W HEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to The Shirke of North Covers.

a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes

and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than

forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual

value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that

such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also

enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon

being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are

true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof,

to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall

in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new

road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used

in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district is And

whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the

area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable

property in such area, has been pre-ented to the Governor,

setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act,

and due notice of such petition has been published as provided

by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof an

Order in Council, hearing even date herewith, has been made,

to constitute the said area a new road district. Now therefore

I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive

Council, do hereby constitute and proc

mentioned, that is to say:—
THE HOWQUA ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the Bald
Hill, north-west of Wood's Point; thence north 35° to the
Dividing Range; thence north-eastwardly along the Dividing
Range to a point east of the source of the Howqua River;
thence west to the river and by the river to its junction with
the Goulburn alvier; thence south to the watershed between
the Goulburn and Big rivers; thence by the said watershed to
the commencing point.

At the annual meeting on the second Thursday in January all honorary officers, as president, vice-president, treasurer, and medical officers, shall be chosen, auditors shall be appointed; all matters pertaining to the institution shall be open to discussion, and resolutions may be passed on any such matters; and any business brought before it which may, consistently with the Act of Incorporation and the Bye-laws, be transacted at it, may be absolutely decided upon.
