PETITION FOR A NEW BOROUGH.

KOROIT.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Boroughs Statute*, section 23, that a petition has been presented to the Governor, signed by two hundred and twenty-one inhabitant householders of Koroit, in the shire of Belfast, praying His Excellency to constitute their locality, whereof the boundaries are hereinafter set forth, a Borough.

The boundaries of the proposed Borough are described in the petition as follows, viz.:- Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 41 in the parish of Yangery; thence, north by the Burrell's Flat road to the north-east angle of allotment 15 in the parish of Yarrturk; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 33 in the aforesaid parish of Yarrturk; thence south by the Ararat road to the north-east angle of allotment 13 in the parish of Warrong; thence west by the northern boundary of allotment 13 to the Nine-mile Creek road; and thence by the northern and western boundaries of allotment 12 in the said

parish to the parish boundary road; thence by the parish road due west to Laidlaw's lane; thence south by the said lane to the south-west angle of allotment 19 in the parish of Koroit; thence due east to the south-east angle of the said allotment; thence south by parts of allotments 20 and 23 in the parish of Koroit to the dividing fence between Atkinson's and Macartney's farms; thence by the said dividing fence to the Belfast road; thence southerly by the said road to the south-west angle of allotment 33 in Laborer's Village; thence to the waters of Tower Hill Lake by a line bearing south 65° east; thence by the northern and eastern margin of the said lake to a point bearing south 82° 8' west about eight chains from the north-west angle of allotment 16, section 42, parish of Yangery; thence to the said angle of the said allotment; thence by the western boundary of the said allotment, being a line bearing south 37° 30' west four chains eighty links, and south 33° 15' west ten chains ten links to the Warrnambool and Belfast road; and thence easterly by the said road to the point of commencement."

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election or general election or first appointment of councillors, whether under *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863* hereby repealed or this Act, for any single borough, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-third of the number of burgesses on the burgess roll in such borough, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the borough into three separate wards, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time subject to the like conditions alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of burgesses on the burgess roll in the borough of Hotham praying that the said borough may be divided into three wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of Hotham into three separate wards, by the names and with the boundaries hereby assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:-

EASTERN WARD.—Commencing at a point formed by the junction of the prolongation of a line passing along the centre of Villiers street with a line passing along the centre of the Flemington road; thence by the first-named line bearing south-westerly to a line passing along the centre of Leveson street; thence by that line bearing south to a line passing along the centre of Victoria street; thence by that line bearing east to a line passing along the centre of Elizabeth street; thence by that line bearing north-westerly to a line passing along the centre of the Flemington road aforesaid; and thence by that line bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.

MIDDLE WARD.—Commencing at a point formed by the intersection of a line passing along the centre of Victoria street by a line passing along the centre of Abbotsford street; thence by the last-named line bearing north to a line passing along the centre of the Flemington road; thence by that line bearing south-easterly to a point on the prolongation of a line passing along the centre of Villiers street; thence by that line bearing south-westerly to a line passing along the centre of Leveson street; thence by that line bearing south to a line passing along the centre of Victoria street; and thence by that line bearing west through the Benevolent Asylum reserve to the point of commencement.

WESTERN WARD.—Commencing at a point formed by the intersection of a line passing along the centre of Victoria street by a line passing along the centre of Abbotsford street; thence by the first-named line and a prolongation thereof bearing west to the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River Railway; thence by a line bearing westerly and northerly along the boundary fence of the said railway until it is intersected by the Moonee Ponds Creek; thence by a line bearing northerly along the centre of the Moonee Ponds Creek to the centre of the Flemington road; thence by a line passing along the centre of that road bearing south-easterly to a point on the prolongation of a line passing along the centre of Abbotsford street aforesaid; and thence by that line bearing south to the commencement point.

CUTTING OR REMOVING PINE TREES ON CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove Pine Trees on or from the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined, that is to say:—Commencing on the Ovens River, at Wangaratta; thence by the Sydney road to Benalla; thence by the Broken River to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence by the Goulburn to its junction with the Murray River; thence by the Murray River to the junction of the Murray and Ovens Rivers; and thence by the latter river to the starting point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

MINING ON EXCEPTED LANDS AT WOORAGEE AUTHORIZED.

THE Governor in Council has authorized Thomas White and party to occupy for mining purposes under their miners' rights that portion of the police paddock at Wooragee, in the mining district of Beechworth, particularly described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the conditions following:—

1. Substantial fencing, sufficient to prevent the Government stock in the paddock from straying into the excavations, shall be erected by the said Thomas White and party.
 2. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any officer acting under the instructions of the Minister of Mines; and shall be conducted in such a manner as not to interfere (except as herein provided) with the purposes to which the paddock is applied.
 3. On ceasing to mine, the said Thomas White and party shall fill up all shafts and other excavations made by them, remove all heaps of debris, clay, and gravel, and leave the surface of the ground in as good a condition as before the commencement of mining operations thereon.
 4. Previous to commencing work, the said Thomas White and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster, Beechworth, the sum of Five pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, and this sum shall be held by the Receiver and Paymaster until the said Thomas White and party shall cease to occupy the said land. If the conditions be fulfilled, then, and in such case, the whole sum shall be returned to the depositors; but if any of the conditions be not fulfilled, the whole of the said sum shall be forfeited, and the cost of repairing any damage done to the paddock shall be defrayed out of the moneys so forfeited.
- In case the said Thomas White and party shall in any way violate the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for them any longer to occupy the said land under the authority of this Order.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MURCHISON GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is open.

2nd. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission to and for the separate use of such person or persons or his or their representatives.

3rd. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5th. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper or at the office of the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous day.

6th. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7th. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10th. The position of all graves to be determined by the trustees.

11th. All graves must be sunk to a depth of not less than 7 feet.

12th. A drawing of every stone, font, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13th. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office of the trustees, and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

14th. The keeper has orders to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or other erections, or otherwise infringing the Act of Council relating to the cemetery, or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such person will be proceeded against according to law.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
