WHEREAS by *The County Courts Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden; and it is also enacted that the judge of each county court shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council shall in each case direct: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, it was amongst other things directed that a county court should be holden at Ararat once at least in every two calendar months: And whereas it is expedient to alter the interval for holding the said court: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the County Court for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act established at the town aforesaid shall be holden within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At ARARAT, once at least in every three calendar months.

And the Honorable James Joseph Casey, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF NORTH OVENS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X. of Part I. of the said Statute to

THE HOWQUA ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the Bald Hill, north-west of Wood's Point; thence north 35° to the Dividing Range; thence north-eastwardly along the Dividing Range to a point east of the source of the Howqua River; thence west to the river and by the river to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence south to the watershed between the Goulburn and Big rivers; thence by the said watershed to the commencing point.

been unable to obtain a due remuneration for his or their  
expense and labor in perfecting such invention, and that  
an exclusive right of using and vending the same for some  
further period to be named in such petition, in addition to  
the said term, is necessary for his or their reimbursement  
and remuneration, it shall be lawful for the Governor in  
Council to refer the consideration of the said petition to  
Commissioners to be appointed for that purpose in the  
manner hereinafter mentioned:

26. For the purpose of considering any such petition as  
aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council (if  
he shall think fit) to issue and direct in the name of Her  
Majesty, her heirs or successors, to five or more persons  
(of whom some of the Judges of the Supreme Court shall  
be two) a Commission, reciting such petition and requiring  
and authorizing such persons, or any three of them, of  
whom one of the said Judges shall be one, to meet at some  
time (not being less than two months from the publication  
of the said Commission in the *Government Gazette*), and

our said colony, and the Officer then administering the Government  
of our said colony of Victoria, and sealed with the seal of  
the said colony, it was made known that the said Edward  
Macarthur, as such Officer so administering the said Government  
as aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him  
by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council  
of our said colony in that behalf made and provided, did give  
and grant unto James Harrison, of Geelong, in our said colony,

privilege and especial license, full power and authority, that he  
the said James Harrison, his executors, administrators, and  
assigns, and every of them by himself and themselves, or by his  
or their deputy and deputies, servants, or agents, or such others  
as he the said James Harrison, his executors, administrators, or  
assigns should at any time agree with, and no others, from time  
to time and at all times thereafter, during the term of years  
therein expressed, should and lawfully might make, use, exercise,  
and vend an invention for "A Process and Apparatus for  
refrigerating by the evaporation of volatile liquids in vacuo, their  
condensation by pressure, and the continued re-evaporation and  
re-condensation of the same materials," within the said Colony  
of Victoria in such manner as to him the said James Harrison,  
his executors, administrators, and assigns, or any of them,  
should in his or their discretion seem meet; and that he the  
said James Harrison, his executors, administrators, and assigns,  
should and might lawfully have and enjoy the whole profit,  
benefit, commodity, and advantage from time to time growing,  
accruing, and arising by reason of the said invention, for and  
during the term of years therein mentioned: To have, hold,  
exercise and enjoy the said licenses, powers, privileges and advantages

and immediately ensuing, according to the Act of Council in  
such case made and provided: subject, however, to the provisos  
and conditions in such letters patent or instrument in the  
nature of letters patent contained: And whereas on or about  
the sixteenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and  
sixty-nine, Frederick Goneram Dalgety, of London, in that  
part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called  
England, and Charles Ibbotson, of Geelong, in our said colony,

porters of ice from America, who were then in possession of  
the market: That this competition was continued, but with-  
out profit, till the end of 1861, when just as he had succeeded  
in establishing the superior economy of the local manufacture  
he was forced to seek the protection of the Insolvent Court:

"That in 1862 your petitioners purchased the said James  
Harrison's interest in his patent in England as well as in  
Victoria, but immediately afterwards ascertained that the  
invention was being infringed upon in London; whereupon  
your petitioners were led into litigation in Chancery to test  
the validity of the patents, and although the result was favor-  
able to your petitioners, it was not till 1863 that the decision  
was given, too late to enable your petitioners to derive any  
benefit from the patent:

"That from these adverse circumstances the inventor and  
your petitioners have been unable to obtain a due remunera-  
tion for the expense and labor in perfecting such invention:

"That the said James Harrison concurs in and supports  
this application; and that your petitioners, in the event of  
this application being granted, will undertake to continue to  
all parties who have heretofore acquired rights to use and  
vend the invention, the same rights during the currency of  
the extension:

"Wherefore your petitioners pray that Your Excellency  
in Council will take the premises into your favorable con-  
sideration, and will grant an extension of the term for the  
exclusive right of using and vending the said invention for  
an additional period of fourteen years:

#### CONVEYANCE OF MAILS, 1870.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Tuesday the 12th October, 1869, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for one year, from the 1st January, 1870, to 31st December, 1870.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.

The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

**HAMILTON HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.**

THE following alterations in Bye-laws, gazetted 10th March, 1868, were resolved upon at a General Meeting of the Contributors held on the eleventh day of June, 1869, Alexander Learmonth, Esq., President, in the chair.

2. (Contributors).—In first and fifth lines, for £25 read £20.

3. No person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting unless he shall have been a contributor for the space of at least one month previous to such meeting; provided always that a contributor for the preceding year shall be entitled to vote at any meeting held prior to 31st March, and at any subsequent meeting by payment of his contribution for the then current year at any time before such meeting.

4. At the annual meeting on the second Thursday in January all honorary officers, as president, vice-president, treasurer, and medical officers, shall be chosen, auditors shall be appointed; all matters pertaining to the institution shall be open to discussion, and resolutions may be passed on any such matters; and any business brought before it which may, consistently with the Act of Incorporation and the Bye-laws, be transacted at it, may be absolutely decided upon.

5. It shall be competent for the general committee by vote, or any twelve or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a general meeting of contributors at any time between the annual meetings; the occasion of calling every such meeting shall be specified in the requisition, and no other business shall be transacted thereat; and every such meeting shall, with an intelligible reference to its object, be called by the secretary, by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, at least one week before the day of meeting.

7. (Foting).—In third line, for "one-third" read "two."

8. The institution shall be governed by a general committee, consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, twelve town and twelve country members (four to form a quorum), to be elected according to the provisions of the Act of Incorporation; but no person being a paid servant of the institution, nor any person who shall be interested in any contract entered into for the institution, shall be a member of such committee.

9. The president, vice-president, treasurer, and one-third of the elected members of committee, shall go out of office (but may be re-elected) on the second Thursday in January of every year. The seat of any member of committee shall become vacant as provided by the twelfth section of the Act of Incorporation—"If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings of committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution, until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office."

11. The secretary shall keep a list for each year of the attendance and non-attendance, at ordinary meetings, of the various members of the general committee, and a similar but distinct list in relation to special meetings; and in the event of any member of the general committee, or any honorary officer, becoming disqualified, it shall be necessary, before proceeding to fill up the vacancy, that one month's notice of motion to that effect be given by some member of the general committee.

12. The general committee shall direct the business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulation (the same not being repugnant to the bye-laws), alter, repeal, amend, and make new rules, enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the institution, direct payment to be made for the same, fill up vacancies in all honorary offices, and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet on the first Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint by way of adjournment. As soon as a quorum shall be present, the chair shall be taken by the president, failing his presence by the vice-president, or in the absence of both by a chairman appointed by the members present; but if no quorum shall be present within fifteen minutes of the time named, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorised, shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until the next monthly meeting; provided always that those members present shall have power to adjourn such meeting to an earlier date.

13. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law or to frame or vary a rule shall be entertained, and no motion to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed, unless one month's notice of the same shall be given.

14. All ordinary meetings of the general committee shall be notified to the town members thereof by circular by the secretary, three days at least before the day of meeting; but no member being absent for four consecutive meetings shall be at liberty to plead the lack of such notification against the cessation of his office.

15. (Special Meeting).—Fifth line, for "thereof" read "of the requisition," and for "seven" read "three clear."

16. The general committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at the annual meeting in January, which report shall be prepared by the treasurer, secretary, and medical officers, and be presented for revision and approval, at a special meeting to be held at least one clear day before the annual meeting.



20. *New Bye-law.*—The store committee shall consist of three, to be appointed annually. They shall meet half-yearly, in June and December, to examine all stores and property belonging to the institution, and have power to condemn such as may be unserviceable; they shall also meet in March and September, to receive tenders for the supply of stores for the institution, and report the same to the general committee.

21. *New Bye-law.*—The building committee shall consist of three members, to be appointed annually, and all proposed additions or repairs to the premises exceeding five pounds in estimated cost shall be referred to them for report; they shall also supervise the execution of such works when the same shall be ordered by the general committee.

22. (*Formerly 20.*)—The treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the institution, and invest the same to the credit of the institution in such bank as the general committee shall direct. He shall pay all accounts, after a schedule of the same shall have been signed by the president or chairman of the meeting as having been approved by the general committee, by drafts on the bank, countersigned by the secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and invested by him, and report the same, together with the balance at the bank, at each monthly meeting of the general committee.

24. (*Formerly 22.*)—The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a strong box with two locks and keys (one of which keys shall be kept by the treasurer and the other by the secretary). The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the general committee.

26. (*Formerly 24.*)—The contributors shall, at the annual general meeting in January in each year, appoint two auditors, not members of the committee, to examine the accounts of the past year; but, in case either or both, of such auditors neglect or refuse to perform the said audit for a space of one month from the time of his or their appointment, a special meeting of the contributors shall be called immediately to elect a new auditor or auditors, as the case may require; and it shall be competent for the president or, in his absence, the vice-president to convene, by advertisement, a general meeting at any time for the purpose of electing auditors, if any emergency arise.
