TIMES FOR HOLDING CIRCUIT COURTS ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of March 1870.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of December 1869, Circuit Courts were directed to be holden at Castlemaine and Sandhurst on certain days in April, July, and October in the year 1870, and at Beechworth and Sale on certain days in October aforesaid; and it is expedient to alter the times appointed for holding such Courts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the times appointed by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned for holding Circuit Courts at Castlemaine and Sandhurst during the months of April, July, and October in the present year, and at Beechworth and Sale during the month of October aforesaid; and doth hereby, in lieu of such times, appoint the said Courts to be holden at the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner herein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim as a town the portion of Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, viz. —

TOWN OF COBDEN.—Commencing at the north-west angle of suburban allotment 20, in the parish of Tandarook; bounded thence by a line bearing south seventy chains; thence by a line bearing west ninety-two chains sixty-two links; thence by a road bearing north seventy chains; and thence by a road bearing east ninety-two chains sixty-two links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(70.X.2719.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any Murray pine within a distance of ten miles of the Murray River.

On the 13th of December 1869:-

TIMOTHY HOWARD

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

New Regulation.—Pupil-Teachers.

Rule 13 A.—In every school registered for pupil-teachers under Rule 90, and having an average attendance of 150 or over 150, there shall be at least one pupil-teacher for every 100 scholars in average attendance; and in every school having said average attendance and not so registered, the number of assistant teachers shall not exceed that to which such school would be entitled if registered. The Board may, however, sanction a departure from this rule where pupil-teachers cannot be obtained. Where staffs are already allotted, assistants need not be displaced or discontinued, except as vacancies shall occur.

In No. 107 of the General Regulations of the Board of Education, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th October 1869, No. 57, page 1625, the words "two in the forenoon and two in the afternoon," in the 7th and 8th lines, should be omitted, and the words "each day" substituted.

In Appendix B, pp. 1629-30 of the same *Gazette*, "Programme showing the instruction to be given in each class and the subjects in which it will be examined by the Inspector," the programme of instruction for Class V. in arithmetic should be—"To simple proportion and practice, with the four simple rules in decimals."

And the programme of examination for Class VI. in arithmetic should be—

"The compound rules, reduction, simple proportion, and practice, with the four simple rules in decimals."

BYE-LAW.—[27th January 1870.]

AT a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the twenty-seventh day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seventy, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

Special protection registration.—In the event of any company or persons now holding a claim being unable to collect from the holders of the shares or interests in such claim the calls necessary for prosecuting the works upon such claim, and in the event of the market value of a share or interest in such claim being less than the amount of capital called up in respect of such share or interest, and provided that work shall have been *bond fide* commenced on such claim, and a sum of not less than four hundred pounds (£400) expended in carrying out such works (that is to say, upon the conjunction of the events aforesaid), on production of a statutory declaration made by the manager of a company, or by any other person duly authorised in that behalf, to the effect that such company or persons are unable to collect calls necessary for carrying on the operations upon such claim, and that the shares or interests respectively in such claim cannot be sold for so much money as has been called up in respect of each such share or interest, and that the work as aforesaid has been done, and the amount expended as aforesaid, the mining registrar shall register the claim of such company or persons to be held in reserve and unworked for any period not exceeding six (6) months, and every such registration shall be deemed a special protection to such company or persons as aforesaid, and provided the statements contained in the declaration be true, the claim shall be exempt from fine or forfeiture for non-performance of work during the continuance of such special protection: Provided always that all claims held at the date on which this bye-law becomes law shall, in the events aforesaid, be entitled to such special protection notwithstanding the title to such claim shall hereafter be or have been assigned, transferred, or otherwise dealt with: And further, provided always that if it shall appear to a court of competent jurisdiction that the reasons assigned in the declaration under which such protection registration was obtained were insufficient, or that the declaration was untrue, then such claim which was held, or was applied to be held, under such protection registration shall be forfeitable, and may, by a competent court, be declared forfeited: Provided that such court may in such case inflict by way of penalty, in lieu of forfeiture, a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds (£100), nor less than Twenty-five pounds (£25): Provided also that no claim shall be registered a second time under this bye-law.

Additional provision to clause 63 of the bye-laws of the 16th December 1868.—Provided always, that if it shall appear to the court that work has not been *bond fide* commenced and continued in such claim within one (1) month after the lapse of the two (2) months allowed after registration, the said court may at once declare the right of such persons to the claim forfeited, and the parties enforcing such forfeiture shall be deemed to have a previous claim to be put in possession as provided in clause 76.

The undersigned members of the Maryborough Mining Board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.
