PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed: and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notices have been duly published and all objections respecting the commons hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite or proclaim (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BANNOCKBURN TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The Lethbridge Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 22nd day of July 1861, and the 18th day of February 1867; the Murghebuluc Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 15th day of July 1861, and the Wabdallah and Bannockburn Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 21st day of December 1863, are hereby united and proclaimed under the designation of the Bannockburn Town and Farmers' Common.—(70.V.16055.)

TOOLIROOK TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands in the village of Toolirook are hereby proclaimed and shall be and constitute a common for the use of all householders of the said village. Area, about 450 acres.—(70.Z.15959.)

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the preparation of the Rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the several divisions of the Provinces and Districts set forth in the third column of the schedule hereto annexed has been impeded by reason of the non-receipt by the Electoral registrars of the Lists of Ratepayers within the time fixed by the Acts Nos 279 and 334 respectively from the several officers named in the first column of the same schedule, but such lists have since been received by the registrars aforesaid, and the names appearing thereon are included in the rolls for their respective divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by

virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth declare that the rolls of rate-paying electors for the divisions of the provinces and districts hereunder mentioned, containing the lists of names so omitted to be sent as aforesaid, are valid, viz.:—

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them on application, on the bond and contract being completed.
