NOTICE TO MARINERS.

From and after the 15th September, 1869, the Lights on the following Lighthouses will be, night by night, continuously exhibited, and on the 21st September the Lightship which has hitherto marked the entrance of the Rangoon River will be removed.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Act XIII of 1867, a coast light due of one anna a ton will be levied on and after the 15th September on all vessels of fifty tons burden and upwards if the voyage be from Rangoon or Maulmain to Bassein, or from Bassein to Rangoon or Maulmain.

N.B.—The bearings and courses given are all true.

1. *Coast lighthouse on the Krishna Shoal, Gulf of Martaban, in latitude 15° 36' 30" north, longitude 95° 35' east.*

A lighthouse on screw piles in three fathoms at low water, on the south eastern edge of the above shoal, showing a fixed dioptric light of the second order. The focal plane of the light sixty feet above high water mark, visible fourteen nautical miles. Rise and fall of tide twelve feet. H. W. at F. and C. XII hours. The light is cut off at W.S.W. to the westward, and at N.N.E. to the eastward, the centre of the light being south east.

It is provided with a fog bell which, in foggy weather, will be sounded at intervals of thirty seconds.

In making the light (the object of which is to enable vessels to round Baragu Point so as to avoid the dangers of the Baragu flat and Krishna shoal) from the westward, a vessel should keep in not less than seven fathoms of water to the southward, steering eastward until the light bears north-west and distant five to ten miles, then steering, according to strength and set of the tide, between north-east by north, and north-east forty miles, to make China Buckeer Lighthouse off the mouth of Rangoon River.

Vessels from the northward going south must not get into less than six fathoms of water when standing to the westward, or bring the light to bear to the southward of S.W. by W. ¼ W.

No vessel should approach within five miles of the lighthouse.

A vessel bound to the westward may steer in that direction after she has brought the light to bear north, distant five to ten miles, taking care to keep in not less than seven fathoms of water.

II. *Harbor lighthouse on China Buckeer, off the entrance of Rangoon River.*

Hitherto the entrance to the channel of the Rangoon River has been marked by a lightship in three and a half fathoms of water. The lighthouse is situated on the high land of China Buckeer, which is generally first made by ships bound to Rangoon, and is about three miles north-east of the mouth of the China Buckeer River. It is built on screw piles, and the lower part being against a back ground of dark trees will be painted white. It is close to high water mark, but the sands at low

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water stretch six miles to the eastward of it. Ships must therefore keep well to seaward from it. It will bear a dioptric light of the first order, the upper and lower cupolas showing a fixed light, and the centre drum a revolving light attaining its greatest brilliancy once a minute. It can be seen fifteen nautical miles from the deck or seventeen nautical miles from the mast head of a ship. It is in latitude 16° 19' 30" north, and longitude 96° 12' east.

III. *Harbor Lighthouse near the Eastern Grove, off the mouth of the Rangoon River.*

This lighthouse is also on screw piles, in latitude 16° 29' north, and longitude 96° 26' 30" east. It will show a light over an arc of 60°. It will be cut off to the eastward due south, 10° of this angle will show a condensed light, the centre of which will pass through the present position of the lightship or in a direction south 30° west. This condensed light will be visible sixteen nautical miles from the deck or eighteen nautical miles from the mast head of a ship, and the remaining 50° of light twelve miles from the deck of a vessel. It is not intended to be a leading light into the river, but to prevent vessels, making the land or China Buckeer light, from running too far to the westward.

Sailing directions for making the mouth of the Rangoon River.

Steer so as to make China Buckeer light bearing between N. by E. and W. by N. To avoid the eastern sands, a vessel should not go so far north as to bring the light to bear to the southward of west; and to avoid the western sands, the Eastern Grove lighthouse must not be brought to bear to the eastward of N.N.E. ¼ E. With China Buckeer light bearing W. and the Eastern Grove light bearing between N.N.E. ¼ E. and N., vessels will be on the Rangoon Pilot Station, in the neighborhood of which pilot vessels are constantly cruising, should anchor until daylight, or until a pilot is obtained.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHTHOUSE, SANDY CAPE.

THE tower of the new lighthouse at Sandy Cape being now in course of erection, the light will probably be exhibited some time in January next.

The illuminating apparatus will be of the first order dioptric, revolving, attaining its greatest brilliancy every two minutes. The light will be at an elevation of about 385 feet above the level of the sea, and will be visible from the deck of a vessel, about 26 miles, being 6 miles beyond the end of Breaksea Spit.

The light will be visible all around the horizon, except where intercepted by the land of Great Sandy Island.

The tower will be 97 feet high from base to vane, and painted white.

Vessels should not attempt to make the light on a southerly bearing, except in very fine weather.

Due notice will be given of the date upon which the light will be exhibited, and the necessary directions published for its use, in rounding the Spit.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census. Instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 178,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.63 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The mortality of October exceeded the average of the month during ten years by 31, but the deaths in the same month of 1860 and 1866 were more numerous. The least mortality was in the October of 1862, and in that of 1864.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 80° on the 15th and 22nd, and the lowest was 37° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month was 1.6° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.7°) took place on the 14th, viz.:—from a maximum of 73.7° to a minimum of 37.0°. The least range (4.2°) was on the 6th, viz.:—from a maximum of 54.2° to a minimum of 50.0°.

Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 42 per cent. were of females. Forty per cent. of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, against 33 per cent. in the previous month, against 45 per cent. in October, 1868; 40 per cent. in October, 1867; 51 per cent. in October, 1866; 52 per cent. in October, 1865; 41 per cent. in October, 1864; 37 per cent. in October, 1863; 40 per cent. in October, 1862; 51 per cent. in October, 1861; and 62 per cent. in October, 1860.

Seven males of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—Two, each aged 76, of old age; one, aged 78, of disease of the prostate gland; another, aged 79, of apoplexy; one, aged 82, of angina pectoris; and two, aged respectively 83 and 89, of old age.

Fourteen violent deaths occurred during the month, all of which were recorded as accidental. The following are the particulars:—A pointsman, aged 37, was crushed between two buffers; a clerk, aged 40, died of a fall, whilst suffering from an epileptic fit; a builder, aged 45, died of a fractured spine; a bricklayer, aged 50, died of a fractured skull, caused by a fall whilst drunk; a male child, aged 1½, died of scalds; a female, aged 49, was burnt to death whilst lighting a fire, being in a state of intoxication; a boy,

aged 4, was poisoned with carbolic acid; a boy, aged two, was drowned in the Sandridge Lagoon; a seaman, aged 26, was drowned in the Saltwater River; a blacksmith, aged 40, and a gentleman, aged 62, were drowned in the Yarra, the latter whilst intoxicated; three infants, aged respectively 10 weeks, 13 weeks, and 2 months, were suffocated in bed.

Seventy-two deaths, or about 25 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Immigration Hospital, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 113, of which 64, or nearly 57 per cent., were of males, and 49, or about 43 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 88 were under one year of age, 11 were between one and two years, 7 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 172, of which 101, or nearly 59 per cent., were males, and 71, or about 41 per cent., were females; 7 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 15 were between forty-five and fifty, 12 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 9 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election of members of the Council, as in any case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, and in any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district"), the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in the said district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the coming into force of the said Act be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where therein otherwise expressly provided, of the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-third day of August, 1869, the Shire of Benalla was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the same into subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Shire of Benalla into three separate electoral subdivisions, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and with thereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Broken River with the western boundary of Tallygaroopna and bounded on the south by the Broken River to its intersection with the Sydney road, to the township of Benalla; thence by the centre of the Sydney road to its intersection with the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by the Fifteen-mile Creek to the south-east corner of allotment 1, section F, thence by the southern boundary of allotment 1 and the western boundary of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 and the northern boundary of allotment 6, all of section F, to the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by that creek to the Ovens River; thence by the Ovens River to the southern boundary of the Peechelba run; thence by the southern boundaries of Peechelba, St. James, Yabba-yabba, Katandra, and Tallygaroopna to the commencing point.

THE SOUTH-EAST RIDING.—Commencing at the intersection of the Sydney road with the Broken River; thence by the centre of the Sydney road to its intersection with the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by the Fifteen-mile Creek to a point due east from the summit of Putters Range where crossed by the Sydney road; thence due west to the Sydney road and by Putters Range to the summit nearest to the source of the Fifteen-mile Creek; thence direct to the eastern source of King River as far as its western branch; thence by that western branch to its source; thence by the range dividing the King and Holland Rivers from the Broken River to the source of Back Creek; thence by Back Creek to the Broken River; and by the Broken river to the commencing point.
