PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

BONANG GOLDFIELD COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BONANG GOLDFIELD COMMON (NORTH GIPPSLAND).—Two thousand four hundred acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing on the Bonang River, North Gippsland, at the point where the south boundary of the land licensed under the 39th section of the *The Amending Land Act 1865*, to R. Marriott, abuts thereon; thence by that land bearing west one mile; thence by lines bearing respectively, south one mile and a half, east two miles and a half, north one mile and a half, and west one mile and a half, to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(69.S.26443.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby direct that my Proclamation bearing date the seventh day of March 1870, whereby it is declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any Murray Pine within a distance of ten miles of the Murray River, shall extend to prohibit the cutting or removing any Murray Pine on Crown Lands within a distance of ten miles of the said Murray River, not further down that river than the point of its junction with the Loddon River.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 180,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.71 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths in June were fewer by 15 than those in May; they were however, in excess of the number which took place in any month of June during the previous ten years except 1866, and exceeded by 47 the average of the whole period.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.8° on the 5th and 26th, and the lowest was 29.6° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (50.3°) was four-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.4°) took place on the 15th, viz.:—from a maximum of 54° to a minimum of 29.6°. The least range (3.6°) was on the 1st, viz.:—from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 53.6°. The mean daily range was 12.18°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.916 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the total mortality. Children who had not attained their fifth year contributed 37 per cent., against 40 per cent. in June 1869, 45 per cent. in June 1868, 51 per cent. in June 1867, 41 per

cent. in June 1866, 48 per cent. in June, 1865, 45 per cent. in June 1864, 31 per cent. in June 1863, 43 per cent. in June 1862, 51 per cent. in June 1861, and 49 per cent. in June 1860.

Five males of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—Three aged respectively 75, 76, and 77 of old age, one aged 75 of disease of the liver, and one aged 82 of bronchitis.

Fifteen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A boy aged 7 was killed by a kick from a horse; a carter aged 26 died of a fractured leg; a civil servant aged 39 died of a fall from a horse; a mining agent aged 40 was killed by a train; a farmer aged 65 died of injuries to the head caused by collision with a baker's cart; a female infant aged 1 year died of scalds; a woman aged 55 died of burns; a dairyman aged 40 was drowned whilst drunk; a male aged 34, a male aged 59, and a barrister aged 63 were found drowned; a female infant aged 2 months was suffocated in bed; a fisherman aged 37 poisoned himself with strychnine; an author aged 37 and a gentleman aged 47 shot themselves whilst of unsound mind.

Seventy-two deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Asylum at Carlton, 4 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the prison at Pentridge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 119, of which 60, or nearly 51 per cent., were of males, and 59, or about 49 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 75 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two years, 13 were between two and three years, 3 were between three and four years, and 4 were between four and five years.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 204, of which 113, or nearly 58 per cent., were males, and 16, or about 42 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 2 between ten and fifteen, 10 between fifteen and twenty, 14 between twenty and twenty-five, 18 between twenty-five and thirty, 19 between thirty and thirty-five, 24 between thirty-five and forty, 26 between forty and forty-five, 19 between forty-five and fifty, 14 between fifty and fifty-five, 20 between fifty-five and sixty, 10 between sixty and sixty-five, 5 between sixty-five and seventy, 6 between seventy and seventy-five, 4 between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 aged eighty-two.

The bye-law numbered 7, intituled a bye-law for regulating the driving of unbroken horses and cattle through and out of the municipal district of Ballarat East and for preventing the breaking-in of horses in any of the surveyed streets thereof.

The bye-law numbered 8, intituled a bye-law for regulating the formation of crossing-places over footpaths for wheeled vehicles and for protecting the footpaths and water-channels within the municipal district of Ballarat East.

The bye-law numbered 9, intituled a bye-law to compel owners and occupiers to keep the water-channels and footpaths and rights-of-way bounding their premises free from sweepings, rubbish, offal, or any offensive matter.

The bye-law numbered 11, intituled a bye-law for securing the necessary supply of water to this district for domestic, sanitary, and irrigation purposes.

The bye-law numbered 18, intituled a bye-law for prevention and extinguishing of fires.

The bye-law numbered 19, intituled a bye-law for the regulation of shades and awnings over or across the public footpaths within the municipal district of Ballarat East.

The bye-law numbered 20, intituled a bye-law to compel observance to be paid to the surveyed line of street in the future erection of buildings and fences, also to provide for the removal of buildings and fences now standing in any way on the streets.

The bye-law numbered 27, intituled a bye-law for the protection of the streets, footpaths, roads, rights-of-way, and reserves within the municipal district of Ballarat East.


