WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons herein-after mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above recited Act, that is to say:—

BURKE AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The two portions of land, the respective boundaries of which are hereinafter described, shall be and constitute a temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Burke, viz.: commencing at the north-east angle of suburban allotment 23, in the parish of Purdeet East, being a point on the western side of the road from Woolsthorpe to Peshurst; thence by that road and surveyed allotments in the town of Purdeet bearing north-westerly to the north-west angle of section 10 in the said town; thence by a road bearing west ninety-eight chains eighty-nine links; thence by a road bearing south fifty-nine chains sixty-five links to the north boundary of suburban allotment 39; thence by suburban allotments bearing east one hundred and ten chains thirty-three links to the point of commencement.—Area 614 acres, more or less.

Commencing at the north angle of suburban allotment 8, in the parish of Purdeet East, being a point on the right bank of Muston's Creek; bounded thence by that allotment bearing S. 32° W. fourteen chains ten links; thence by the road from Woolsthorpe to Peshurst and surveyed allotments in the town of Purdeet bearing northerly to the north-east angle of section 9 in the said town; thence by a road bearing east thirty-four chains eighty-three links to the north-west angle of suburban allotment 1; thence by that allotment bearing south thirteen chains fifty links to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement.—Area 192 acres, more or less.

Total area 796 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(69.S.14608.)

EVANSFORD AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The farmers' common for the use of selectors in the agricultural area of Evansford, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of August, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land within the boundaries hereinafter described, being allotment 99b and parts of allotments 96a and 96b, in the parish of Caralulup, and comprising an area of three hundred and twenty acres, more or less: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 99a; bounded thence by that allotment bearing north seventy-eight chains eleven links; thence by the Lillicur and Yalong Farmers' Common bearing N. 89° 10' E. forty chains, more or less, to the west boundary of the Amherst and Black Creek United Town and Goldfield Common; thence by that common and a line bearing south seventy-nine chains, more or less; and thence by a road bearing west forty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement.—(69.T.14287.)

EVERSLEY AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The Eversley Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of December, 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotments 12 and 13, in the parish of Eversley, comprising an area of 661 acres, more or less.—(69.T.16513.)

NEKEEYA AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, together with the reserve adjoining allotment 46, in the parish of Nekeeya, on the south-west, shall be and constitute a temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Nekeeya, viz.: Parish of Moyston, allotments A, C, and W; parish of Nekeeya, allotments 47, 48, 49, 61, 65, 67, 70, 71, and 72.—Area about 2378 acres.—(69.U.4395.)

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.37 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, together with the mean temperature in the shade and the mean atmospheric pressure, during the month of July for the last ten years, were as follow:—

The mortality of July was above the average of that month during ten years, but not more so than might be expected from the increased population. The July of the first year of the decennial (1860) was that in which the greatest mortality prevailed, and the July of 1862 was that of the least mortality. In the former, the deaths exceeded those of the month under review by 44, and in the latter they were fewer by 68 than they were in that month.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 64°6' on the 13th, and the lowest was 27° on the 21st. The mean temperature of the month (47°1') was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28°2') took place on the 27th, viz.:—from a maximum of 60°6' to a minimum of 32°4'. The least range (6°5') was on the 11th, viz.:—from a maximum of 55°3' to a minimum of 48°8'.

Fifty-nine per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 41 per cent. were of females. Thirty-seven per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 44 per cent. in July, 1868; 44 per cent. in July, 1867; 40 per cent. in July, 1866; 44 per cent. in July, 1865; 44 per cent. in July, 1864; 45 per cent. in July, 1863; 46 per cent. in July, 1862; 50 per cent. in July, 1861; and 48 per cent. in July, 1860.

Four males and five females died at 75 years of age, or upwards, during the month. Of the former, 1, aged 77, died of old age; 1, aged 78, died of a fractured limb; 1, aged 82, died of old age; and 1, aged 86, died of an ulcerated leg. Of the females, 1, aged 75, died of dropsy, and 4, aged respectively 76, 78, 80, and 98 years, died of old age.

Sixteen violent deaths occurred during the month, all of which were set down to accident. Of these, a boy, aged 9, was killed through being pulled in by machinery; a turner, aged 24, was killed by a log of cedar falling upon him; a man, described as an opossum hunter, aged 58, died of inflammation of the brain, resulting from a fall; a gentleman, aged 78, died of a fractured limb; 3 children, aged respectively 1, 1½, and 2 years, died of scalds; a child, aged 1½, died of accidental poisoning; a storeman, aged 51, died of dropsy supervening upon lead-poisoning; a wharf laborer, aged 40, was drowned in the Yarra; a seaman, aged 40, was drowned in Hobson's Bay from the Williamstown breakwater; a compositor, aged 50, was drowned in a gutter in Stephen street; an infant died of strangulation by the navel string on the day of its birth; an infant, aged 17 weeks, was suffocated in bed; a publican, aged 41, died of asphyxia caused by the inhalation of coal-gas.

Sixty-three deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—35 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Yarra Bend Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Asylum, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years numbered 102, of which 62, or nearly 61 per cent., were of males, and 40, or about 39 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 66 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 173, of which 100, or nearly 58 per cent., were males, and 73, or about 42 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 11 were between thirty-five and forty, 13 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 5 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were eighty and upwards.

The number of deaths from zymotic diseases was more than doubled by that from local diseases, and was nearly equalled by that from constitutional diseases. Under the latter head phthisis caused 37 deaths against 45 in June, and 39 in May.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN RESERVED LANDS AT DAYLESFORD.

THE Governor in Council has authorized the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations within the limits of the land temporarily reserved for public recreation at Daylesford, by an Order in Council dated 26th January, 1863, subject to the conditions following:—

1. The surface of the land shall not be broken, nor shall it be occupied for the purpose of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.
2. The extent of claims allowed shall be such as is prescribed by the bye-laws of the District Mining Board for the class of mining operations required.
3. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to injure the surface of the reserve or otherwise interfere with the purposes for which the reserve was made.
4. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorized officer.
5. The warden or other authorized officer shall have power at any time to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the limits of the said reserve which may appear to him likely to injure the surface of the land.
6. In case any person so mining shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him any longer to mine within the limits of the lands herein referred to.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF MINING OFFICERS IN THE MINING DISTRICT OF GIPPSLAND.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of August, 1869.

WHEREAS by *The Mining Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to appoint such and so many officers and clerks, and assistants to such officers, and for such mining districts and divisions and places, as to such Governor in Council shall seem right, for the making of inspection and surveys and registration of claims and mines, and for performing such other duties in connection with mining as the Governor in Council shall think fit; and that the Governor in Council shall have authority by any general regulations or otherwise, and in any individual case, if it shall be so thought right, to prescribe the powers and duties of such officers, clerks, and assistants, and also of any substitute who shall under the powers thereby given be appointed in the place of any officer, clerk, or assistant who shall be suspended or removed or incapacitated by illness or absence, and the mode of exercising and performing such powers and duties, and the amount of remuneration of such officers, clerks, and assistants, and of any such substitute, and the mode of raising and paying such remuneration, and the time for which the same shall be paid, and whether the same shall be paid partly or in the whole out of the fees to be payable in respect of the services and duties to be by them respectively rendered and performed, and what fees shall be so payable: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following regulations in regard to the powers and duties of mining registrars, the district mining registrar, and their clerks and assistants or substitutes, and the amount of remuneration of such officers and their clerks and assistants or substitutes, and the mode of raising and paying such remuneration, in the Mining District of Gippsland, that is to say:—

DUTIES OF MINING OFFICERS.

The officers who shall from time to time be by the Governor in Council appointed by the title of District Mining Registrar and Mining Registrars for the making registration of mining tenements within the Mining District of Gippsland, or within any division thereof, shall, within the district or division for which they shall respectively be so appointed, perform and discharge by themselves, or by any assistant or substitute appointed by the Governor in Council, the several duties as prescribed herein and pertaining to their respective offices, within the division or district for which such officer shall be appointed; and any act, matter, or thing done by any assistant or substitute appointed as aforesaid shall be as valid and effectual as if done by the mining registrar. No mining registrar shall make registration of any claim or other mining tenement if every part of such claim or other mining tenement shall be without the boundaries of the division to which he shall have been appointed; but when any claim or other mining tenement shall embrace a portion of, or lie partly within, any two or more divisions, it shall (except as provided in any bye-law which may now or hereafter be in force) be lawful for the mining registrar of any one of the divisions in which a portion of such claim or other mining tenement shall lie to make registration thereof; and any registration made by such registrar shall be as valid and effectual as though the whole of such claim or other mining tenement lay within the division to which such registrar had been appointed, or as though the registration were made by each and every of the registrars of the several divisions in which such claim or other mining tenement shall be situated. It shall be the duty of the registrar who shall make such registration to give notice thereof forthwith to each and every of the registrars of the divisions in which such claim or other mining tenement or any portion thereof shall be situated, but the omission to give such notice shall not invalidate the registration.

MINING REGISTRARS' OFFICES.

Within the Mining District of Gippsland a proper office shall be provided for the safe custody of records relating to the titles to mining tenements throughout the said district, and such office shall be styled the District Mining Registrar's Office, and shall be under the charge and control of the district mining registrar; and within each of the divisions of said district a proper office or offices shall be provided for the safe custody of the records relating to titles to mining tenements within each such division, and shall be under the charge and control of the mining registrar appointed to such division.

OFFICE HOURS.

The several mining offices within the said district shall be kept open to the public from Ten o'clock a.m. till Three o'clock p.m. each day (Sundays and public holidays excepted), and the mining registrar or his assistant shall be in attendance at the office under his charge during the hours so appointed.

DUTIES OF DISTRICT MINING REGISTRAR.

The district mining registrar shall compile from the returns to be forwarded to him, as hereinafter directed, a complete record of the titles to all mining tenements and interests therein throughout this district, and may, for the purposes of such compilation, at any time inspect any books and documents in the custody of the mining registrars of the several divisions, and make extracts and copies therefrom, and may for the purposes aforesaid require such registrars, or any of them, at any time to render him such information and assistance as shall be necessary

in that behalf; and the district registrar shall during office hours permit any person to inspect the records in his custody, and if required so to do the district registrar shall supply to any person demanding the same a copy or copies under his hand of any records in his office, on payment being made to him for such inspection or copies of the fees set forth in the schedule hereto numbered One. The district mining registrar shall be responsible for the correct compilation and safe custody of the records in his office of titles to mining tenements within and throughout this district, and in the event of the registration of any mining tenement in the office of the mining registrar of any division being lost or destroyed, the district registrar shall forthwith supply to the registrar of such division a copy under his hand of the record in the district office of the registration so lost or destroyed.

DUTIES OF MINING REGISTRARS.

Each mining registrar or his assistant shall attend at his office daily during office hours. It shall be the duty of the mining registrar to receive applications for mining tenements; to enter in a proper book, to be by him kept for the purpose, a notice of such application, under the date and hour of the day on which such application shall be made; to give the applicant or applicants a certificate in such form as shall be prescribed by any bye-law which may now or hereafter be in force; to make registration in a proper book or books, to be by him kept for the purpose, of all mining tenements; to make transfers of all mining tenements or interests therein; to register liens upon mining tenements and interests therein; to make transfers of such liens; to keep a record of claims and water-rights held in reserve; to furnish, when required, copies under his hand of any document or of any entry in any book in his custody; and within the first seven days of each month to forward to the office of the district mining registrar a complete return under his hand of all registrations, transfers, liens, and reserves by him effected and made, and of all acts by him done during the preceding month affecting the title to mining tenements or interests therein within the division under his charge; and the mining registrar of each division shall be responsible for the correctness of the register of the mining tenements and interests therein within the divisions under his charge, and for the correctness of the returns to be made as aforesaid.

SAFE CUSTODY AND DISPOSAL OF REGISTRATION BOOKS.

All registration books, plans, and other documents relating to mining which shall be or come into the possession of a registrar by virtue of his office, shall be at the disposal of the Honorable the Minister of Mines, and the registrar shall be responsible for the safe custody of all such books and documents until he shall have delivered up the same to such officer as shall be appointed by the Honorable the Minister of Mines to receive the same; and all such books and documents shall during office hours be open to inspection by the public.

FEES, AND PAYMENT OF SAME.

The fees which shall and may be demanded and received by the mining registrars and district mining registrar for or in respect of duties performed by them, shall be such and such only as are prescribed in the schedule hereto numbered One. Each registrar shall enter in a proper book, to be by him kept for the purpose, an account of all fees received by him, and shall apply or dispose of the fees so received by him in such manner as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct. The fees hereby authorized shall be paid before or at the time of performing the duty in respect of which they shall be payable, and the registrar to whom such fees shall be payable shall be responsible for the collection of such fees.

The said district mining registrar, mining registrars, clerks, assistants, and substitutes shall, in the performance of the duties hereinbefore prescribed, act in conformity with the bye-laws of the mining board for the time being in force in the said district, so far as such bye-laws apply to the matter or thing in reference to which such duties have to be performed respectively.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions: (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-ninth day of February 1864, the Shire of Ararat was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Shire of Ararat into three separate electoral subdivisions, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 58, parish of Shirley; thence north-westerly by a one-chain road to the western boundary of the said parish; thence north-westerly by a one-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 47 A, parish of Woodnagerak; thence south by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence west by a one-chain road to the north-west angle of Chialicum pre-emptive section; thence north-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 15 A, parish of Ballyrogan; thence west by a one-chain road through the parishes of Ballyrogan, Langhi-logan, Merrymbuella, Kalymna, and Nekeeya to the north-west angle of allotment 35, parish of Nekeeya; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotments 29 and 31 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence west by a line to the south-east angle of allotment 33; thence west by a one-chain road to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon at the south-west angle of allotment 80, parish of Nekeeya; thence by a line due west to the western boundary of the shire; thence by the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of the shire to the commencing point.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

BYE-LAW No 15.—FOR REGULATING, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF CLUNES.

A meeting of the Borough Council of Clunes, held at the Council Chambers of the said borough, on the twenty-eight day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and of which meetings special notice was duly given, it was by virtue of, and under the powers contained in, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Municipal Institutions*, made and passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 184, specially ordered by the said council as follows:—

GENERAL CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

I.—Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.

II.—Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

III.—Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

IV.—Presentation of reports of committees.

V.—Payments.

VI.—Ordinary business.

VII.—Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

VIII.—Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.

IX.—Other motions, of which previous notice has been given.

X.—Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the mayor and the town clerk, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

MOTIONS.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the town clerk at the close of the meeting of the council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and the town clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the preceding clause.

8. No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under the most urgent circumstance, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the town clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

ORDER, ETC., OF DEBATE.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereof, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council, unless it be seconded; but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, chairman, or councillor, as the case may be.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the mayor or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The mayor or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The mayor or chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the mayor or chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw or to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the mayor or chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

28. The mayor or chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

30. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

31. If an amendment be carried, the question or amendment, as amended, shall become itself the question or amendment, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question or amendment coming after such first-mentioned amendment may be moved.

32. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

33. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

34. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

35. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

LAPSED QUESTIONS.

36. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

37. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

COMMITTEES.

38. Minutes of all proceedings of committee, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council, and the town clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

39. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

PETITIONS.

40. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

41. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to

ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

42. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

43. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

44. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

46. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

APPOINTMENT, ETC., OF OFFICERS.

47. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

48. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

49. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the borough, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

MISCELLANEOUS.

50. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

51. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the borough from time to time, on the written order of the town clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purpose of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

52. The common seal of the borough shall be kept in a box having two keys, one of which keys the mayor shall keep in his possession and the other key shall be kept by the town clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document affecting the corporation unless the mayor and one other member of the council, or in the absence of the mayor, unless two councillors be present.

53. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by an unanimous vote of the council.
