## THE TOWN OF PRAHRAN.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359), it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be called such town or city accordingly; provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Prahran for the year from the first day of October 1868 to the thirtieth day of September 1869, both days inclusive, was not less than Ten thousand pounds: And whereas the boundaries of the said borough are amongst others described in the first schedule of the Act hereinbefore recited, and it is deemed expedient to proclaim the said borough to be a town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by this notice proclaim the Borough of Prahran to be a Town, by the name in and by the Order in Council made in this behalf assigned thereto, that is to say—

## SITE FOR A TOWN AT THE JUNCTION OF THE MURRAY AND DARLING RIVERS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby notify and proclaim as a town the portion of Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, viz.:

Commencing on the left bank of the Murray River, at a point on a line running parallel with and forty chains east from a line passing through the junction of the left bank of the Darling River, New South Wales, with the Murray River aforesaid; thence by lines bearing respectively south eighty chains, west eighty chains, and north ninety chains, more or less, to the Murray River; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(70.W.7349)

**ANDERSON'S CREEK GOLDFIELD COMMON.**—The Anderson's Creek Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing an area of one hundred and seventy-five acres, more or less, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of the Warrandyte town reserve, being a point on the left bank of the River Yarra-Yarra; bounded thence by that reserve bearing south sixty-two chains, more or less; thence by allotment 16 bearing east forty-nine chains fifty-six links; thence by lines bearing respectively north twenty-seven chains, more or less, west thirty-seven chains, more or less, and north twenty-six chains seventy links, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.—(69.U.24319.)

**BEALANBARRY AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.**—The temporary common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Bealanbarry, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of August 1869, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of five hundred and eighty-nine acres three rods twenty-nine perches, viz., parish of Gritjurk, allotments 4, 5, 6, and 7.—(69.V.19938.)

**ANAKIE FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Anakie Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 4th day of March 1861 and the 27th day of January 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of the land added to the common on the 27th January 1868, being a point on the Little River; thence north ninety-five chains eighteen links; thence west sixty chains, more or less, to the said river; thence by that river downwards to the north boundary of the parish of Anakie; thence by that boundary west thirty-five chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of the parish of Moreep; thence by the east boundary of that parish bearing south four miles, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 89, parish of Anakie; thence by that allotment bearing east forty chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of the northern portion of the existing common; thence north three and a half miles, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area 1650 acres, more or less.—(69.T.24595.)

**KAMAROOKA GOLDFIELD COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter defined shall be and constitute a goldfield common, under the designation of

the Kamarooka Goldfield Common, viz.: Commencing at a point on the south side of the road forming the south boundary of the parishes of Kamarooka and Tandarra, the said point bearing south from the south-east angle of allotment 126 in the first-named parish; thence by the said road bearing west one hundred and sixty-five chains; thence by lines bearing respectively south one hundred and seventy chains, east one hundred and sixty-five chains, and north one hundred and seventy chains to the point of commencement.
