REDUCTION OF CHARGES.

Land Lines.—For a message of 10 words 2s., and for each additional word 2d.

Submarine Cable.—For a message of 10 words 5s., and for each additional 5 words, or fraction of that number, 2s. 6d.

The minimum charge for a Telegram from Melbourne to Tasmania is thus reduced to 7s. instead of 10s. as formerly.

PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING 1ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1869.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights, issued on or before the 1st day of September, 1868, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on the 1st day of September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number and will be in the like form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new roll in October next.

No Elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any province or district is entitled to a renewed Elector's Right for such province or district.—*Vide* section 21 of Act 334, and sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act* 1865.

YUPPECKIAR AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act* 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act* 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act* 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE YUPPECKIAR AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON, described in four several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 24th day of September, 1866, the 2nd day of September, 1867, the 22nd day of June, 1868, and the 9th day of March, 1869, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom allotments 87 and 88 in the parish of Yuppeckiar, comprising an area of Three hundred and eighty-eight acres two roods twenty-two perches.—(69.S.6185.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

SNAG IN ENTRANCE TO BULLER RIVER.

SINCE publication of the Notice to Mariners with reference to the Snag in the Fairway of the North Channel of the Buller River, dated the 7th of the present month, information has been received that the channel has worked further to the north-east, so that the sailing directions then published are no longer correct.

Vessels entering in daylight must keep the Flagstaff and the Beacon carrying the red flag (which is only hoisted at tide time) in one, and falling this, they must be steered in close accordance with the directions of the semaphore arm at the Flagstaff.

As the channel shifts so rapidly, no directions can be given for entering by night; and only masters who are so thoroughly acquainted with the port and the local signals, as to be able to take it without special directions, would be justified in attempting it.

The recent surveys, so far as yet completed, have only embraced the coast line from Jackson's Head (which is correct on the charts) to Grey River, and the whole of the coast line between these points is more or less out in the public charts; it may consequently be inferred that the coast line north of the Grey is, to some extent, inaccurate, and mariners are therefore cautioned and warned to exercise great care in approaching or coasting the land at night.

As an additional incentive to caution, it may be stated that it has several times been reported by officers commanding steamers on the coast; that it is necessary to steer half a point to the westward of the course indicated by the charts in shaping a course from Perpendicular Point in order to clear Cape Foulwind.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.02 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

In the month of April during the past ten years, the greatest mortality of Melbourne and suburbs (399) was experienced in 1865, and the least (265) in 1862. During the month under review, the deaths fell short of the larger of these two numbers by 55 and exceeded the smaller by 79.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 85°5 on the 4th and the lowest was 39°8 on the 29th. The mean temperature (57°7) was 1°3 below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34°7) took place on the 15th, viz.:—from a maximum of 75° to a minimum of 40°3. The least range (4°2) was on the 10th, viz.:—from a maximum of 59° to a minimum of 54°8.

Fifty-three per cent. of the deaths which occurred were of males, and 47 per cent. were of females. Forty-seven per cent. were of children under five years of age against 52 per cent. in April, 1868; 56 per cent. in April, 1867; 54 per cent. in April 1866; 60 per cent. in April, 1865; 62 per cent. in April, 1864; 58 per cent. in April, 1863; 53 per cent. in April, 1862; 58 per cent. in April, 1861; and 61 per cent. in April 1860.

Six persons died during the month at more advanced ages than 75 years, viz.:—a male aged 77 of dropsy; another male of the same age of nephritis; a male aged 80 of old age; a male aged 100 of diarrhoea; a female age 79 of rheumatic gout; a female aged 85 of fracture of the thigh bone.

Twelve violent deaths occurred during the month of which the following are the particulars:—A male child aged 1½ died of a fractured leg, a girl aged 14 of a fractured skull caused by being run over by a cab, a pointsman aged 35 from being crushed between two trucks on the railway, a laborer aged 36 of a fall from a horse, a builder aged 46 of an injury to the brain resulting from a fall from a horse, a female aged 85 of a fractured thigh, a male infant aged 14 days and a boy aged 5½ years of scalds, a commercial traveller aged 27 of the poisonous effects of a dose of balsam copaiba, a girl aged 3 of drowning in a water-hole, a female infant aged 3 months of suffocation in bed, and a female aged 40 of suicidal drowning while in a state of temporary insanity.

Sixty-two deaths or 18 per cent. of the whole number which occurred, took place in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Lying-in Hospital, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 163, of which 75, or about 46 per cent., were of males, and 88, or nearly 54 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 115 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 181, of which 108, or nearly 60 per cent., were males and 73, or about 40 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards,

Of zymotic diseases the most fatal were diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 46 deaths against 50 in March, and diphtheria, and scarlatina, which caused 14 deaths against 27. Most deaths in the month under review were caused by local diseases, especially those of the nervous system, which occasioned 46 deaths, and those of the digestive organs, which occasioned 34 deaths.

CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before
the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting or placing a monu-
ment in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trust-
ees, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to
have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone
according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole
use of such person and his or her representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission is to be made at the office
of the secretary. A certificate of permission will be granted to
the party applying for the same, upon the payment of the pro-
per charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the secre-
tary on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock
a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug not
less than five feet in depth, but persons requiring brick graves
or vaults, must construct them under the direction of the trust-
ees, or of some person appointed by them for that purpose;
and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or
vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto,
must be given with the order.

When a prospecting party shall have discovered gold in their claim, they shall, within seven days thereafter, post a notice of the same at the nearest post office, and shall also give written notice to the registrar of the division, who shall post a notice thereof at his office; and if any party shall neglect to give the said notices, then and in such case the extra ground shall be forfeited.

EXTENT OF CLAIMS IN NEW CREEKS AND GULLIES.

2. The extent of ground in new creeks and gullies shall not exceed one hundred and fifty feet in length, by fifty feet in width, and may include one or both sides of the creek or gully, per man.

3. That this bye-law shall apply to and be in force in the St. Andrew's East subdivision of the Castlemaine Mining District only.

The undersigned members of the Castlemaine Mining Board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

FUNERALS AT MELBOURNE.

TENDERS will be received until Noon on Wednesday the 9th June, from persons willing to undertake Funerals, as required in the several departments of the Government, at Melbourne (including Collingwood, Pentridge, Williamstown, and Hobson's Bay), from 1st July to the 31st December, 1869.

The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. Coffins to be sufficiently long and wide for the corpse to lay extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws.

Coffins to be properly lowered into the grave.

The graves to be of the proper depth.

The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for burial must be provided on every occasion, and in the case of Melbourne all funerals are to take place in the New Cemetery.

Separate prices must be stated for children under ten years of age and for adults—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment and minister's fees, conveyance, and all charges whatsoever.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

Security will be required either in cash, Government debentures or bank deposit-receipt, in the sum of £20 for Melbourne. Ten days will be allowed to complete the security.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of Twenty per cent, either in bank notes or by bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

The contract will be terminable by three months' notice either from the Secretary to the Tender Board on the part of the Government, or from the contractor; such notice to date from the first day of a month.

In the event of any charge of impropriety in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

The account, accompanied by a certificate that the burial service has been duly and properly performed, is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service, for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne.

Further particulars and forms of tender may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Melbourne.

Tenders, endorsed "Tenders for Funerals, —," are to be deposited in the Box at the Government Stores, or addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Government Stores, Melbourne.
