per cent., were males, and 50, or about 35 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 10 were between thirty-five and forty, 13 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 6 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 5 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, and 1 was between seventy-five and eighty.

Forty per cent. of the deaths in January were set down to zymotic diseases against 35 per cent. in February. Scarlatina and diphtheria caused 10 deaths in the former and 19 in the latter month, but, on the other hand, deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery fell from 105 to 77. Deaths from atrophy and debility, which are classed under the head of Developmental Diseases, increased from 33 in January to 44 in February.

**BOARD OF EDUCATION.
GENERAL REGULATIONS.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following General Regulations, in accordance with the provisions of Section VIII. of the Common Schools Act No. 149.

The following General Regulations relative to the training of teachers have been passed by the Board of Education, and will take effect from a date to be hereafter fixed by the Board, of which notice will be published three months before in the *Government Gazette*; and from such date rules 28-39, approved by the Governor in Council on the 25th January, 1864, and 22nd June, 1868, shall be and are hereby rescinded.

TRAINING.

36. A training institution will be established in connection with the Board, in which provision will be made for training teachers.

37. Lecture rooms and class rooms will be provided at the central schools, in which instruction will be imparted to students in training as hereinafter provided.

38. The central schools and such other schools in or near Melbourne as the Board may license will be employed as model and practising schools in which teachers in training shall attend, and take such part in the instruction of the classes as the superintendent of the training institution shall direct.

39. The Board shall have power to withdraw such license at any time should such schools not be conducted according to their requirements.

40. The number of students to be admitted will be fixed by the Board from time to time, and will be selected from the following classes of candidates:—

(1.) Teachers employed in common schools who are recommended by the inspectors for a course of training, and who shall pass the entrance examination in Appendix I.

(2.) Pupil-teachers who, having completed their course, have passed for the highest class of pupil-teachers, and have attained the age of eighteen years for males and seventeen years for females.

(3.) Other persons who, having attained the age of eighteen years for males and seventeen years for females, shall forward to the Board a certificate of moral character as in Rule 59, and a certificate of sound health, signed by a licensed medical practitioner, and who shall pass the entrance examination in Appendix I before an officer appointed by the Board.

41. The teachers-in-training will consist of intern and extern students; the former will reside in boarding-houses licensed by the Board, and the latter at their own homes, or with their relatives in houses approved by the Board.

42. The instruction given in the training institution shall be free both to intern and extern students.

43. In the case of teachers and pupil-teachers, as specified in Rule 40, who reside in licensed boarding-houses, the board will contribute a sum not exceeding £40 a year, for the maintenance of each male student-in-training, and not exceeding £35 for each female, which payments shall be supplemented by a further payment from each student at a rate not exceeding £15 per annum—the exact amount to be fixed from time to time by the Board. No payment for maintenance will in any case be made for a longer period than two years.

44. In the case of other persons admitted to training who reside in licensed boarding-houses, the Board will contribute at a rate not exceeding £25 per annum for each, and each such student shall contribute a further sum not exceeding £30 per

annum in the case of a male, and in the case of a female not exceeding £25 per annum.

45. The Board will appoint and pay a superintendent, who shall have charge of the instruction and training of the students, and also such assistant teachers, to act under his direction, as they may deem necessary.

46. Half-yearly examinations will be held of all students-in-training, and any student who is found not to have made sufficient progress will be liable to be dismissed from further attendance, and will forfeit all claim to aid.

47. Students at present in training will not be required to undergo any examination on entrance.

48. The details of the examinations will be found in Appendix I.

49. The boarding-houses in connection with the training institution shall be subject to such inspection as the Board may direct, and in the event of any of the requirements of the Board, in connection with the moral discipline, board, lodging, instruction, and general comfort of the students, not being complied with, it shall be competent for the Board to withdraw the license on giving one month's notice.

50. Every person entering the training institution shall be required to sign a declaration binding him to attend regularly through the course of training until he shall have obtained the lowest classification, or shall have received permission from the Board to discontinue attending such course, or shall have received notice of the withdrawal of the allowance for maintenance, and also binding him, should he successfully complete the required course, to teach in common schools for a period of not less than two years, and to accept any appointment which may be offered to him with the approval of the Board; and further binding him, in the event of his failing to comply with any of the above conditions, if an intern student, to refund to the Board any moneys which may have been paid on account of his maintenance, and if an extern student, to pay at the rate of £12 (twelve pounds) per annum for such time as he shall have been in training. In either case, whether of an intern or extern student, the Board may require a further guarantee for the payment of such moneys.

The following General Regulation has been framed by the Board of Education, and will take effect from 1st July, 1869, from which date Regulation 78, approved by the Governor in Council on 25th January, 1864, is hereby rescinded.

SCHOOL-HOUSES.

Every school receiving aid from the Board must have the inscription "Common School" placed conspicuously on the exterior of the building, and no other inscription shall be permitted excepting the distinguishing number of the school, or one or more of the following terms:—Male, female, infant, the proper name of the city, town, street, or locality in which the school may be situated, or the name of the founder.

In cases of denominational designations, employed to indicate the connection of the school with a church or place of religious worship, such as: St. Paul's, St. Francis', and the like, which have been in use before the passing of this Rule, or where the term National has been in use, the Board will not require their removal.

But in no case shall any part of such inscription be more prominent or conspicuous than the words "Common School."
