ARTILLERY CORPS.

EVERY person desirous of being registered as a Candidate for enrolment in the Artillery Corps, with the view of obtaining subsequent employment in the Police, Penal, or Gaol Departments, must present personally a written application for enrolment, at the Victoria Barracks, in the St. Kilda road.

Such applications must be in the handwriting of the applicant, and will be receivable between the hours of 10 and 11 a.m. on the Tuesday in each week, when the applicant, if considered suitable, will be examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the purpose.

As no exceptions will be made to the rule above set forth, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than as above prescribed.

Candidates will not be appointed if over the age of thirty; they must be at least five feet nine inches in height, smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect, for the ascertaining of which they will undergo a strict medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other force or Government department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

TIMBER RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF KIRKELLA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

One thousand six hundred and fourteen acres three roods twenty-one perches, county unnamed, parish of Kirkella: Comprising allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 23, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, and 39: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 32, being a point on the northern side of the road from Glenorchy to Crowlands; thence by a road bearing north one hundred and one chains fifty links; thence by a road bearing east one hundred and fifty-nine chains; thence by a road bearing south one hundred and one chains sixty-three links, to the first-named road; and thence by that road bearing N. 59° 57' W. one hundred and fifty-nine chains to the point of commencement.—(70. W. 13816.)

REGULATIONS—VOLUNTEER STATUTE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations being substituted for those numbered 57 to 69, issued under the Volunteer Statute (by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council) on the 25th March 1866, and also of the cancellation of the Regulations numbered 70 and 71 issued under the same date and order.

STAFF.

Power to the Governor in Council to form a Staff.

57. His Excellency the Governor in Council will from time to time constitute for the Volunteer Force a staff, consisting of officers and non-commissioned officers and privates, engaged and attested according to regulations under this Act.

58. For the purposes of this Act, all such officers and non-commissioned officers and privates shall be deemed officers and non-commissioned officers and privates of the force in general, or of any corps to which such officers and non-commissioned officers and privates may be attached.

Rank and Position of Staff Officers.

59. Staff officers are not allowed to hold commissions in unpaid corps as field officer, captain, or subaltern.

60. Except for the purpose of instruction, no staff officer is entitled, by virtue of his superior rank, to take the command of any single corps of Volunteers; but this rule is not to apply to cases where different arms are brought together, or to such cases as the officer commanding the force may otherwise direct.

LOCAL STAFF CORPS.

61. The appointment, promotion, and discharge of non-commissioned officers and privates in the above corps rests with the officer commanding the force, and all persons of the above corps serving for pay with the Volunteer Force shall take the oath of allegiance and subscribe to a declaration of voluntary service, and be subject to all regulations for the discipline of the force.

62. Instructors of the rank of non-commissioned officers rank with volunteer non-commissioned officers in the different grades, according to the date in their appointment in the force, but are not to take command of any portion of the force except for purposes of instruction; such orders as they may convey when attached to corps will always be by direction of the senior officer present with the corps.

63. The principal duty of a non-commissioned instructor is to attend to the drill and instruction and returns of the corps to which he is posted; but he may also, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be intrusted with the custody of the arms of the corps, or charged with such other military duties as usually devolve on a non-commissioned officer.

64. An instructor is not to be employed in holding or disbursing the funds of the corps to which he is attached.

65. In the event of a non-commissioned officer or private of the staff attached to a corps being guilty of any offence of a grave nature, the officer commanding the corps will report the circumstances forthwith to head-quarters, and will place the non-commissioned officer or private in arrest, and await orders as to his disposal.

66. All non-commissioned officers and privates of the staff attached to corps are to be considered as under the supervision of the officer commanding the corps, and any irregularity of conduct, incompetence, or want of attention which such commanding officer may observe on the part of such non-commissioned officer or private shall be reported by him to head-quarters without delay.

67. When non-commissioned officers or privates attached to corps are guilty of any misconduct when employed on general staff duty, or when temporarily removed from their corps, such case will be dealt with at head-quarters, and all such cases and the manner in which they have been dealt with are to be communicated to the officer commanding the corps to which the non-commissioned officer or private is attached.

68. A record will be kept at head-quarters of all offences proved against non-commissioned officers and privates of the staff, together with the decision arrived at on such cases.

69. The officer commanding the force is authorized to place any non-commissioned officer or private under stoppages of pay for any offence, irregularity of conduct, or want of attention on duty, such stoppages not to exceed one week's pay; and no non-commissioned officer or private shall receive more than half his pay during the time he shall have been under arrest or suspended from duty for any offence which shall have been proved against him.

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power in him vested by the Act called *The Neglected and Criminal Children's Act 1864*, has established, for the purposes of the said Act, two Industrial Schools at and upon the premises called and known as "The Victoria Military Barracks," situated on the St. Kilda road near the City of Melbourne, one of such schools to be occupied by and used for males exclusively, and the other of such schools to be occupied by and used for females exclusively.

REGULATION.

RULES FOR THE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of reserves: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, has made the following Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of the reserve for Zoological purposes known as the Royal Park:—

1. The gates of the park shall be open from sunrise to sunset.
2. Persons driving in carts or vehicles plying for hire or used for purposes of trade shall in no case be permitted to use any of the roads of the park as a thoroughfare.

3. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways, and each shall keep his own side of the road, as on public roads.

4. Persons shall not enter the park for the purpose of breaking-in horses, or training or exercising horses; nor shall any person be permitted to jump horses over any of the fences; and no person will be allowed to drive cattle or sheep through the park.

5. Persons shall not climb any of the fences, nor damage the fences or trees, nor take or remove any wood, gravel, stone, or earth from the park.

6. Persons shall not be permitted to bring dogs into the park, nor shall any person discharge firearms, throw stones, or use any projectile whatever, nor molest any of the animals, or kindle any fire in the park.

7. No meeting or assemblage of people of any kind, or for any purpose, will be allowed in the park without the special sanction of the trustees.

8. In no sports of any kind or under any other circumstances will persons be allowed to appear in the park, except in ordinary and decent costume.

9. Persons shall not leave empty bottles, or broken glass, or crockery, or paper, or other litter in the park.

10. Persons shall not (unless and until they have obtained permission from the trustees) sell or offer for sale any article of merchandise or trade within the boundaries of the park.

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11. Any person offending against any of the above rules will be dealt with under the 108th section of the *Land Act of 1869*, and all employees in the park are hereby required to give information to the Crown Lands Bailiff of the park, should any person offend against any of these regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY GARDEN.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, has made the following Regulations to be enforced in the Treasury Garden:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The paths in this garden shall be open to the public from 6 a.m. until 8 p.m. on working days, and from 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Sundays.

2. All persons frequenting this garden shall be restricted to the paths, and shall not walk on the grass.

3. No person shall be allowed to bring into this garden any dog, unless the same be duly registered and be led by a chain or cord.

4. Children under (10) ten years of age shall not be allowed therein unaccompanied by friends or nurses.

5. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, or birds, or fish in this garden, or throw stones, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.

6. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences in or around this garden, or to stick bills on those fences or gates, or to cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or to write thereon.

7. No person shall be allowed in this garden to offer for sale any article.

Offenders against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulation, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable to desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
