**GULF OF ST. VINCENT.**

The following information affecting the navigation of the Gulf of St. Vincent has been received in this Department.  
(All bearings are magnetic. Variation 6° easterly in 1869.)

**PORT WAKEFIELD.**

The Marine Board of South Australia has given notice, that two triangular beacons have been placed on Bird Hill, the termination of the low wooded range rising above the mangrove swamp southward of the town, as anchorage marks for large vessels.

*Bald Hill Beacons.*—The upper triangular beacon, about 50 feet above high-water mark is painted red, 16 feet high, and distant 322 yards E. 4 S. from the lower triangular beacon, which is painted white, and 20 feet in height.

*Channel Beacons.*—The channel leading to the anchorage has been recently deepened, and beacons have been placed on its edges; the western side of the entrance is marked by a black beacon with a round top, and the eastern side by a red beacon having a lozenge-shaped head: a similar black beacon and a red beacon are placed inside.

*Anchorage.*—Large vessels approaching this anchorage should shorten sail off the Spit buoy, and anchor in 4 fathoms low-water, with Bald Hill beacons in line; Sandy point, the end of the low mangrove swamp under Bald Hill, S.E. by E. 4 E.; and the Spit buoy S. 4 E.

**BASS STRAIT.**

Information has also been received from Navigating Lieutenant H. J. Stanley, Admiralty Surveyor, Victoria, of the existence of an extensive rocky ledge fronting Sea Elephant Bay, King Island.

(All bearings are magnetic. Variation 8° 20' easterly in 1869.)

**SEA ELEPHANT BAY.**

A rocky ledge, which appears to be several miles in length in a north and south direction, has lately been found to exist 6 miles seaward of Sea Elephant Bay, King Island; the general depths on this ledge are 4½ and 5 fathoms, but a patch with only 22 feet was found near the northern extreme, from which Sea Elephant Rock bore E. 4 S., distant 4½ miles.

As a dangerous sea will be found on this ledge during bad weather, ships should approach Sea Elephant Bay with caution.

**GREAT NORTH-EAST PASSAGE, TORRES STRAITS.**

CAPTAIN CHARLES EDWARDS reports having, on the 20th December last, while in command of the *Melanie*, passed over a dangerous coral patch, on the south-east side of the fairway of the North-east Passage into Torres Straits.

The least sounding obtained was two and a half fathoms, deepening gradually to five, and then suddenly to eleven fathoms. As it was about three-quarters flood at the time, the least depth of water on the patch cannot be estimated at more than nine feet.

While passing over this shoal—which only occupied about two minutes—the sandbank, which lies five miles to the southward of Poll Islet, bore W. by N. westerly, and Sue Islet N.N.W. 4 W.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public-houses and the sale of fermented and spirituous Liquors*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality), a district or place within which may be granted by the Petty Sessions of such district or place, special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities, and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant) as specified in the 17th section of the said Act, viz.:—That the licensee shall be authorized to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons, to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold; And whereas by a Proclamation dated the fifth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the Shire of Burn-dale (exclusive of the towns of Burn-dale and Bruthen, and a distance of five miles from any portion of either of the towns) was declared to be a district within which might be granted by the Petty Sessions of such district, special temporary licenses for periods not less than one month, for the sale of

liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions therein before specified: And whereas it is expedient to exempt from the operation of that Proclamation, the township of Omeo and all territory within five miles from any part of the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the district hereinbefore referred to, shall in future be defined as follows, viz:—

The whole of the Shire of Bairnsdale (exclusive of the townships of Bairnsdale, Bruthen, and Omeo, and a distance of five miles from any portion of any of the said townships).

REGULATIONS RELATING TO LICENSES TO CUT CONSTRUCT, AND USE RACES, DRAINS, DAMS AND RESERVOIRS UNDER "THE MINING STATUTE 1865."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of April, 1869.

WHEREAS by The Mining Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, to make regulations, not being contrary to the provisions of the said Act, for the purposes mentioned in the forty-third section thereof, and such regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: And whereas on the fifteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the Governor in Council made certain regulations relating to the granting of licenses for cutting, constructing, and using races, drains, dams, and reservoirs under the powers given by the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to alter the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order rescind the twenty-seventh clause and the schedule-H of the above-mentioned regulations of the fifteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and doth hereby make the subjoined regulation in lieu of the said clause and schedule, that is to say:—

TRANSFER OF LICENSES.

Any person to whom any such license shall have been issued shall be at liberty to transfer the same to any other person, provided that he shall give notice of such transfer to the Minister of Mines. Every such transfer shall be effected by an instrument in writing, signed by the transferee in presence of and witnessed by a justice of the peace, being a Warden acting for the time being in the division or part of the division of a mining district in which the land in respect of which the license shall be applied for shall lie; and shall be in the form in the schedule hereto marked H; and every person to whom any such transfer shall be made shall be subject to these regulations as fully as if the license had been originally granted to himself.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF MINING OFFICERS IN THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of April, 1869.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint such and so many officers and clerks and assistants to such officers and for such mining districts and divisions and places as to such Governor in Council shall seem right for the making of inspection and surveys and registration of claims and mines, and for performing such other duties in connection with mining as the Governor in Council shall think fit: And that the Governor in Council shall have authority by any general regulations or otherwise and in any individual case, if it shall be so thought right, to prescribe the powers and duties of such officers, clerks, and assistants, and also of any substitute who shall under the powers thereby given be appointed in the place of any officer, clerk, or assistant who shall be suspended, or removed, or incapacitated by illness, or absence, and the mode of exercising and performing such powers and duties, and the amount of remuneration of such officers, clerks, and assistants, and of any such substitute, and the mode of raising and paying such remuneration, and the time for which the same shall be paid, and whether the same shall be paid partly or in the whole out of the fees to be payable in respect of the services and duties to be by them respectively rendered and performed, and what fees shall be so payable: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following regulations in regard to the powers and duties of mining registrars, the district mining registrar, and their clerks and assistants or substitute, and the amount of remuneration of such officers and their clerks and assistants or substitutes, and the mode of raising and paying such remuneration in the Mining District of Ballarat, that is to say:—

DUTIES OF MINING OFFICERS.

The officers who shall from time to time be by the Governor in Council appointed by the title of District Mining Registrar, and Mining Registrars for the making registration of mining tenements within the Mining District of Ballarat, or within any division thereof, shall, within the district or division for which they shall respectively be so appointed, perform and discharge by themselves, or by any assistant or substitute appointed by the Governor in Council, the several duties as prescribed herein and pertaining to their respective offices within the division or district for which such officer shall be appointed, and any act, matter, or thing done by any assistant or substitute appointed as aforesaid shall be as valid and effectual as if done by the mining registrar. No mining registrar shall make registration of any claim or other mining tenement if every part of such claim or other mining tenement shall be without the boundaries of the division to which he shall have been appointed, but when any claim or other mining tenement shall embrace a portion of, or lie partly within any two or more divisions, it shall (except as provided in any bye-law which may now or hereafter be in force) be lawful for the mining registrar of any one of the divisions in which a portion of such claim or other mining tenement shall lie, to make registration thereof; and any registration made by such registrar shall be as valid and effectual as though the whole of such claim or other mining tenement lay within the division to which such registrar had been appointed, or as though the registration were made by each and every of the registrars of the several divisions in which such claim or other mining tenement shall be situated. It shall be the duty of the registrar who shall make such registration to give notice thereof forthwith to each and every of the registrars of the divisions in which such claim or other mining tenement, or any portion thereof, shall be situated, but the omission to give such notice shall not invalidate the registration.

MINING REGISTRARS' OFFICES.

Within the Mining District of Ballarat a proper office shall be provided for the safe custody of records relating to the titles to mining tenements throughout the said district, and such office shall be styled the District Mining Registrar's Office, and shall be under the charge and control of the District Mining Registrar; and within each of the divisions of said district a proper office or offices shall be provided for the safe custody of the records relating to titles to mining tenements within each such division, and shall be under the charge and control of the mining registrar appointed to such division.

OFFICE HOURS.

The several mining offices within the said district shall be kept open to the public from Ten o'clock a.m. till Three o'clock p.m. each day (Sundays and public holidays excepted), and the mining registrar or his assistant shall be in attendance at the office under his charge during the hours so appointed.

DUTIES OF DISTRICT MINING REGISTRAR.

The District Mining Registrar shall compile from the returns to be forwarded to him, as hereinafter directed, a complete record of the titles to all mining tenements and interests therein throughout this district, and may for the purposes of such compilation, at any time inspect any books and documents in the custody of the mining registrars of the several divisions,

and make extracts and copies therefrom, and may for the purpose aforesaid require such registrars, or any of them, at any time to render him such information and assistance as shall be necessary in that behalf; and the district registrar shall during office hours, permit any person to inspect the records in his custody, and if required so to do, the district registrar shall supply to any person demanding the same, a copy or copies under his hand of any records in his office, on payment being made to him for such inspection or copies of the fees set forth in the Schedule hereto numbered One. The District Mining Registrar shall be responsible for the correct compilation and safe custody of the records in his office of titles to mining tenements within and throughout this district, and in the event of the registration of any mining tenement in the office of the mining registrar of any division being lost or destroyed, the district registrar shall forthwith supply to the registrar of such division a copy under his hand of the record in the district office of the registration so lost or destroyed.

DUTIES OF MINING REGISTRARS.

Each mining registrar or his assistant shall attend at his office daily during office hours. It shall be the duty of the mining registrar to receive applications for mining tenements; to enter in a proper book to be by him kept for the purpose, a notice of such application, under the date and hour of the day on which such application shall be made; to give the applicant or applicants a certificate in such form as shall be prescribed by any bye-law which may now or hereafter be in force; to make registration in a proper book or books, to be by him kept for the purpose, of all mining tenements; to make transfers of all mining tenements or interests therein; to register liens upon mining tenements and interests therein; to make transfers of such liens; to keep a record of claims and water-rights held in reserve; to furnish when required, copies, under his hand, of any document or of any entry in any book in his custody; and within the first seven days of each month to forward to the office of the District Mining Registrar a complete return, under his hand, of all registrations, transfers, liens, and reserves by him effected and made, and of all acts by him done during the preceding month, affecting the title to mining tenements or interests therein, within the division under his charge; and the mining registrar of each division shall be responsible for the correctness of the register of the mining tenements and interests therein within the division under his charge, and for the correctness of the returns to be made as aforesaid.

SAFE CUSTODY AND DISPOSAL OF REGISTRATION BOOKS.

All registration books, plans, and other documents relating to mining, which shall be or come into the possession of a registrar by virtue of his office, shall be at the disposal of the Honorable the Minister of Mines, and the registrar shall be responsible for the safe custody of all such books and documents until he shall have delivered up the same to such officer as shall be appointed by the Honorable the Minister of Mines to receive the same; and all such books and documents shall, during office hours, be open to inspection by the public.

FEES, AND PAYMENT OF SAME.

The fees which shall and may be demanded and received by the mining registrars and district mining registrar for, or in respect of, duties performed by them, shall be such and such only as are prescribed in the Schedule hereto numbered One. Each registrar shall enter in a proper book, to be by him kept for the purpose, an account of all fees received by him, and shall apply or dispose of the fees so received by him in such manner as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct. The fees hereby authorized shall be paid before, or at the time of, performing the duty in respect of which they shall be payable, and the registrar to whom such fees shall be payable shall be responsible for the collection of such fees.

The said district mining registrar, mining registrars, clerks, assistants, and substitutes shall, in the performance of the duties hereinbefore prescribed, act in conformity with the bye-laws of the mining board for the time being in force in the said district so far as such bye-laws apply to the matter or thing in reference to which such duties have to be performed respectively.
