TIMBER RESERVE ON PHILLIP ISLAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Boltedford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:-

Six hundred acres two roods thirty-seven perches, county of Mornington, Phillip Island: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 97; bounded thence by a road bearing south seventy chains twenty-seven links; thence by allotments 107 and 108, bearing east fifty chains; thence by a road bearing north thirty chains; thence by a line and by allotments 111 and 113 bearing east fifty-four chains sixty-four links; thence by allotment 114 bearing N. 51° 17' E. twenty chains twenty-seven links; thence by a road bearing north twenty-nine chains forty-one links to the road from Rhyll to Ventnor; and thence by that road bearing west twenty-one chains, S. 65° 48' W. nineteen chains fifty links, S. 88° 56' W. thirty-one chains sixty-six links, N. 71° W. fifteen chains twenty-nine links, north-westerly ten chains seventy-four links, in an arc of a circle whose radius is thirty-two chains thirty-nine links, and whose centre lies southerly of the said arc; and thence west twenty-five chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.-(70.Y.12005.)

THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of January 1863, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Bungaree Road District:" And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the said road district a portion of the colony lying north-east of it and adjoining thereto, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the said Bungaree Road District a portion of the colony adjoining thereto (such portion not lying within the city or town above-mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and to re-define the said road district added to as aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the centre of the Creswick Creek Road where it is intersected by the northern boundaries of the Ballarat municipalities; thence northwardly by the centre line of that road to a point opposite the north-east angle of portion 63, parish of Ballarat; thence by a direct line east to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by a direct line to the northern boundary of the county of Grant; thence northwardly and eastwardly by the said boundary of the county of Grant to a point due north of the south-east angle of the parish of Warrenheip; thence by a direct line south to the centre line of the Melbourne to Ballarat (north) road; thence westwardly by the centre of the said road to the east boundary of the municipality of Ballarat East; thence north by the east boundary and west by the north boundary of said municipality to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 22nd day of April 1870, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the 32nd and 33rd years of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

No. 338.—An Act to amend the "*Coroners Statute 1865*." [Assented to 19th August 1869.]

No. 339.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine. [Assented to 19th August 1869.]

No. 340.—An Act to sanction the issue and expenditure of certain sums from "The Public Works Loan Account" for Salaries Wages and Contingencies for the service of the years One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight and One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine. [Assented to 31st August 1869.]

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.93 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths in May were fewer by 50 than those in April; they exceeded by 5 the average of May during the previous ten years, but would be much below that average if allowance were made for the increase of population during the period.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 68.7° on the 5th, and the lowest was 33.7° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (51.3°) was two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer on any one day (31.6°) took place on the 3rd, viz.:—from a maximum of 67.7° to a minimum of 36.1°. The least range (7.8°) was on the 13th, viz.:—from a maximum of 58.9° to a minimum of 51.1°. The mean daily range was 17.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.039 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females. Thirty-eight per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 43 per cent. in May 1869, 45 per cent. in May 1868, 48 per cent. in May 1867, 47 per cent. in May 1866, 56 per cent. in May 1865, 58 per cent. in May 1864, 62 per cent. in May 1863, 54 per cent. in May 1862, 53 per cent. in May 1861, and 56 per cent. in May 1860.

Seven persons of 75 years of age or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A gentleman, aged 75, a gardener aged 77, an hotelkeeper aged 80, a tinsmith aged 81, and a female aged 82, of natural decay; a female aged 80 and a female aged 81 of bronchitis.

Seventeen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which 13 were attributed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A female child aged 1½ died of injuries resulting from being knocked down by a dray; a boy aged 4 was killed by being passed over by a dray; a boy aged 7 died of injuries from a horse; a plasterer aged 41 of a fall from a scaffold; a dealer aged 60 of a fractured spine caused by falling from a dray; a brickmaker aged 65 of a fall from a dray; a stonemason aged 70 of a broken leg; a female infant aged 7 weeks of burns caused by its mother, when drunk, letting it fall into the fire; a male aged 35 of burns; a male aged 37 of drowning (cause unknown); an infant aged two days of suffocation by overlying; a boy aged 1½ years of suffocation by a nail getting into the windpipe; an engine-driver aged 57 of suffocation by food; a publican aged 38 of a gunshot wound inflicted by a journalist (verdict, "wilful murder"); a mariner aged 32 committed suicide by hanging; a plasterer aged 36 committed suicide by cutting his throat; and a chemist aged 41 committed suicide by poisoning himself with prussic acid.

Sixty-five deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 123, of which 68, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 60, or about 47 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 88 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 210, of which 114, or about 54 per cent., were males, and 96, or nearly 46 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 23 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 17 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 5 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were eighty and upwards.

Deaths from zymotic diseases fell off from 119 in April to 63, and were neither so numerous as those from local nor as those from developmental diseases. The most notable diminution under the zymotic head was in deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 20 deaths only in May, against 56 in April; also in those from typhoid and infantile fever, which caused 22 deaths, against 32. Deaths from diphtheria, on the other hand, increased from 6 in April to 7 in May.

WARANGA SHIRE COUNCIL.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

BYE-LAWS of the Waranga Shire Council made, under section 187 of *The Shires Statute*, for the purpose of providing for the due management of the affairs and proceedings of the council.

In pursuance of section 187 of *The Shires Statute*, the Council of the Shire of Waranga ordains as follows:—

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

No. 1. That the sittings of this council shall on all ordinary occasions be open to the public, but a majority of the council may require the exclusion of strangers while the sense of the council is taken whether the question shall be discussed with closed doors.

No. 2. The ordinary monthly meeting shall be held on the first Tuesday in every month at 11 o'clock a.m., and at all meetings of the council business shall commence as soon as a legal quorum is present after the time appointed for holding such meeting; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour, such circumstance shall be noted, with the names of the members present, in the minute book, and the secretary shall adjourn the meeting for three days.

No. 3. The first business at each meeting of the council shall be to confirm the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to the accuracy thereof.

No. 4. That after the confirmation of the minutes the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable:—

- 1st. Reading copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
- 2nd. Reading letters and accounts received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- 3rd. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- 4th. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
- 5th. Reading and ordering on reports of select committees.
- 6th. Reading and ordering on reports of deputations.
- 7th. Special payments.
- 8th. Orders of the day, including subjects arising from proceedings of former meetings.
- 9th. Any other matters not heretofore classified.
- 10th. Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- 11th. Notices of motion.

No. 5. All communications to the council must be in writing, addressed to the president.

No. 6. No motion shall be decided on at any meeting of the council unless notice in writing, signed by the councillor proposing, shall have been given at the previous meeting of the council.

No. 7. No notice entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice shall be present, or some one authorised by him, when the business is called on in order.

No. 8. All business shall be considered in the order in which notice thereof is given.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

1st. Any member upon proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, shall rise and address the chairman; and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down. The member calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business is entered upon.

2nd. Any councillor rising to propose an amendment, or to make any proposition to the council, must state the nature of the same before addressing the council in support thereof, and any member may withdraw a resolution proposed by him previous to its being put to the vote.

3rd. No proposition shall be entertained unless in writing, and, when seconded, handed to the secretary.

4th. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.

5th. If more than one councillor rise at the same time, the chairman for the time being shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

6th. No councillor shall speak twice on the same question, unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply, as the mover of an original motion, or upon any amendment after explanation or reply, the question shall be put to the vote.

7th. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute motives; and all personal reflections shall be considered highly disorderly.

8th. The presiding chairman's decision shall be final on all questions of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

9th. Any councillor who shall use expressions capable of being offensively applied to any other councillor, shall, if required by the council, withdraw such expressions, and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

10th. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular expressions immediately on their being used.

11th. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any documents of the council bearing on the question under consideration.

12th. One amendment shall be discussed at one time, and if lost another may be moved before the original question shall be put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

13th. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

14th. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, but if the question be decided in the negative, the next motion or order of the day shall be considered before the question of adjournment shall be again entertained.

15th. Any councillor may record his protest against any decision of the council, provided that the same be made before the next meeting of the council, in writing; notice of such intention, however, must be given on the adoption of the resolution.

16th. The chairman of the council, when appointed on committee, shall be the chairman thereof, and the standing orders of the council shall be observed on all committees, except as to the number of times limited for speaking or rising to address the chair.

17th. The secretary of the council shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature.

18th. All contracts exceeding £10 shall be made by tender, advertised not less than twice in the local or other papers; each tender to be addressed to the president, and such tender only to be opened at the time of their consideration by the council, when the tenderers may be present; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered on the minutes council; and when tenders are accepted a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor, president, and two councillors, the seal of the council being attached thereto.
