THE following directions for the navigation of Endeavour Straits, and the Gulf of Carpentaria, and for Investigator Roads, have been supplied by Captain Chas. Edwards, of the Melanie, and are published for general information.

SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR ENDBAVOUR STRAITS AND THE GULF OF CARPENTARIA.

Small vessels from the east coast of Australia, bound down the Gulf of Carpentaria, generally go through Endeavour Straits, and pass to the southward of Woody Wallis Island into the Gulf.

Of the several passages into Endeavour Straits, the best is that between Possession and Meddler Islands, as there are no mid-channel dangers, the islands on either side being high, and the tides, although strong, setting straight through.

A vessel in mid-channel, between Possession and Meddler Islands, should steer S.S.W.1W. three and a half miles, when she will be about a mile to the westward of Dayman Island; from thence eight miles on a S.W.1S. course will take her about three miles to the westward of Barn Island, with Ited Island open to the southward of it. Be careful to keep to the eastward of the Heroine-Rock, which may be ensured by keeping Meddler Island open to the eastward of Quoin Islet. INVESTIGATOR ROADS: SWEER'S ISLAND.

Sneer's Island shelters Investigator Road; it has rocks and foul ground extending off it to the extward; it has rocks and foul ground extending off it to the extward for about one and a half miles; cross bearings of Locust Rock, and the north-east point

of Sweer's Island, are the best guide for keeping outside of it; the south and south-west sides, also, have shoal water and rocky patches running off shore for about three quarters of a mile.

Inspection Hill, at the south-east point of Sweer's Island, is 104 leet in height, and being the only hill in the neighborhood, forms a good landmark.

Locust Rock is a small rocky islet, about one and a half miles S.E. by S. from Inspection Hill; it has a small reef (dry at low water), about one mile E.N.E. of it, both rock and reef are connected with Inspection Hill by foul ground. Locust Rock has also a bank of small gravel, running off it to the S.S.E. about one mile; the least water on it is one fathom.

Macdonald's Foint is the south-west point of Sweer's Island, it has rocks and foul ground running off it for about three quarters of a mile, and extending along the south side of Sweer's Island to Locust Rock; to keep outside the shoal water, do not bring Locust Rock to the southward of E. by S., nor Raft Point to the westward of N. by W.

Inscription Point, the west point of Sweer's Island, is of white sand, and on it the township of Caernarvon is situated.

Red Cliff's form the point projecting into the bay between North and Inscription Points.

North Point of Sweer's Island is Rocky and wooded.

Raft Point, the east point of Bentinck Island, is wooded, and easily made out; to vessels coming from the southward, it appears as the point of the land projecting from the west side of Investigator Road.

Roth Point, it is one and a quarter miles long, N.N.E. and S.W., and has a clump of trees near the south point; it is fronted towards Investigator Roads by rocks and shoal water, to clear which, Raft Point should not be brought to the east-ward of N.\cdot E.

Anchorage.—Vessels trading to Caernarvon, the township of Sweer's Island, should anchor to the westward of Inscription Point, at a distance from it of about three cables, in five fathom water, mud bottom; a favorite anchorage is with the Red Cliffs in sight over Inscription Point, about two cables lengths from the shore.

Directions.—To gain the anchorage in Investigator Roads, all but very small vessels must enter by the southern passage; vessels running in with a south-east wind should keep about three miles off the land until the centre of Sweer's Island bears north, when an opening will be seen between Raft and Inscription Points; a course N.N.W. should then be steered for the north point of Fowler's Island, until the north point of Sweer's Island is seen over Inscription Point; then steer for Inscription Point, and anchor about two cables lengths off, with the Rod Cliffs Just in sight over it.

Should the wind be from the northward, and the vessel have to beat in, care must be taken in approaching Locust Rock from seaward, to clear the reef to E.N.E. of it—the north-east point of Sweer's Island, bearing N. by W., just leads clear of this; to avoid the covered bank running off it to the S.S.E., Locust Rock should not be approached nearer than one and a half miles; the clump of trocs on the south end of Fowler's Island, bearing N.W. by W., will lead clear of the bank, but this will be difficult for a stranger to make out, as Bentinck and Fowler's Islands are low and in one—a surer guide is the lead;—in rounding Locust Rock closely, if you have less than ten fathoms water keep to the southward until Locust Rock is well open to the eastward of Sweer's Island, when the bank will be passed.—

Tides.—Flood tide sets to the southward, and ebbs to the northward, from one to two knots at springs; the strength of the strength of the prevailing winds, the tide going mostly with the wind.

Notice is hereby given, that there is a large snag on the Bar of the Buller River, which, in the present state of the channel, is right in the fairway of the North Channel.

The snag will be removed, or marked by buoys or beacons, as soon as practicable; and in the meantime masters of vessels are warned of its existence, and requested to observe closely the following directions:—

When entering in daylight, the flagstaff, and the beacon carrying the red flag, must be kept in one, and, failing this, vessels must be steered in close accordance with the directions of the semaphore arm at the flagstaff.

When entering by night, the (outer) red light and the (inner) bright light must be kept in one, if practicable, or, failing this, the bright light must be opened to the S.W. of the red light (or towards Cape Foulwind).

On no account must the line of the leading lights be crossed towards the N.E. till the vessel is inside the bar.

Change in Cape Reciffe Light to ware ships of too near an approach to the Roman Rock in Algoa Bay.

On and after the 1st December, 1888, a ray of Red Light will be shown from the Cape Reciffe Lighthouse, between a N. 39° E, bearing and the shore northwards from the lighthouse.

Bearings are magnetic. DIRECTIONS.

Vessels bound for Algoa Bay, after passing Cape Recific should not open the Red Light at the Cape until the Harbor Light upon the Hill is seen (which will first show red on a N. W. bearing, and lead nine-tenths of a mile eastward of the Roman, where a course for the anchorage may be shaped with safety). As the Hill Light cannot be seen from the Roman Rock, a ship is in safety so long as the light can be seen; but as its southern extreme of visibility leads only two cables north of the Rock, it is recommended that a course for the anchorage should not be shaped until the region of the Red Light is passed, and the Hill Light shows white on a N. W. by W. bearing.

In beating in or out of the anchorage, the opening of the Red Light at either of the lighthouses will be a signal for vessels to tack when near the vicinity of the Roman Rock.
