# Icebergs.

Icebergs.

LARGE numbers of Icebergs and detached masses of ice having been fallen in with in the months of September and November 1869 by vessels homeward bound round Cape Horn, extending in the 42nd meridian of West longitude as far north as the parallel of 42½ South latitude: It is recommended that vessels taking this route should sight, or pass a moderate distance eastward of the Falkland Islands, and should not steer eastward of a N.E. by N. course (true) until northward of the parallel of 40°.

By a reference to the Admiralty Ice Chart of the Southand

By a reference to the Admiralty Ice Chart of the Southern Hemisphere (No. 1241) it will be seen that Icebergs and drift ice have been met with in the months of March and April between the meridians of 20° and 25° West as far north as 40°, and as it appears that exceptionally large quantities of ice are now adrift in the South Atlantic, vessels bound eastward round the Cape of Good Hope are cautioned accordingly.

# HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE. No. 40. Pacific Ocean. Western Part.

The following information on the Santa Cruz Islands, and the New Hebrides Group, has been compiled from letters and observations received from Navigating Lieutenant Thomas Capel Tilly, R.N., of the Mission Schooner Southern Cross.\*

Santa Cruz Islands.—The positions obtained of prominent points in these islands agree fairly with those of D'Entrecasteaux, and place north point in lat. 10° 40° 8, long. 166° 40° 30° E. and north point of Tinakula or Volcano Island in lat. 10° 23′ 30° 8, long. 165° 47′ 30° E. There is evidently an error in Captain Wilson's account of a low island which be describes as lying S.S.W. from Volcano Island; this bearing should be N.N.E., which would agree with the position of an island now known as Nukapu; the two other islands spoken of as having been seen after "steering W. by S. about five leagues" would be Anologo and Nupani.†

The Matema or Svallow Islands, forming part of the Santa Cruz Group, lie to the northward of the great island, and between the parallels of 10° 4′ and 10° 22′ S., extending from long. 165° 39′ E. to 166° 19′ E., occupying an extent of about forty-two miles in a W. by N. direction from Nimanu, the south-eastern of the group, to Nupani, the north-western; they are from 190 to 200 feet above the sea, and are dangerous from the extensive reefs which stretch out, especially from the western or lee sides. The inhabitants are rough and fearless; they come off cagerly to barter mats, bows and arrows, for iron, and appear to be bold navigators, sailing in their double canoes as far as Tucopia, which lies about one hundred and eighty miles to the south-east.

Nimanu, the south-eastern island of the group, is in lat. 10° 21' S., long 166' 17' E., and lies N.N.E. 25 miles from the eastern high land of Santa Cruz; it is a small round bold-looking island some 200 feet high, with apparently deep water all round; there is a land slip and probable landing-place on its lee side.

Panari, the eastern island of the group, lies in lat. 10° 17′ S., long. 166° 19′ E., distant about four miles N. by E. \( \frac{1}{2}\) E. from Nimanu, to which it is similar in size and appearance, but not quite so high; it is well wooded; on the western side there is a small bight with a steep white beach; from this there appeared to be communication with the nearest part of Lomlom, the next island, about three-quarters of a mile distant.

Lomlow runs E.N.E. and W.S.W. about 5 miles long by 11 Lomiom runs E.N.E. and W.S.W. about 5 miles long by 12 broad; it is from 150 to 250 feet high, and forms, with another island whose name is unknown, a smooth-water bay open to the northward, the shores of which are composed of rough beaches fringed with narrow reefs. Lomiom appears to be clear of dangers except off its south-west extreme, where a reef extends about S.S.W. for 13 mile; the reef then trends to the northward towards the second island, with several large rocks or islets within its edge.

ward towards the second island, with several large rocks or islets within its edge.

The second island is similar to Lomlom in size running north and south 4\frac{1}{2} miles long toy less than one mile wide, and between 100 and 200 feet ligh; the weather or eastern side is bold, and from a bluff on the north-east coast commences an extensive coral reef, trending first N.W. for about 4 miles to Nivluli, the next island (which it surrounds), and then runs about W.S.W. for nearly 13 miles. The villages on these islands are probably situated inland, or on the eastern side which faces the lagoon, as only one hut, resembling a boat-house, was seen from the sea.

Niviuli lies about one mile from the second island of Lomlom, and is a mile long N.W. and S.E., and 120 feet high. The reef runs close round its north-east side, and then trends to the west and south-west for about two miles, forming a bay with a low rock on the edge; a small round islet about 35 feet high lies half a mile within the reef. From the rock the reef runs to the westward. westward.

Pilen, the next island westward of Nivluli, from which it is distant 3 miles, runs N.W. and S.E. about one mile in length; it is about 100 feet high, and there is a village on its south-west point. Pileni lies outside the great lagoon, but is surrounded by a reef, which passing close round its eastern side extends about three-quarters of a mile to the south-west from its western shore; there is apparently a deep-water channel between the main and the Pileni reefs.

Sand Islet is merely what its name indicates; it is small, about 10 feet above water, and without vegetation, the natives resorting to it only to fish. This islet lies on the western side of an oval ring of coral, about one mile long, N.N.W. and S.S.E., similar to that of Pileni, and also without the main lagoon, and is the only example in this group of the reef extending to windward of the land to which it is attached. There is a clear space of 12 mile between this reef and that of Pileni, and also a deepwater channel of three quarters of a mile between it and the edge of the main reef.

The Great Reef.—From the Sand Islet the western entrance of the main lagoon bears nearly S.W., distant about 64 miles. This extreme hies in lat. 10° 14° S., long, 16° E.; from it Tinakula bore S.W. 4 W. 17 miles, the eastern high land of Santa Cruz S. by E. 4 E. 28 miles, and Nukapu N. by W. 4 W. 7 miles. From this extreme the reef trends sharp round to the eastward, forming the north side of an apparently deep-water entrance to the lagoon, between the west point and the southwest patch, a reef about 2 miles long, lying S.E. by E. 34 miles from the point.

Eastward of the south-west patch, with an apparently deep-water channel 14 mile wide between them, lies another nairow patch of coral nearly 3 miles long; between this and the reef from Lomlom Island, the coast of which appeared to be beach with villages built near it. The interior of the main lagoon seemed to be patchy, but little could be distinguished from the mast lead of the Southern Cross.

The current was found setting to the south-west along the north side of reef, and overfalls were experienced off its western point.

Matema, the only island on the southern side of the great reef, lies about midway between Lomlom Island and the west point, being nearly 6 miles on a W. by N. bearing from the southern extreme of the Lomlom reef. It is a small island, 100 feet high, shaped like a boot, inhabited (the landing being on the western side), and surrounded by a reef which extends about one-third of a mile from the coast. There is apparently a narrow passage between this island and the middle coral patch of the main reef.

Nukapu lies to the north-west of the great reef, and bears W.N.W. about 8 miles from the Sand Islet; it is narrow, about 120 feet high, and nearly one mile long, N. by W. and S. by E., with a low termination to the southward, where appeared to be the villages; a reef encircles the island, passing close to its eastern shore, but extending about 14 mile from its western

Anologo and Nupani, the western islands of the Matema group, are similar to Nukapu in size and shape; they are surrounded by an extensive and irregularly shaped reef, which, passing close to their eastern sides, stretches out to the south-west for nearly 3 miles from Anologo, the southern of the two islands.

Anologo lies W. ‡ S. about 17 miles from Nukapu, running east and west about one mile long; it is nearly 120 feet high, and is situated in the eastern angle of the reef surrounding the two islands.

Nupani lies N.W. † N. about two miles from Anologo, the reef forming a bight between; it runs north and south about one mile long, and 120 feet high, the northern point being in lat 10° 4′ S., long. 165° 40′ E. The reef passes close along the east and north sides of Nupani, from whence it trends to the external for half a mile, thence sweeps round to the southward and eastward for 2½ miles, from whence it stretches out to the south-west, forming a large and dangerous bight of smooth water nearly four miles between the horns. This south-west angle of the reef which breaks lies S. by W. 3½ miles from Nupani, S.W. 2½ miles from Anologo, and is in lat. 10° 3′ S., long. 165° 39′ E. From this point the reef runs east 2 miles to its south-east extreme, which lies south distant 1½ mile from Anologo; the sea breaks heavily along this part of the reef.

# NEW HEBRIDES.

# (Variation 9° 40' easterly in 1869.)

Paama, one of the southern islands of the New Hebrides, lies north and south, about 5 miles long by 1½ mile broad; its height ranges from 1700 to 1900 feet, presenting an uniform outline from a distant offing.

The approximate position of the southern point (with reference to the neighboring island) is lat. 16° 30' S., long. 168° 10' E. and it lies 3 miles from Duana Point, the north-west extreme of Api or Tasiko-Island. The eastern side of Paama appears from the offing to be clear of dangers and steep-to; it is bold, coming steep down from the ranges.

Close off the south point lie a cluster of rocks, the largest of which is known as the Nine-pin; the whole are encircled by a reef extending about a quarter of a mile from the shore. This reef shelters a small bight with a rough stony beach lying westward of south point; the slopes of the hills above this bight were cultivated. Half a mile westward of the reef a discolored patch was seen, but it was not examined.

From south point the coast trends to the north-west for 1½ mile, with rough beaches and fringing reefs; it then runs north and south for the length of the island with smooth water. About three-quarters of a mile N.W. of the south-west point, and half a mile from the shore, lies a patch about 200 yards in extent, on which there is only an occasional breek; it is therefore dangerous if approached from the south-west point and coast of Paama bears S.E. ½ S., and the north-west extreme of the island bearing N. by E. clears it to the eastward. There is another shoal nearer to the shore and about three-quarters of a mile to the northward of this patch, but the water being smooth there was no break in it.

No other outlying dangers were observed till near the northwest extreme, when a little to the southward of this point, and

off the northern point. The general character of the western
coast is successive beaches of rough coral, with considerable
cultivation on the lower slopes of the north-west ranges. A
village was observed about 1½ mile southward of the north-west
point, and the whole coast is evidently inhabited.

# WEATHER SIGNALS, PILOT STATION, MORETON BAY.

WEATHER SIGNALS, PILOT STATION, MORETON BAY.

IN consequence of the use of Marryatt's Signals being discontinued in this colony after the 31st instant, the direction of the wind and state of the sea at Cape Moreton will, after that date, be signalled from the flagstaff at the pilot station, to vessels outward bound, as follows:

At the masthead, the direction of the wind will be shown by the compass signals section 1, part 1, of the Commercial Code.

At the north yard-arm, the state of the sea, by the following flags:

W-0 Smooth, with slight undulation.

Ny-0 Smooth, with slight undulation.
Q-1 Short sea or slight swell.
S-2 Moderate sea or swell.
J-3 Considerable sea or swell.
L-4 Heavy sea or swell.
V-5 Very heavy sea or swell.
N-6 Very heavy sea and very heavy swell.
With the exception of W and N, which are very seldom required, the number of divisions in the flags will point out the number indicating the state of the sea.
These signals will be hoisted as soon after sunrise as possible, and kept flying for an hour, and they will also be exhibited at such other times as may be required.
When necessary, the force of the wind will be signalled by the Commercial Code (either at the same time or immediately afterwards) from the south yard-arm. The force being indicated by the usual numbers 1 to 12.
When vessels are lying off the watering-place, the signals will, when practicable, be repeated from the Spitfter. The compass signals being shown at the mainmast, and the state of the sea at the foremast head.

# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTRIFORD, of Rottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public-houses and the sale of fermented and spirituous Liquors, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any district or place in Victoria (not included in any municipality), a district or place within which may be granted by the Petty Sessions of such district or place, special temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in such quantities, and subject to such conditions (except the condition of the licensee being a spirit merchant) as specified in the 17th section of the said Act, viz.:—That the licensee shall be authorized to sell and dispose of liquor in bottles containing not less than a pint, and in quantities not exceeding two gallons, to be taken away in any one day by any one person, and not to be drunk in or near the house or premises in which such liquor is sold: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare the Shire of St. Arnaud to be a district within which may be granted by the Petty Sessions of such districtspecial temporary licenses, for periods not less than one month, for the sale of liquors in the quantities and subject to the conditions here inbefore specified.

No. 357, § 6.)

Rules and Regulations of the Public Library, Mu-SEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA .- [4th

I.—Ordinary Meetings.

The trustees shall meet on the first Friday in every month at 4 p.m. in the trustees' room, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate day: Provided that if the first Friday be a holiday, the trustees shall meet on the previous day. And at every such meeting there shall be laid on the table by the secretary the following returns:—

(1.) Statistics of which

- Statistics of visitors to library, gallery, and museums.
   Returns of all local publications bought and delivered to the library in pursuance of the Copyright Act of 1869, and of the English and foreign serial scientific publications and of the donations received during the previous month.

- Register of the temperature in the art galleries.
  Monthly report of finance committee.
  Return showing officers absent from duty during the previous month.
- Any complaints or suggestions by visitors to the public library, museums, or national gallery.

# Order of Business.

- Reading and confirming or amending minutes.
- 3.
- Correspondence.
  Questions, notices, suggestions, and complaints.
  Reports and recommendations from committees.
  Orders of the day.

# II .- Special Meetings.

Any special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened by the secretary at the request of three trustees.

# III .- Quorums and Adjourned Meetings.

Five trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half an hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be held on a day to be named by the trustee or trustees then present; and the business which should

have been transacted shall have precedence at the meeting on the day so fixed.

IV .- Sections.

1. For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the trustees they shall be divided into five ions:—
(1.) The Library.
(2.) The National Gallery.
(3.) The Technological Collection.
(4.) The National Museum and Scientific Collections.
(5.) Einange.

2. For each of the sections a committee shall be appointed from the trustees, which committee shall have the control and management of the business of the section, subject to the approval of the trustees; and it shall be competent for the trustees to dissolve such committee and appoint another in its place. Each sectional committee shall once at least in six months report its proceedings to the trustees, and the trustees may at any time require a special report.

# V .- President.

There shall be a new president and vice-president elected annually on the first Friday of April. The president shall preside at the meetings of the trustees; in his absence, the vice-president; in the absence of both, the meeting shall elect its chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

# VI .- Notice of Meetings.

V1.—Notice of Meetings.

The trustees shall be duly supplied by the secretary with a notice of the day, hour, and place of every meeting, and of all motions to be made or special matters to be considered thereat; and such notice paper shall be posted or delivered at the last known address of every trustee, in the case of ordinary, special, and adjourned meetings, at least three days before the day of meeting; and any trustee may hand to the secretary a notice of motion in writing, which it shall be the secretary's duty to insert in such notice paper, and also to insert the same in a hook to be called the notice of motion book.

VII.—Finance.

A finance committee shall be appointed, consisting of five members, whose duty shall be to examine and certify to all accounts, and all accounts shall be paid by cheques signed by two members of the finance committee and countersigned by

two members of the manner committee.

The secretary.

The funds placed at the disposal of the trustees by Parliament shall be lodged in a bank, to the credit of the corporation, and shall be apportioned by the trustees.

# VIII .-- Committees.

2. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them at their own expense under the direction of the trustees.

3. The usual hours for interments shall be from 10 a.m. to 5

5. The trustees will permit vaults or graves to be dug, maintained, and kept as private burial places, and monuments or tombstones may be erected or placed therein in accordance with the following Rules and Regulations.

6. Private graves will be granted on application to the secretary, subject to the approval of the trustees and the payment of the proper fees.

7. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the owners thereof must be left with the order.

wants, the consent in writing of the owners thereof mass be new with the order.

8. Every coffin deposited in a want or brick grave must be covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, and cemented.

9. All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the

owners.

10. A drawing of every headstone or tomb, together with a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the placing of the same in the cemetery be given.

11. No fencing around any grave will be permitted to be erected until approved by the trustees.

12. The registers, and a plan of the cemetery, will be kept by the secretary.

13. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully do, or cause to be done, any damage to the cemetery or its monuments, headstones, fences, trees, shrubs, or flowers, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

14. In no case shall a grave for an adult be a less depth than six feet, and under 12 years four feet, unless by special permission of the trustees.

15. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof, save and except the sexton, when he shall be requested by the owners of any vault or grave to keep the same in good order.
