LIGHTS IN THE FRITH OF THAMES.

1.—Light on Graham's Town Wharf.

A Lamp Post has been erected on the outer end of Graham's Town Wharf, in the Port of Shortland, and a *Green Light* has been exhibited therefrom since the 13th of April, 1869.

The light is a green light, of low power, and will continue to be regularly exhibited from sunset to sunrise. It will be visible between the bearings of S.E.½E. round by E. and N. to N.N.W. ½W.

The light is elevated 18 feet above high water, and will be seen in clear weather about two nautic miles. Westward of S.E.½E. the light is out off to clear the mud flats in-shore, and it is cut off to the westward of N.N.W. ½W. to clear the mud flats, and as a guide for vessels entering Kaueranga Creek.

2.—Light on Tararu Point.

A small timber Lighthouse has been erected on Tararu Point, and the light will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise on and after the 1st day of August, 1869.

The light will be a *Red Light*, of moderate power, and will be visible over about two-thirds of a circle, or from about S. round by E. and N. to about N.W.

The tower, which is octagonal, on a square base, and painted white, is 31 feet in height over all, and the light will be about 28 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather about six nautic miles.

Vessels may anchor in 7 to 8 feet at low water when Tararu Light bears N. by W., and Graham's Town Wharf Light bears S.E. by E. ½E.

A depth of 10 to 11 feet at low water will be obtained by anchoring when Tararu Light bears N.E., Graham's Town Wharf Light bearing S.E. by E. ½E. as before.

(NOTE.—The bearings are compass bearings towards the Lights in every case.)

THE BOROUGH OF GRAYTOWN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of August, 1869.

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that any district not being a district wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne, or, save as therein provided, the town of Geelong, or of any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles, and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted, that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as therein-after mentioned of such petition, an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor by an Order in Council, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district, or any portion thereof, a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and it is further enacted, that in every such Order in Council as aforesaid the name and boundaries of the borough thereby constituted shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a "borough" hereinafter sometimes called a "proclaimed borough" within the meaning of the said Act, provided that such district shall not comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that after any part of any district shall have been constituted a municipal district or a borough under any Act relating to municipal corporations, such part shall cease to be deemed for the purposes of the now-reciting Act part of such first-mentioned district or of any subdivisions thereof, provided that all rates made under the provisions of the now-reciting Act before such constitution shall and may nevertheless be paid, levied, and recovered by the board of the district as though such constitution had not taken place; and it is also enacted, that every Order in Council made under the preceding sections of the now-reciting Act shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect upon such publication; and it is also enacted, that every shire shall, after the proclamation thereof as such, be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid, and save where in the now-reciting Act otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the now-reciting Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire, and be read accordingly: And whereas a petition, in accordance with the provisions of the first-recited Act, has been presented to the Governor by inhabitant householders resident at Spring Creek, in the Shire of McIvor, and notice of such petition has been duly given in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of July, 1869: And whereas no petition in opposition to the above-named petition has been received from inhabitant householders resident at Spring Creek as provided by the first-recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the first-recited Act, constitute the district hereinafter described a borough within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name

and boundaries of the said borough in manner following, that is to say:-

THE BOROUGH OF GRAYTOWN.—Commencing at a point bearing south 81° east twenty-seven hundred links from the south-east corner or angle of Saunders's pre-emptive right, on the Degay Ponds; thence bounded on the east by a line bearing north 8° 15' west forty-five thousand eight hundred links; thence by a line at right angles bearing south 81° 45' west twelve thousand eight hundred links; thence by a line again at right angles bearing south 8° 15' east forty-four thousand eight hundred links; and thence by the southern branch of the Degay Ponds, an average line twelve thousand eight hundred and fifty links home to the commencing point; and containing an area of eight and nine-tenths of square miles.
