## AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST—QUEENSLAND.

*Revolving Light on Sandy Cape.*

The colonial Government of Queensland has given notice, that, probably in the month of January 1870, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Sandy Cape.

The light will be a revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every two minutes, elevated 385 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 26 miles, being six miles beyond the end of Breaksea Spit.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the first order.

The tower is 97 feet high, and is painted white. Note.—Vessels should not attempt to make the light on a southerly bearing except in very fine weather.

Also that due notice will be given of the date of the exhibition of the light, and the necessary directions published for its use in rounding Breaksea Spit.

*Silting up of the North Channel, Port Denison.*

Also that the North Channel, Port Denison, has silted up 2 feet, there being now only 14 feet at low water springs instead of 16 feet, as formerly.

The South Channel still retains a depth of 22 feet. Mariners are cautioned accordingly.

## COMMONS UNITED AND ADDED TO.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas all objections respecting the commons hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite or add to (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BEAUFORT, RAGLAN, CHARLTON, AND EURAMBEEN UNITED GOLDFIELD AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The Raglan, Charlton, and Beaufort Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 22nd day of April 1861, and the United Farmers' and Goldfield Common of Eurambeen, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 14th day of May 1866; are hereby united and proclaimed under the designation of the Beaufort, Raglan, Charlton, and Eurambeen United Goldfield and Farmers' Common.—(69.S.26012.)

CARGERIE AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Cargerie Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 31st day of December 1866, and diminished by a Proclamation bearing date the 2nd day of

July 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotments 154, 155, 156, and 178, in the parish of Meredith. Area 1049 acres.—(69.T.18823.)

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

- A**LL charges must be paid to the person in charge when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.  
 2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.  
 3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.  
 4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.  
 5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. till Four p.m.  
 6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.  
 7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.  
 8. The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug at an extra expense of fifteen shillings; but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.  
 9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.  
 10. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair will be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.  
 11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone, slate, or iron.  
 12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, or pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unbecoming or inappropriate; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper or composition clamps must be used.  
 13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, paling fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, or guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.
