## WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358), has, by Orders made on the 12th day of April 1870, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said Orders appointed, execute the works on the Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 294th section of the said Act, according to sufficient plans deposited with the Minister administering the said Act, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal two miles seventeen chains and fifteen links of the Hamilton to Caramut Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal two miles forty-two chains and twelve links of the Hamilton to Ballarat Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of North Ovens shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal thirty-six chains and forty-two links of the Wangaratta to Beechworth Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Mansfield shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal twenty-five chains and fifty links of the Howqua to Doon Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Leigh shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal twenty-nine chains of the Upper Western Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Leigh shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal sixty-eight chains of the Lower Western Main Road.

The Council of the Shire of Leigh shall, within twelve months from the date of such Order, drain, form, and metal forty-two chains of the Rokewood to Buninyong Main Road.

## REGULATIONS.

1st. All entries must be made with the secretary, in writing, on or before the 15th June, at his office, Queen street, Melbourne, and the samples must be delivered to him on or before the 1st July. A proper cellar will be provided for the reception of the samples.

2nd. In classes for wines of any vintage, four (4) bottles of each sample must be exhibited, and twelve (12) bottles of each sample of new wines; and must in any case, except liqueur wines, be from a sample of not less than one hogshead.

3rd. No mark or motto will be allowed to be on the bottles other than those placed there by the secretary when delivered to him. The secretary shall place on such bottles the name of the wine, and the date of the vintage.

4th. In each case of the prize new wines, and any other samples that the committee of the council may determine, on the recommendation of the judges, shall be retained for further judgment at the end of twelve months without interfering with the awards made this year.

5th. In every case the exhibitor must state the date of the vintage, the names of the grapes from which the wine was made, the age of the vines, the nature of the soil, how cultivated, and whether the vines are trained to stakes or otherwise; and must make a declaration that the wine is made from grapes of his own growth.

6th. All entries must be made subject to such arrangement for the storage of the wine and the awarding the prizes as the Council of the Board of Agriculture may determine.

7th. There shall be two sets of judges, who shall separately and on different days judge the samples, and select those they may consider entitled to the prizes—the second set to act without the knowledge of how the samples have been selected by the first set; and in case of any difference of opinion being found to exist, the whole of the judges shall meet and determine how the prizes shall be awarded.

8th. Except in Class B, No. 16, the same wine shall not be allowed to take a prize under any other number.

## TOWONG DISTRICT BOARD, TINTALDRA.

## PROPOSED BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE TOWONG ROAD BOARD, AND THE CONDUCT OF THEIR OFFICERS AND SERVANTS.

THE ordinary meetings of the board to be held on the first Fridays in every second month, beginning on the first Friday in January, at Ten o'clock a.m., or as soon thereafter as a quorum of three shall be present; but should no quorum be present within one hour from the time of meeting, then such meeting shall stand adjourned as required by clause 143 of the Act numbered 358, 33rd Victoria, a minute to be taken to that effect by the secretary, and entered in the minute book.

2. Special meetings shall be summoned by the secretary upon his receiving a written requisition signed by three members of the board, stating the subject-matter to be brought forward at such meeting, notice whereof shall be given to each of the members not less than four (4) nor more than seven (7) clear days before such meeting.

3. The order of business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows:—1st, reading and confirming minutes; 2nd, reading copies of letters sent; 3rd, reading letters received; 4th, reception of and reading petitions; 5th, reports of committees (if any), and reports of officers of the board; 6th, orders of the day; 7th, motions of which notice shall have been given; 8th, passing accounts; 9th, giving notices of motion.

4. The minutes of a previous meeting, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy.

5. Any memorial or petition addressed to the board shall be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of previous proceedings of the board, or business undisposed of at such meeting, and any unimportant business the chairman or any member may bring forward.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the member giving the same (or one acting on his written authority in that behalf) be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

8. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost, any other may be moved before the original motion is put. The adoption of any amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussions shall be acted upon as an original motion.

9. No resolution passed at any meeting of the board shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless in accordance with clause 146 of *The Local Government Act 1869*.

10. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

11. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all points of order or practice, and he shall state the same without argument or comment. He shall also decide who shall first be heard in cases when two or more members rise to speak at the same time.

12. Any member, when speaking, shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted except by a call to order, when the member calling to order shall be heard, and the point of order decided before the business shall be resumed or other matters brought forward.

13. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment; if the motion be carried, the business undisposed of shall have precedence at the next ordinary meeting of the board, but if lost, the subject previously under consideration or next in order shall be discussed before a subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

14. No member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same proposition, except the mover by way of explanation or reply, or the mover of an amendment last proposed; after the reply the amendment or motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

15. Any member who shall refuse to obey when called to order by the chairman, or shall make use of any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, and who shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology, when required to do so by the chairman, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

16. Any member may, with the consent of the chairman, require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a member immediately on the same being uttered.

17. The voting shall in all cases be by show of hands taken for and against the motion. Every motion or amendment, with the names of the mover and seconder, shall be entered on the minutes, and the votes shall be recorded.

18. Any member may demand the production of documents relating to the matter under discussion.

19. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, and the protest shall be entered on the minute book, and the member or members so protesting shall sign the same.

20. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and if such motion be carried, the secretary shall give notice thereof to each member seven clear days at least before the meeting for which such call is made.

21. It shall be competent for a majority of the whole board to suspend one or more of the standing orders herein contained, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion adopted by the board.

22. In committee meetings these standing orders shall also be observed.

23. The revenue raised in any locality, including licenses, rates, and Government grant on account of the same, or from whatever source received, shall be, as a general rule, expended

in that locality, except for the execution of necessary works for the benefit of the road district generally.

24. Any petition, application, or motion presented or made to the board, involving the expenditure of any moneys, exceeding the sum of Ten pounds shall not be considered by the board until its next meeting, unless in cases of emergency; and no member or officer of the board shall incur any expenditure on any works on any road exceeding the aforesaid sum, without having first obtained the sanction of the board for such expenditure.

25. All contracts shall be made by tender, of which five days' notice shall be given in some newspaper circulating in the district. Tenders to be endorsed and addressed to the chairman, and be only opened at the time of their being considered; and shall be accompanied with a preliminary deposit in cash, according to the following scale:—If under Forty pounds, a deposit of Two pounds, and all above that amount, a deposit of Five per cent.; and in the event of the successful tenderer declining to take up the contract within seven days from the date of the acceptance of his tender, the preliminary deposit shall be forfeited to the board. The deposits on unaccepted tenders to be returned after such tenders have been finally disposed of. The security in all cases of contract shall be Ten per cent. on the amount specified in the tender (or two sureties to the satisfaction of the board), and shall be paid over to the treasurer, and the moneys so paid shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained his certificate from the board's surveyor that the works have been satisfactorily executed.

26. In all cases where contracts shall be entered into amounting to a hundred pounds and upwards an agreement shall be drawn up (in writing or print, or partly in writing and partly in print) between the board and the contractor for the execution of the works, and shall be signed by two members on behalf of the board, and the common seal attached, and also signed by the contractor. The contractor and his sureties shall also sign a bond in the amount of security required by the board, as set forth in clause 25. In cases where the tenderer fails to take up his contract, it shall be competent for the board to order that the next lowest tender be taken, or fresh tenders to be called for, as the board shall think fit.

27. All payments shall be made by cheque if over One pound, signed by three members, and countersigned by the secretary.

28. The valuer or valuers appointed by the board shall examine every rateable property in the district, and shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the owner or occupier thereof, or left on the premises, a notice setting forth the amount at which the same has been valued, together with other particulars sufficient to describe such property, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer or valuers.

29. In the collection of rates due to the board, it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once, and if such rates are not then paid to him, a notice in writing or in print, or partly in writing and partly in print, duly signed by such collector, shall be left, stating that, if the same be not paid at the office of the board within fourteen days from the date of giving such notice, legal proceedings may be taken for the recovery of the same.

30. The collector shall, not less than once in every seven days, pay over to the treasurer all moneys belonging to the board that may have come into his possession, and shall obtain a receipt for such moneys, which shall be a sufficient discharge; and every such collector shall, at each monthly meeting of the board, deliver to them true and perfect accounts in writing, under his hand, of all moneys received by him, and of all moneys paid by him to the said treasurer; and shall at any other time or times, as shall be required of him by the board, furnish to them full and perfect reports in writing under his hand, of any matter or thing appertaining to the duties of his office; and every such collector shall have power to sue, in the name of the board, before any justice, for the recovery of any rates or other moneys to be collected by him due to the board.

31. All moneys of the board, amounting to Twenty pounds and upwards shall within three days after they have come into the possession of the treasurer, be paid by him into such bank as the board shall from time to time appoint for that purpose.

32. The secretary shall be the custodian of all documents belonging to the board and of the common seal of the corporation, which he shall affix to any corporate document requiring the same when instructed by the board, but not otherwise. In cases of powers-of-attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, (the signature to which requires to be verified before the chairman by declaration), the said seal shall and may be affixed to the chairman's certificate accompanying the same, on receipt of a fee of 10s. 6d. for each attestation.

33. The surveyor shall attend all board meetings, and also meetings of committees, if required.

34. The secretary, surveyor, and every other officer of the board shall, whenever called upon to do so, furnish official reports to the board.

35. All officers of the board, if required, shall enter into a bond for the faithful performance of their several duties; and all officers entrusted with the control of moneys shall find such security as the board shall from time to time require.

36. Any officer or servant of the board who shall wilfully by any act of omission or commission of any matter or thing appertaining to his duties, cause the board to sustain any loss or damage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.

# BYE-LAWS OF THE DONNYBROOK AND WALLAN- WALLAN DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

## BUSINESS OF THE BOARD.

THE ordinary meetings of the board shall be held at the offices of the board, at Beveridge, on the last Tuesday in every month, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, and should any meeting be adjourned in consequence of a want of a quorum, such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

2. The minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board in order to their confirmation (except when new members have to be introduced, which may take precedence of all other business), and no discussion shall be allowed thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

3. After the confirmation of the minutes the order of business shall be as follows:—

- I.—Reading letters received, and ordering thereupon.
- II.—Reading copies of letters sent.
- III.—Reading petitions.
- IV.—Reading reports of committees, deputations, and officers.
- V.—Orders of the day.
- VI.—Financial statement and payment of accounts.
- VII.—Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
- VIII.—Motions without notice.
- IX.—Reading notices of motions for future meetings.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board must be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and considered amongst the orders of the day, or at a future meeting, or that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, ordering upon petitions, reports of committees, deputations, and officers, opening tenders, and any business which the chairman may bring under consideration.

6. Notices of motion shall be given in writing to the clerk, and shall be read aloud at a meeting of the board previous to the one at which such are to be discussed; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

7. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called in order; notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

8. Whenever a special meeting of the board shall be held, or whenever any three or more members of the board shall request the chairman in writing to have a call of the board, there shall be a call of the whole board, and any member absent from the meeting for which such call is made shall pay a fine of £1 to the funds of the board, provided the clerk shall have sent notice in writing to each member of the board at least seven days previous, stating that such call had been made.

## ORDER OF DEBATE.

9. Every member shall stand when addressing the board, unless called to order, when he shall sit down till the point of order is decided, after which he shall be allowed to resume the subject.

10. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

11. No important business or motion involving the expenditure of more than £20 shall be proceeded with unless notice of motion shall have been given at a previous meeting.

12. Any member proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such before addressing the board in support thereof.

13. No motion or amendment shall be discussed unless it be seconded.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed, and shall be put to the vote before the original motion; but if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.

15. All motions shall be put to the meeting by the chairman, and a show of hands shall be taken; but any member may require a division, in which case the votes shall be recorded, and all the members present shall vote.

16. Any motion may be set aside by the previous question being moved, viz., "That this question be now put," and negative, but no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

17. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but on any adjournment being moved and negatived, the subject then under discussion, or the next on the notice paper, as the case may be, shall be decided, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

18. No member of the board shall speak more than once on any question except in explanation or reply, upon a motion or amendment of which he is the mover, nor shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, nor make use of offensive language or demeanor to any other member; and any member offending in this respect who shall refuse to withdraw the offensive expression and apologise, on being required to do so by the chairman, or shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered in a summary way, according to law.

19. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention to protest, specifying the reasons for protesting, must

be sent to the clerk, in writing, before the next ordinary meeting of the board, which protest shall be entered by the clerk on the minutes before they are confirmed.

20. Notices of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, provided not more than two members be absent at such board meeting, and the motion, if any members are absent, be carried unanimously.

21. No person, other than a member, shall be allowed to speak or take part at any meeting of the board, and any person offending in this respect shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

## CONTRACTS.

22. All contracts shall be made by tender, and advertised for as the board shall direct. Tenders shall be sealed, addressed to the chairman, and deposited in a tender box, to be kept in the board room till the hour of noon, after which they shall be opened by the chairman; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered on the minutes; and no member of the board shall take charge of any tender or deposit money. The successful tenderer shall be required to deposit immediately with the board a sum equal to five per cent. on the amount of his tender, as security for the performance of the works of the contract; which sum shall be retained by the board until the satisfactory execution of the work.

23. The payment of fines for the non-completion of the works of a contract within the time specified shall be strictly enforced unless the board shall waive the right in any particular case.

## PAYMENT OF MONIES.

24. All payments shall be made in accordance with the Act at ordinary meetings of the board, and no accounts shall be paid unless they have been duly passed by the board, and no contractor shall receive any payment unless a certificate from the surveyor advising it be given.

25. No works shall be undertaken in any subdivision, nor money paid for any works, unless there shall be funds to the credit of the subdivision.

26. All moneys due for salaries or wages to any officer or servant of the board shall be paid in full to such officer or servant, and under no circumstances shall the "truck system" be permitted or adopted in hiring or paying laborers under the board.

## DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

27. The clerk of the board shall attend at the office of the board on Wednesday in every week from 10 a.m. till 3 p.m., as well as at all ordinary and other meetings of the board; and besides keeping the minutes and books of the board shall keep a record of the attendance of members, which shall be published with the annual statement; and shall also furnish half-yearly returns showing the balance to the credit or otherwise of each subdivision.

28. The collector shall collect all rates, license fees, fines, and other moneys to which the board may be entitled, and furnish monthly reports showing all moneys that have come into his hands during the previous month.

29. The surveyor shall report monthly on the state of the roads in the district, and any works that may be in progress.

30. The treasurer shall furnish monthly reports to the board, showing all moneys that have been received by him during the month and their disposal.

31. No member, officer, or servant of the board shall be security for any officer or servant of the board.

32. No officer or servant of the board shall take any part (except by recording his vote), either directly or indirectly, in any election of members of the board. Any officer or servant so doing shall be immediately dismissed from the service of the board, and forfeit all salary or wages due to him.

## APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

33. No inferior officer of the board shall be appointed unless a notice in writing, stating the nature of the appointment to be made, shall have been sent by the clerk to every member of the board at least seven days previous.

## SUSPENSION OF BYE-LAW.

34. Any part of the foregoing bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* with the unanimous consent of the members present, the same being entered in the minute book.

## BREACH OF BYE-LAW.

35. Any member, officer, or servant of the board guilty of any act of commission or omission against any part of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered according to law.

## CUTTING TIMBER OR TREES.

36. Any person cutting down trees on any road in the district without the authority of the board first had and obtained shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered in a summary way, according to law.

## POSTING AND OPERATION OF BYE-LAW.

37. A copy of this bye-law shall be kept conspicuously posted by the clerk in the offices of the board.

38. On this bye-law coming into operation, the bye-law passed by the board on the 28th day of May 1867 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

## SLAUGHTERING LICENSES.

39. The fee to be paid to the district board for licenses for slaughtering, under the Abattoirs Statute, within the district, shall be Ten shillings.
