BASS STRAITS.

THE following information has been received from Navigating Lieutenant H. J. Stanley, R.N., Admiralty Surveyor, relative to sunken rocks in Bass and Banks Straits.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° 20' easterly in 1869.]

King Island.

A reef on which the sea breaks heavily has been discovered in Seal Bay, at the southern end of King Island, lying from a mile to a mile and a half east of Seal Rocks. The reef is apparently several cables in extent, with six fathoms on its north-west edge.

Sunken Dangers in Banks Strait.

[Variation 10° easterly in 1869.]

Heavy breakers have been reported on the following bearings: Mount William, S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.; Swan Island Lighthouse, W.N.W.; St. George's Rock S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.; and recently the ship *Salamander* struck and was severely damaged on a rock not far from the above neighborhood.

This rock was reported by the master of the *Salamander* to lie E. by S, distant twelve miles from Swan Island lighthouse. The Colonial Governments of Victoria and Tasmania are about to have the dangers in this locality examined.

INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAITS.*

[Variation 6° 20' easterly in 1869.]

The Postmaster of Brisbane, Queensland, Lieut. G. P. Heath, R.N., has forwarded the following information relative to sunken rocks in the channels within the Barrier Reefs, obtained from Captain Edwards of the merchant ship *Melanie*.

Pipon Islands, Melanie Rock.—The *Melanie* struck on a patch of rocks eastward of the Pipon Islands. From the rock the east end of the Pipon Islands bore S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. two miles and three quarters, and North Bay Point S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. As the tide was about half ebb when the ship touched, this patch cannot have more than three feet on it at low water.

Lloyd Bay, Edwards Rock.—The *Melanie* also touched in Lloyd Bay upon the north-west edge of a patch of rocks having about five feet on them at low water. The patch lies, with Restoration Island bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. two miles and a quarter, and the peak of the Red Hills, S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

Pinnacle Rock.—A small pinnacle rock just awash at low water was also observed in the southern part of Lloyd Bay. From it Cape Direction bore E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., and Lump Peak (hilly bluff of Directory), S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. two miles and three quarters; Lloyd Island being at the same time just open to the northward of Low Island. There are also two rocks just awash, eastward of the foregoing, bearing S.W. by S. three quarters of a mile from X reef, and S.E. from the small sandbank to the westward of it.

TORRES STRAIT.

[Variation 4° 50' easterly in 1869.]

Great North-east Channel.—Captain Edwards also reports the existence of a dangerous coral patch to the south-east side of the general fairway of this passage.

The least sounding obtained was two fathoms and a half, deepening gradually to five, and then suddenly to eleven fathoms; as it was about three-quarters flood at the time, the least depth of water on the patch cannot be estimated at more than nine feet.

While passing over the shoal, the sandbank which lies five miles to the southward of Poll Island bore W. by N. westerly, distant three miles, and Sue Islet N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

GULF OF CARPENTARIA.

THE following directions for the navigation of Endeavour Strait, the Gulf of Carpentaria, and Investigator Roads, by Captain Chas. Edwards, of the ship *Melanie*, have been forwarded by Commander G. P. Heath, R.N., the Port Master at Brisbane.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 4° 30' easterly in 1869.]

Directions.—Small vessels from the east coast of Australia, bound down the Gulf of Carpentaria, generally go through

Endeavour Strait, and pass to the southward of Woody Wallis Island into the gulf.

Of the several passages into Endeavour Strait, Captain Edwards is of opinion that the best is between Possession and Meddler islands, as there are no mid-channel dangers, the islands on either side being high, and the tides, although strong, setting straight through.

A vessel in mid-channel, between Possession and Meddler islands, should steer S.S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. three miles and a half, when she will be about a mile to the westward of Dayman Island; and thence seven miles on a S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. course will take her about three miles to the westward of Barn Island, with Red Island open to the southward of it. Be careful to pass to the eastward of the Heroine Rock, which may be ensured by keeping Meddler Island open to the eastward of Quoin Islet. When Red Island is open to the southward of Barn Island steer W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. for Woody Wallis Island, about fourteen miles distant, and when near it, steer so as to pass about half a mile to the south-west of the island, which will be a midway course between it and a rock awash at low water, on the one fathom bank to the southward. Then steer about W. by S., keeping on the Woody Wallis side of the channel for about three miles, until that island bears N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and Red Wallis N.N.E.; and thence S.W., crossing over sundry banks of four fathoms with eight fathoms between, hard sand, until the soft bottom of the gulf is reached; but until then keep a good look out for shoal water, heaving the lead constantly, as unknown knolls of sand may exist, the ground on the west side of Inskip Banks not having been surveyed.

Large ships should take the Prince of Wales channel, and round Booby Island.

In sailing down the gulf, the east coast should be kept on board at all times of the year, except when the north-west monsoon is blowing strongly. In the early part of the year, from March until the middle of September, the trade wind on the east side veers and hauls into land and sea breezes, whilst in the middle of the gulf the trades blow constantly, and with a considerable set to the north-west.

At this time of the year it is advisable to follow the east coast round until well to windward of Sweers Island, on which stands Caernarvon, the port of entry to the gulf, as just before the full and change of the moon, strong gales from the south-east blow, with a heavy chopping sea, and a vessel would be driven to leeward, unless under the shelter of the land.

After the middle of September, vessels bound down the gulf to Caernarvon, or back to the east coast, *via* Torres Straits, should still keep near the east coast of the gulf, say from twenty to forty miles, as they will find there a moderate or fresh breeze from the northward, inclining to the eastward and westward, as land and sea breezes, but mostly blowing from the westward, whilst in the middle of the gulf the wind will be light and south-easterly.

Investigator Road, which forms the port to the township of Caernarvon, is sheltered from prevailing winds to the eastward by Sweers Island, and to the westward and northward by Fowler and Bentinck islands, the reefs and shoal water off the latter extending across to Sweers Island. The road is spacious and easy of access, having a broad and clear passage to it, with four to five fathoms in every part.

Sweers Island is about five miles long by one broad, with rocks and foul ground extending off it to the eastward about a mile and a half. The south and south-west sides also have shoal water and rocky patches running off shore about three quarters of a mile. Over its south-east point stands Inspection Hill, 104 feet in height, and being the only hill in the neighborhood, forms a good landmark.

Locust Rock is a small rocky islet about a mile and a half S.E. by S. from Inspection Hill; it has a small reef (dry at low water) about one mile E.N.E. of it; both rock and reef are connected with Inspection Hill by foul ground. Locust rock has also a bank of small gravel, running off it to the S.E. about one mile; the least water on it being six feet. Cross bearings of this rock and the north-east point of Sweers Island form the best guide for keeping outside the rocks and foul ground in this vicinity.

Macedonald's Point, the south-west point of Sweers Island, has rocks and foul ground running off it about three quarters of a mile and extending along the south side of the island to Locust Rock; to keep outside the shoal water avoid bringing Locust Rock to the southward of E. by S., and Raft Point, the east point of Bentinck Island, to the westward of N. by W.

Caernarvon.—This township is situated on Inscription Point, which is of white sand, and forms the western point of Sweers Island. About a mile and a half to the northward are some red cliffs, forming a projecting point; the northern point of the island is rocky and wooded.

Raft Point is wooded, and easily distinguished. To vessels coming from the southward, it appears as the point of land projecting from the west side of Investigator Road.

Fowler Island.—A small island one mile and a quarter long, N.N.E. and S.S.W., with a clump of trees near the south point, lies S.W. by S. two miles from Raft Point. It is fronted towards Investigator Roads by rocks and shoal water, to clear which Raft Point should not be brought to the eastward of N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Anchorages.—Vessels trading to Caernarvon should anchor about three cables westward of Inscription Point in five fathoms mud. A favorite anchorage is with the red cliffs in sight over Inscription Point, about two cables from the shore.

Directions.—To gain the anchorage in Investigator Roads, all but very small vessels must enter by the southern passage. Vessels running in with a south-east wind should keep about three miles off the land until the centre of Sweers Island bears N., when an opening will be seen between Raft and Inscription

points; a N.N.W. course should then be steered for the north point of Fowler's Island, until the north point of Sweers Island is seen over Inscription Point; then steer for Inscription Point, and anchor about two cables off, with the red cliffs just in sight over it.

Should the wind be from the northward, and the vessel have to beat in, care must be taken not to approach Locust Rock from seaward, within a mile and a half.

The north-east point of Sweers Island bearing N. by W. will lead clear of the reef to E.N.E. of Locust Rock, and to avoid the covered bank running off it to S.S.E., keep the clump of trees on the south end of Fowler Island bearing N.W. by W.; but it will be difficult for a stranger to recognize the clump, as Bentinck and Fowler islands are low and in one; a surer guide is the lead, and if in rounding Locust Rock closely, less than ten fathoms water are obtained, keep to the southward until the rock is well open to the eastward of Sweers Island, when the bank will be passed.

The foul ground extending off the south side of Sweers Island will be cleared by keeping Locust Rock to the northward of E. by S. In working up the roads, stand towards Fowler Island until Raft Point bears N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., and towards Sweers Island until Raft Point bears N. by W., until so much to the northward has been gained as to shut in the S.E. point of Sweers Island with the next point to the westward; then in standing in to Sweers Island the north point must be kept in sight over Inscription Point.

When fairly in the channel between Sweers and Fowler islands, the lead will be of great assistance. Standing towards Fowler Island, tack when the water you have carried across shoals a fathom; in standing towards Sweers Island, tack when the water deepens half a fathom.

Winds. From the end of May to the middle of September the wind blows more or less strongly from south-east, freshening into a gale at times; after the middle of September the wind hangs mostly from the northward, blowing a fresh breeze from north-east in the morning, moderating and drawing round to north-west in the afternoon, falling light at night, and freshening again about 4 a.m. These winds last until about the latter part of December, when unsettled cloudy weather, with rains and north-west winds in the daytime, and heavier squalls from the mainland at night set in, and continue until about the end of February, between which and the end of May the winds blow mostly from E.N.E. This description of the wind applies to the head of the Gulf of Carpentaria, as far east as the Norman River.

Tides.—Flood tide sets to the southward and ebbs to the northward, from one to two knots at springs; the strength of the stream and length of time of setting depends on the strength of the prevailing winds, the tide going mostly with the wind.

BEACON ON SNAG IN ENTRANCE TO BULLER RIVER.

Marine Department,
Wellington, 25th October, 1869.

It is hereby notified, for the information of Ship-masters, that the Harbor-master at Westport has reported that he has succeeded in erecting a Beacon on the Snag at the entrance to the Buller River.

The Beacon stands 22 feet above the Snag, and about 11 feet above high-water spring tides, and is painted red. It is a single iron bar, stayed with chains and surmounted by a can, 2 feet high and 1 foot diameter.

Unless the Snag is swept away in a flood, the Beacon is only liable to be destroyed by drift-wood, or by small craft fouling it during the night; and ship-masters are hereby cautioned and requested to use every endeavor to keep clear of it. They are further warned not to trust too implicitly in its permanence, but to pay close attention to the leading beacons and steering signals.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to consolidate the Laws for the protection of Fisheries and Game*, it is amongst other things enacted that if any person shall set, lay down, use, or fish with any kind of net in the Yarra Yarra, Plenty, Werribee, or Saltwater rivers, in the colony of Victoria, or in any other river, lake, creek, stream, or pond to which the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall, by Proclamation duly published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the provisions of the eleventh clause, he shall forfeit such net and also such sum, not exceeding ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall think fit: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the above recited provisions of the said Act, being the eleventh clause thereof, to the River Goulburn.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BACCHUS MARSH UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The United Town and Farmers' Common of Bacchus Marsh, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1864, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Bacchus Marsh Farmers' Common, the boundaries whereof are set forth in the *Gazette* of the 22nd February, 1861, the said angle being a point on the right bank of Goodman's Creek bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 15, parish of Coimadai; thence

TWO HUNDRED AND FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

IRON CASTINGS.

FIREWOOD.

The wood is to be split out of large forest timber of either red or white gum, box, or she-oak, and must be perfectly sound; peppermint, stringybark, or messmate, will not be received.

The wood is to be split into billets of convenient sizes for the use of the engines, and is to be cut into billets of 2 feet in length, and no small branches will be received.

The whole of the firewood, when delivered, is to be stacked where pointed out, at the contractor's expense, in stacks of such sizes as will be directed, ready for measurement. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring, and the billets are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks, in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack.
