THE MINING DISTRICTS OF CASTLEMAINE AND GIPPSLAND ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of August, 1869.

WHEREAS by the *Mining Statute* 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to divide any such district into any number of divisions, and to give to such district and each of such divisions some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries of, and also again to abolish any such district and divisions, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries, and from time to time to determine the number of members of the mining board of each district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and until the Governor in Council shall otherwise order the several mining districts and divisions created under the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. XXXII. and which shall be in existence at the time of the commencement of the now reciting Act shall be and shall be deemed to be mining districts and divisions

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under the said Act, provided always that no more than seven such districts shall be erected under the said Act unless addresses praying for a greater number shall be presented to the Governor by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas it is expedient to alter the mining districts hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the mining districts of Castlemaine and Gippsland, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof as so altered in manner following, that is to say:—

CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT—Commencing at the junction of the Darebin Creek with the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra to its junction with the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to its most western source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the most western source of Mollison's Creek; thence north-easterly by the Dividing Range to the source of the McIvor or Patter-son's Creek; thence north-westerly to the junction of the rivers Coliban and Campaspe; thence by the River Coliban and the Myrtle Creek to the Mount Alexander Range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence by that boundary and a line west to a point due south of the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence north to the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence west four miles; thence westerly to the junction of the Tullaroop or Deep Creek and the River Loddon; thence by the Tullaroop or Deep Creek to the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of that parish, and again by the Tullaroop or Deep Creek to its junction with the Bullarook Creek; thence by a line east and the range separating the Bullarook and Joyce's creeks to the source of the Bullarook Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the Bullarook Range to the source of the Djerriwarh Creek near Mount Bullarook; thence by the Djerriwarh Creek to a point due west of the southern boundary of the village of Penridge; thence east to the Darebin Creek; and thence by that Creek to the River Yarra, the commencing point aforesaid.

GIPPSLAND MINING DISTRICT—Commencing at the mouth of the Mordialloc Creek on the eastern shores of Port Phillip Bay; thence easterly by the Mordialloc Creek, the northern margin of Carrum Swamp, and the Dandenong Creek to the main road from Melbourne to Gippsland; thence north-westerly by that road to the western boundary of the village of Oakleigh; thence north to the Kooyong Koot Creek; thence by that creek to its junction with the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra to its junction with the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to its most western source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range forming the basin of the River Yarra to the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Main Dividing Range in a general direction north-easterly to Mount Smyth; thence northerly by the Great Bogong Range to Mount Nelson; thence easterly by the Great Bogong Range to Mount Wills; thence northerly by the range dividing the head-waters of the Wombat Creek and Snowy Creek to Mount Cooper; thence by a line north-easterly crossing the Mitta-mitta River to Mount Gibbo; thence by the Gibbo Range north-easterly about fifteen miles to the peak forming its north-east termination; thence by a line south-easterly to Forest Hill, at the sources of the River Murray; thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe; thence by the sea-coast in a general direction south-westerly and north-westerly to Point Nepean; and thence by the eastern shores of Port Phillip Bay to the mouth of the Mordialloc Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to divide any such district into any number of divisions, and to give to such district and each of such divisions some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries of and also again to abolish any such district and divisions, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries, and from time to time to determine the number of members of the mining board of each district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and until the Governor in Council shall otherwise order the several mining districts and divisions created under the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. xxxii, and which shall be in existence at the time of the commencement of the now reciting Act, shall be and shall be deemed to be mining districts and divisions under the said Act, provided always that no more than seven such districts shall be erected under the said Act, unless addresses praying for a greater number shall be presented to the Governor by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date herewith the limits and boundaries of the mining districts of Castlemaine and Gippsland have been altered, and it is expedient to divide the said districts into the divisions hereinafter described: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish the existing divisions of the mining districts of Castlemaine and Gippsland, and doth divide the said mining districts into the divisions hereinafter named and described, that is to say:—

THE DIVISIONS OF THE CASTLEMAINE MINING DISTRICT.

BOURKE DIVISION—Commencing at the junction of the Darebin Creek with the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra to its junction with the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to its most western source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the Bullancrook Range; thence by that range to the source of the Djerriwarrh Creek, near Mount Bullancrook; thence by the Djerriwarrh Creek to a point due west of the southern boundary of the village of Penridge; thence east to the Darebin Creek; and thence by that creek to the River Yarra, the commencing point aforesaid.

CASTLEMAINE DIVISION—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of the parish of Harcourt; thence west to the Muckleford Creek; thence by the Muckleford Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to Campbell's Creek; thence by a line north-easterly to a hill known as the Monk; thence by a line east and the main road to Elphinstone to the junction of the Melbourne, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst roads, in the township of Elphinstone; thence by a line north-easterly to the junction of the Myrtle Creek and the River Coliban; and thence by the Myrtle Creek and the Mount Alexander Range to the commencing point aforesaid.

FRYER'S CREEK DIVISION—Commencing at the junction of the Jim Crow Creek and the River Loddon; thence southerly by the Jim Crow Creek to its junction with the Greenhill Creek; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of the River Loddon and a creek unnamed, near Holcombe; thence by the River Loddon to the south-western corner of allotment 19, section 3, parish of Glenlyon; thence by a line east to the summit of the range dividing the waters of the rivers Loddon and Coliban; thence northerly by that range to its intersection by the main Castlemaine road; thence by that road and a line west to the hill known as the Monk; thence by a line south-westerly to the junction of Campbell's Creek and the River Loddon; and thence westerly by the River Loddon to its junction with the Jim Crow Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.

TARADALE DIVISION—Commencing at the junction of the rivers Coliban and Campaspe; thence by the River Coliban to its junction with the Myrtle Creek; thence by a line south-westerly to the junction of the Melbourne, Castlemaine, and Sandhurst roads, in the township of Elphinstone; thence by the Castlemaine road westerly to the summit of the range dividing the waters of the rivers Loddon and Coliban; thence by that range southerly to a point due east of the southern boundary of allotment 19, section 3, parish of Glenlyon; thence by a line west to the south-western corner of allotment 19, section 3, parish of Glenlyon; thence by the River Loddon southerly to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range north-easterly to the most western source of Mollison's Creek; thence north-easterly by the Dividing Range at the sources of Mollison's Creek to the source of the Molvor or Patterson's Creek; and thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of the rivers Coliban and Campaspe, the commencing point aforesaid.

TARRANGOWEE DIVISION—Commencing at the junction of the Tullaroop or Deep Creek and the River Loddon; thence by a line easterly to a point four miles west of the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence east four miles to the south-western angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence by a

line bearing south five miles; thence by a line bearing east to the Muckleford Creek; thence by the Muckleford Creek to the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon and the Jim Crow Creek to the Greenhill Creek; thence by a line north-westerly to the south-eastern angle of the parish of Carisbrook; and thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that parish and by the Tullaroop or Deep Creek to the commencing point aforesaid.

HEPBURN DIVISION—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the parish of Carisbrook; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of the Greenhill and Jim Crow creeks; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of the River Loddon and a creek unnamed, near Holcombe; thence by the River Loddon to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the range separating the waters of the Bullarook Creek and Joyce's Creek, and a line west to the junction of the Tullaroop and Bullarook creeks; and thence by the Tullaroop or Deep Creek to the south-eastern angle of the parish of Carisbrook, the commencing point aforesaid.

THE DIVISIONS OF THE GIPPSLAND MINING DISTRICT.

ST. ANDREW'S DIVISION—Commencing at the mouth of the Mordialloc Creek on the eastern shores of Port Phillip Bay; thence easterly by the Mordialloc Creek, the northern margin of Carrum Swamp, and the Dandenong Creek to the main road from Melbourne to Gippsland; thence north-westerly by that road to the western boundary of the village of Oakleigh; thence north to the Kooyong Koot Creek; thence by that creek to its junction with the River Yarra; thence by the River Yarra to its junction with the River Plenty; thence by the River Plenty to its most western source in the Great Dividing Range; thence easterly by the Great Dividing Range forming the basin of the River Yarra to the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Main Dividing Range in a general direction southerly to a point on the Melbourne and Gippsland road, twenty miles east of the township of Buneep; thence by that road westerly to the township of Buneep; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to Cape Patterson; thence in a general direction north-westerly by the sea-coast to Point Nepean; and thence by the eastern shores of Port Phillip Bay to the mouth of the Mordialloc Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.

STRINGER'S CREEK DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the township of Seacombe; thence by a line northerly to the outlet of Lake Wellington; thence by the eastern and northern shores of Lake Wellington to the River Avon; thence by the River Avon to the township of Stratford; thence by a line westerly to the township of Seaton; thence northerly by the range dividing the waters of the Macalister River and the River Thomson to a point due east of the head of Stringer's Creek; thence by a line westerly to the junction of Doanally's Creek and the Aberfeldy River; thence northerly to a point on the Aberfeldy River due west of Mount Useful; thence by a line due west to the Main Dividing Range; thence southerly by the Main Dividing Range to the peak of the Baw-baw Mountains; thence by a line south-easterly to the township of Toongabbie; thence by a line southerly to the junction of the River La Trobe with Traralgon Creek; thence by a line south-easterly to the nearest source of Merriman's Creek; thence by Merriman's Creek to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast north-easterly to a point due south of the township of Seacombe, the commencing point aforesaid.

RUSSELL'S CREEK DIVISION—Commencing on the sea-coast at Merriman's Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of Traralgon Creek with the River La Trobe; thence by a line northerly to the township of Toongabbie; thence by a line north-westerly to the peak of the Baw-baw Mountains; thence by the Main Dividing Range to a point on the Melbourne and Gippsland road, twenty miles east of the township of Buneep; thence by that road westerly to the township of Buneep; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to Cape Patterson; and thence by the sea-coast to Merriman's Creek, the commencing point aforesaid.

OMEO DIVISION—Commencing at Cape Howe, on the sea-coast; thence by the sea-coast in a general direction south-westerly to the mouth of the Snowy River; thence by the Snowy River northerly to its junction with the Murindale Creek; thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of the Little River and the Tambo River; thence by a line westerly to Mount Baldhead; thence by a line northerly to the sources of the Mitta-mitta River on the Main Dividing Range south of Mount Parslow; thence by the Main Dividing Range north-westerly to Mount Snyth; thence northerly by the Great Bogong Range to Mount Nelson; thence easterly by the Great Bogong Range to Mount Wills; thence northerly by the range dividing the head-waters of the Wombat Creek and Snowy Creek to Mount Cooper; thence by a line north-easterly crossing the Mitta-mitta River to Mount Gibbo; thence by the Gibbo Range north-easterly about fifteen miles to the peak forming its north-east termination; thence by a line south-easterly to Forest Hill at the sources of the River Murray; and thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe, the commencing point aforesaid.

MITCHELL RIVER DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the township of Seacombe; thence by a line northerly to the outlet of Lake Wellington; thence by the eastern and northern shores of Lake Wellington to the River Avon; thence by that river westerly five miles; thence by a line and the range dividing the waters of the rivers Avon and Perry northerly to a point on the range dividing the waters of the Valencia Creek and the River Perry east of Mount Useful; thence by a line north-easterly to the junction of the Mitchell and Wentworth rivers; thence by a line due east to the range

dividing the waters of the Wentworth River and Prospect Creek; thence northerly by that range passing over Notch Hill to Mount Baldhead; thence by a line easterly to the junction of the Little River and the Tambo River; thence by a line south-easterly to the junction of Murindale Creek and the Snowy River; thence southerly by that river to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast south-westerly to a point due south of the township of Seacombe, the commencing point aforesaid.

CROOKED RIVER DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the range dividing the waters of the Valencia Creek and the River Perry, east of Mount Useful; thence north-westerly by that range to Mount Wellington; thence by the range dividing the waters of the Wannangatta and Macalister rivers in a north-westerly direction passing over Mount Tamboritha to the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Main Dividing Range in a general direction north-easterly to the sources of the Mittamitta River, south of Mount Parslow; thence by a line southerly to Mount Baldhead; thence southerly by the range dividing the waters of the Wentworth River, Nicholson River, and Prospect Creek, passing over Notch Hill to a point due east of the junction of the Wentworth and Mitchell rivers; thence by a line due west to the junction of the Wentworth and Mitchell rivers; and thence by a line south-westerly to a point on the range dividing the waters of the Valencia Creek and the River Perry, the commencing point aforesaid.

JERICHO DIVISION—Commencing at the point on the range dividing the waters of the Valencia Creek and the River Perry, east of Mount Useful; thence by a line due west to the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Main Dividing Range north-easterly to the range dividing the waters of Wannangatta and Macalister rivers; thence south-easterly by the last-named range passing over Mount Tamboritha to Mount Wellington, and thence south-easterly by the range dividing the waters of the River Perry and the Valencia Creek to a point east of Mount Useful, the commencing point aforesaid.

DONNELLY'S CREEK DIVISION—Commencing at a point on the west bank of the Aberfeldy River, due west of Mount Useful; thence by a line due east to a point on the range dividing the waters of the Valencia Creek and River Perry; thence southerly by the range dividing the waters of the rivers Avon and Perry and a line to a point on the River Avon five miles from its junction with Lake Wellington; thence by the River Avon to the township of Stratford; thence northerly by the range dividing the waters of the Macalister River and the Thomson River to a point due east of the head of Stringer's Creek; thence by a line westerly to the junction of Donnelly's Creek and the Aberfeldy River; and thence northerly by the Aberfeldy River to the commencing point aforesaid.

And the Honorable James Forrester-Sullivan, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF 1870.

N.B.—The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

1. On Tuesday, 5th April, 1870, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal [for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces,] for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.*—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st of February, 1870, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W.†:—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st March, 1870, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;‡

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;§

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:§—

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.¶

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they are in other respects duly qualified; and shall be permitted to choose,¶ according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal, the division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed.

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visà voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "final examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India before he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

12. The selected candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in regulation 9, shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for the Civil Service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character. The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.

13. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W.

NOTE.—(1) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorized the Civil Service Commissioners to state that it is his intention to allow the sum of £50 after each of the three first half years of probation, and £150 after the last half year, to each selected candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

(2) All selected candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office, for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. For a candidate under age a surety will be required.

(3) After passing the final examination each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants and giving a bond for £1000, jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on these documents amount to £3 10s.

(4) Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1872, will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

* Full instructions as to the course of study to be pursued will be issued to the successful candidates as soon as possible after the result of the open competition is declared.
