FEES FOR CERTIFICATES UNDER SECTIONS 31 AND 98 OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."

WHEREAS by the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor shall have power from time to time to make rules, regulations, and orders for imposing any reasonable charge for surveys or fee for any Crown Grant or other document issued under the authority of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the rule and regulation following, that is to say:—

Regulation for imposing a Fee for a Certificate under the authority of section 31 or section 98 of "The Land Act 1869."

The charge to be imposed as Fee for a Certificate under the authority of section 31, or under the authority of section 98 of *The Land Act 1869*, before issue of any Crown Grant of land purchased under the provisions of either of the said sections, shall be One pound (£1).

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DATES FOR HOLDING GENERAL SESSIONS CHANGED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned places, to be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of certain days appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said courts, that is to say:—

At Ararat, on Wednesday the thirty-first day of August, in lieu of the ninth of September 1870.

At Stawell, on Thursday the first day of September, in lieu of the tenth of September 1870.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REDUCTION IN RATE OF POSTAGE ON LETTERS FORWARDED BY SEA TO NEW SOUTH WALES.

Letters weighing over half-ounce, but bearing a single rate of postage (threepence), to be forwarded to destination, the deficient postage, together with a fine of threepence, being charged on delivery.

The Lords of the Council have learned with regret that losses and delays have occurred to parties in consequence of business having been placed in the hands of unqualified agents, and Her Majesty has been pleased to approve of this Order in Council with a view to prevent the occurrence of any such abuses in future.

ORDER IN COUNCIL FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF CERTAIN RULES TO BE OBSERVED BY PROCTORS, SOLICITORS, AGENTS, AND OTHER PERSONS ADMITTED TO PRACTISE BEFORE HER MAJESTY'S MOST HONORABLE PRIVY COUNCIL.

At the Court at Windsor, the 31st day of March 1870.

PRESENT:
The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a representation from the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, dated the 26th day of March instant, humbly recommending to Her Majesty in Council that certain rules be established by the authority of Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to be observed by all proctors, solicitors, attorneys, agents, or other persons pending before Her Majesty in Council, or other matters pending before Her Majesty in Council, Her Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, and the Schedule of Rules hereunto annexed, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be punctually observed, obeyed, and carried into execution.

I. Every proctor, solicitor, or agent admitted to practise before Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, or any of the committees thereof, shall subscribe a declaration, to be enrolled in the Privy Council Office, engaging to observe and obey the rules, regulations, orders, and practice of the Privy Council; and also to pay and discharge, from time to time, when the same shall be demanded, all fees or charges due and payable upon any matter pending before Her Majesty in Council; and no person shall be admitted to practise, or allowed to continue to practise before the Privy Council, without having subscribed such declaration in the following terms:—

Form of Declaration.

We, the undersigned, do hereby declare that we desire and intend to practise as solicitors or agents in appeals and other matters pending before Her Majesty in Council; and we severally and respectively do hereby engage to observe, submit to, perform, and abide by all and every the orders, rules, regulations, and practice of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council and the committees thereof now in force, or hereafter from time to time to be made; and also to pay and discharge, from time to time, when the same shall be demanded, all fees, charges, and sums of money due and payable in respect of any appeal, petition, or other matter in and upon which we shall severally and respectively appear as such solicitors or agents.

II. Every proctor, solicitor, or attorney practising in London, and duly admitted in any of the Courts of Westminster, shall be allowed to subscribe the foregoing declaration, and to practise in the Privy Council, upon the production of his certificate for the current year; and no fee shall be payable by him on the enrolment of his signature to the foregoing declaration.

III. Persons not being certificated London solicitors, but having been duly admitted to practise as solicitors by the High Courts of Judicature in India or in the Colonies respectively, may apply, by petition, to the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council for leave to be admitted to practise in the Privy Council; and such persons, if admitted to practise by an order of their Lordships, shall pay annually, on the 15th November, a fee of five guineas to the fee fund of the Council Office.

IV. Any proctor, solicitor, agent, or other person practising before the Privy Council, who shall wilfully act in violation of the rules and practice of the Privy Council, or of any rules prescribed by the authority of Her Majesty, or of the Lords of the Council, or who shall wilfully misconduct himself in prosecuting proceedings before the Privy Council, or any committee thereof, or who shall refuse or omit to pay the Council Office fees or charges payable from him when demanded, shall be liable to an absolute or temporary prohibition to practise before the Privy Council, by the authority of the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, upon cause shown at their Lordships' bar.

IMMIGRATION REGULATIONS UNDER THE ACT 27 VICTORIA No. 195.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the 16th of June instant, approved of the subjoined Regulations for the conduct of Emigration to Victoria, for the nomination of Immigrants by persons resident therein, and for the introduction of persons skilled in special industries.

These Regulations will take effect on the first day of July next ensuing.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF EMIGRATION TO VICTORIA, AND FOR THE
NOMINATION OF IMMIGRANTS.

PART I.

1. The only persons eligible for passages under this Part of these Regulations will be Single Females, being British subjects, under the age of 35, who have been accustomed to domestic service (and married couples hereinafter mentioned), who may be selected by the Agent-General of Victoria, and who can produce certificates of good character satisfactory to him, and are free from any bodily or mental infirmity,—numbers to be limited to requirements of the colony as indicated by the amount annually voted by Parliament; and the selection of emigrants to be made from England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales, in proportion to the population of such countries respectively, according to the census for the time being.

2. In the event of the Agent-General being unable to provide the necessary number of married couples from Passage-warrant holders on board vessels conveying single females under these Regulations to act as mess constables and to protect such females, he may select married couples, not exceeding ten for every hundred single females for passages; and such persons will be received on arrival into the dépôt hereinafter mentioned, and will be there maintained during seven days after arrival at the ship's expense.

3. The cost of the passage will be defrayed by the Government, and, at the option of the Agent-General, the expenses of conveyance to the port of embarkation. Each emigrant will, however, be required to pay a sum of one pound, in consideration of the Government providing the necessary bedding and mess utensils.

4. Single females introduced under the above Regulations will be received on arrival into a dépôt provided by the Government until they find employment, but will be required to proceed to any part of Victoria which the Immigration Agent may direct.

PART II.

1. Persons permanently resident in Victoria, being natural born or naturalized British subjects, desirous of bringing their relatives or friends to Victoria, may apply to the Immigration Agent in Melbourne or other officer named in Clause 9 for Passage-warrants, which will be granted under the conditions hereinafter mentioned.

2. The persons to be nominated shall be British subjects, or subjects of the country of the nominator, of sound mind and body, in good health, and of good character; but no Passage-warrant shall be issued, and no transfer of any warrant permitted, in favor of or to any person who may be either lunatic, idiotic, deaf, dumb, blind, maimed, or infirm, or who may have been previously in the Colony of Victoria.

3. A Passage-warrant will entitle the person or persons named therein to be conveyed to Melbourne from a port in the United Kingdom by a ship to be named by the Agent-General within one month of the receipt by him of a request from the nominees for a passage in terms of the warrant; but unless a nominee, or by the consent of the Agent-General for Victoria, a substitute, to be nominated as hereinafter mentioned, shall leave the United Kingdom within nine months of the date of the warrant, such warrant will not be available, but must be returned to Melbourne for renewal or transfer.

4. Passage-warrants shall not be issued for children under 15 years of age, unless on an undertaking that they shall be accompanied by some suitable and approved person who will take charge of them during the voyage.

5. Should the person or persons nominated in any Passage-warrant decline or be unable to emigrate, or be dead, and the warrant not used, the money paid towards their passage will be refunded to the nominator, or another nominee may be substituted in the Passage-warrant by the agent of the nominator, whose name and address shall appear on the face of such warrant, upon application to and with the consent of the Agent-General in London, or by the nominator himself on application to the Immigration Agent in Melbourne.

6. No single females will be permitted to be conveyed in any ship, except in accordance with the Queen's Orders in Council for the conduct of Emigration, dated 3rd February 1863, unless accompanied by relatives or a family of friends.

7. No warrant will be issued in favor of a married man or woman unless accompanied by the husband or wife respectively, or unless the husband or wife be resident in Victoria.

8. No Immigrant under this Part will be received into any immigration depôt except single females, being warrant holders, who may be maintained during seven days after arrival at the ship's expense, but during any subsequent period at the expense of the nominator, who will be held liable to defray the same, and such expense, if not paid, shall become a debt to the Immigration Agent, and may be recovered by him as such by civil process. All nominators are therefore strictly enjoined to make provision for the reception of their nominees immediately on their arrival, as they will not be allowed to remain on board the ship for more than seven days from the date thereof. Single females will, on landing, be conveyed to the Immigration Depôt, from which they will be taken by their friends.

9. All applications for Passage-warrants under this Part of these Regulations shall be made in accordance with Form A hereto attached, which may be obtained at any Post-office throughout the colony, and at the offices hereafter mentioned, or at any office which may be subsequently appointed by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs. The form, with the necessary particulars, carefully inserted and signed by the nominator, should be sent to the Immigration Agent, Melbourne, or to any of the undermentioned offices :—

To any Postmaster in Victoria, or to any officer who may be hereafter authorized by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

This form, correctly filled up, together with the amount required to be paid according to the next clause (10), is to be handed or forwarded to one of the above-mentioned officers, who will without delay forward it in terms of Form B, and a post-office order, bank draft, or Treasury receipt for the money to the Immigration Agent in Melbourne, who will then transmit Passage-warrants for the persons nominated, with the name and address of the nominator's agent written thereon, if any shall have been appointed by him, either to the office at which the money was paid, or to such address as the nominator may request. The Passage-warrant must be sent by the nominator to his friends. All persons paying money for warrants should be careful to get a printed receipt for the same from the officer to whom the money is paid.

10. The following sums shall, under this Part of these Regulations, be paid by the nominator in advance in respect of intending emigrants prior to the issue of the Passage-warrants :—

11. If the nominator or his agent misrepresent any of the particulars, or neglect to furnish full information respecting the persons nominated, or misrepresent any particulars or neglect to furnish full information respecting the person whom he proposes to substitute for the original nominee in the Passage-warrant, or if any person known to be under indenture by the nominator, or his agent, or any person disqualified by these Regulations, or any person whose destination is to any other colony than Victoria, be nominated, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or the Agent-General in London, may cancel the said Passage-warrant, and the deposit shall be forfeited; or if the original or substituted nominee has been introduced into Victoria previous to the disqualification being discovered, the nominator, or in his absence the original or substituted nominee, shall be held liable to refund the amount paid by the Government for the passage-money of the person so disqualified and in whose favor such Passage-warrant may have been issued; and such amount may be recovered by the Immigration Agent from such nominator, or original or substituted nominee, by process of law.

12. If any person by means of personation wrongfully obtain a passage upon a warrant under these Regulations, he or she shall be held liable to pay the whole amount of the passage-money paid or payable for such passage, or shall be liable to the punishment incurred by a person who shall have obtained a passage by means of personation or false representation.

13. The number of persons who shall be permitted a passage under this Part of these Regulations shall be restricted by the amount to be annually voted by Parliament, and the selection of emigrants during every month in the year shall, in the first instance, be made from England, Ireland, Scotland, and Wales, and be in proportion to the population of those countries respectively according to the last census for the time being; but if at the end of any month one full twelfth part of the funds available during such year for the purpose of Immigration from the United Kingdom shall not in the proportions aforesaid have been exhausted, the residue of such twelfth part shall be distributed without regard to nationality.

PART III.

REGULATIONS FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF PERSONS SKILLED IN SPECIAL INDUSTRIES.

1. Passage Certificates, entitling to a passage from Liverpool or London, will be issued to residents in Victoria, for the introduction of persons (and, if married, their families) "skilled in the production of wine or oil, and in the drying or preservation of fruit, or in other special industries," and who have not previously resided in the colony, upon the following conditions:—

2. Application to be made in writing to the Immigration Agent, specifying the number and description of persons proposed for introduction, the place from whence they are to be selected, the kind of business in which they are skilled, together with the name and address of the applicant's agent; a bond with one surety, in the form annexed, must be executed, and payment of a similar deposit as is required in respect to nominations under Part No. II. must be made.

3. No application will, however, be entertained, except on the special approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO—JAVA SEA.

Revolving Light on the North Watcher.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 72, dated 21st September 1869, respecting the exhibition of a light on the North Watcher, the Netherlands Government has given the following additional particulars:—

The light is a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy *every minute*, elevated 159 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the second order.

The tower is built of iron, and painted white.

BANKA STRAIT.

Light vessel in the Lucipara Channel.

Also, with reference to the same Notice, respecting a proposed light vessel in the Lucipara Channel, the Netherlands Government has given notice that the light vessel has been placed in the position formerly marked by a buoy in the narrowest part of the channel.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 28 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the sixth order.

The vessel is painted yellow, with the words "Lucipara passage" on the sides, and has one mast with a black ball on the top. From the light vessel, Green Point bears N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. 4-10 miles, Lucipara Point, S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and Lucipara Island summit, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 9 miles.

AUSTRALIA—PORT PHILLIP.

Light on Schnapper Point.

The Colonial Government of Victoria has given notice that, from the 1st day of January 1870, a light would be exhibited on Schnapper Point, Port Phillip Bay.

The light is a white light, elevated 50 feet above the high water level, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

NEW LIGHT, SANDY CAPE.

ON and after this date a Dioptric Light of the first order will be exhibited from the New Lighthouse on Sandy Cape; the light attaining its greatest brilliancy every two minutes.

The height from the base of the tower to the centre of the lens is 85 feet, and the height of the hill upon which the lighthouse stands is 315 feet, making the total height of the light above high-water mark 400 feet. The power of the illuminating apparatus is intensified between a S. by W. and S.E. by S. bearing by totally reflecting prisms; the light being proportionately diminished in intensity between the reverse bearings.

By day the sand hills at the Cape should be dipped below the horizon before rounding Breaksea Spit; while at night a vessel should not be kept away for rounding its northern extremity until the light begins to dip below the horizon. This position of the light should be retained until the necessary change of bearing shows that the danger is passed.

The light will be visible on the horizon at the following distances, viz.:—

In certain conditions of the atmosphere it is possible that these distances may occasionally be somewhat increased by refraction.

In rainy or squally weather, when the light may be obscured, vessels should not attempt to make the light from the northward, but should endeavor to pick it up when bearing to the eastward of S.E. or to the westward of S.W.

To vessels from the southward the light will become visible as soon as it is opened out clear of Indian Head, on a N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. bearing, and will show round the horizon from that bearing northward until it is again intercepted by the hills to the S.S.W. of the lighthouse.

The light will be visible to within a distance of from four to six miles northward of the Fairway Buoy in Hervey's Bay.

A good departure can be obtained for vessels taking the Capricorn Channel by observing the bearing of the light when it begins to dip below the horizon.

Good anchorage will be found when the wind is from E.N.E. to South, with the lighthouse bearing E.S.E., at a distance of from one-third of a mile to one mile from the beach, in from four to six fathoms, sandy bottom, but good holding ground.

Vessels intending to anchor under the Cape should not bring the lighthouse to bear to the southward of S.E. or when off North-west Point to the northward of E.N.E. Vessels, however, when not drawing more than ten feet, may, in smooth water, cross Panama Spit, which extends to the N.N.W. of North-west Point, with the light bearing N.E. by E., while the westernmost sand cliff in line with the lighthouse leads clear of the extremity of the spit in ten fathoms water.

Water can always be obtained at the back of the beach on the western side of the Lighthouse Hill.

Bay of Plenty.

(1.) A dangerous rocky patch, extending N.W. and S.E. about two hundred (200) feet, with about five (5) feet at low-water spring-tides, has been discovered off Motiti Island, in the fairway of vessels bound from the Eastward to Tauranga, when passing between Astrolabe Reef and Motiti.

The following are the bearings and distances:—
Mongonui Hill N. 60° 15' E., distant 9½ miles.

Northern point of Motiti N. 78° 30' W., distant 2½ miles.

(2.) A dangerous sunken patch, bearing from the Schooner Rock about N. by E. ¼ E., distant about ¾ of a mile, has been seen breaking.

Mariners are therefore cautioned against passing within a mile of this rock on that line of bearing.

East Cape.

The following dangers have been discovered in or near the passage between East Cape and East Island (Whanga Okena):—

(1.) A sunken rock, with only sixteen (16) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island W. by N. ¼ N., distant five-sixths of a mile.

The extreme of Matakawa Point in conjunction with the extreme of Horoera Point leads on this rock.

(2.) A shoal patch, with twenty (20) feet of water, bearing from the northern extreme of East Island N.W. ¼ W., distant (2) two miles.

The extreme of Horoera Point in conjunction with Iron Point leads on to this danger.

The bearings are magnetic.

BY-LAW No. 54, TO ADOPT PARTS 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, AND 8, AND CLAUSES 2, 3, 4, AND 5 OF PART 9, OF THE TWELFTH SCHEDULE OF THE BOROUGH'S STATUTE, 33 VICTORIA No. 359.

By-law of the Council of the Borough of Ballarat made under the Borough's Statute.

IN pursuance of the 168th Section of and the twelfth Schedule to the Borough's Statute, the Council of the Borough of Ballarat ordain as follows, that is to say:—The whole of Part 1, Part 2, Part 4, Part 5, Part 6, Part 7, Part 8, and clauses 2, 3, 4, and 5 of Part 9, of the Twelfth Schedule to the Act, are hereby adopted in and for the said borough. The following by-laws heretofore existing are repealed, that is to say:—

No. 5. A by-law to provide for the cleansing of footways and water-channels.

No. 6. A by-law to prevent the nuisance arising from suffering cattle to be at large in the streets and other unenclosed places within the Municipal District of Ballarat.

No. 8. A by-law to provide for the formation of crossings over footways.

No. 9. A by-law for regulating and licensing persons to slaughter certain animals within the municipality of Ballarat, under certain restrictions.

No. 10. A by-law to provide for the more certain protection of the roads and footpaths within the boundaries of the municipality.

No. 13. A by-law to prevent fires in chimney flues, and to cause water drawers to give prompt aid at fires.

No. 15. A by-law for the better prevention of fires and to guard against accidents from the improper or careless use of fires in open or public places within the township of Ballarat.

No. 16. A by-law to prevent the nuisance arising from exposing goods for sale and blocking up the footpaths on the township of Ballarat.

No. 18. A by-law for conducting of public meetings of the ratepayers and of election of members of council, and also for regulating the proceedings at the election of chairman.

No. 19B. A by-law to regulate the driving of cattle into or through the township of Ballarat.

No. 21. A by-law for the regulation and management of the Ballarat botanical gardens.

No. 23. A by-law to compel observance to be paid to the surveyed line of streets in the future erection of buildings, and fences and tents now standing in any way of the streets.

No. 25. A by-law to extend the provisions of the by-law No. 15 of the Municipal Council of Ballarat.
