Rottneet Island.

THE following information on the navigation of the approaches to the Swan River, Western Australia, is from the Remark book of Staff Commander William H. Bradley, of H.M.S. *Galatea*, 1869.*

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° 30' westerly in 1870.]

The pilots report Roe reef, with a depth of 24 feet, to extend farther to the westward than shown on the charts.†

A 16-foot patch is also reported to exist on the northern extreme of the bank outside the Transit rocks, Bare hill well open northward of Rope-yarn rock (the rock west of Duck rock) W. by S. ½ S. is the mark given to clear it.

A 19-foot rock is said to have been found on the tail of the bank that extends E.S.E. from Phillip point. A vessel coming in from the southward may pass between it and the Pilot Reef by keeping the knob of Parker point touching the south end of Direction island until the pilot house on Bathurst point is open northward of Phillip beacon, when she may haul to the north-east until the Winding-sheet (a bare sand-patch on the mainland) bears E. ½ S. and then steer in for it. These directions lead over the bank in not less than 5 fathoms, and clear some patches of 21 feet which lie to the eastward of the 19-foot rock.

Another bank, with 15 feet water extending north and south one-third of a mile long, is reported to lie W. by N., about 1½ miles distant from the Winding-sheet sand-patch.

The Challenger pass, between Garden and Carnac islands, is not recommended for any class of vessels.

The Success beacon has been removed from the southern edge of the Success bank.

RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE
ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of October 1870.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of September 1868, the Shire of Bairnsdale was divided into Ridings: And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Order in Council and again to divide the said shire into Ridings: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the said Shire of Bairnsdale, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order rescind the Order in Council of the 28th day of September 1868 hereinbefore mentioned, and doth hereby divide anew the said Shire of Bairnsdale into Three Ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING.—Starting at Lake Victoria up Tom's Creek and by the northern boundaries of Meerlieu, Yeering, and Stratford parishes, and western and part of the northern boundary of Sandy Creek run, and by the western boundaries of Glenadale and Labberalera, and by Mitchell River to the western boundary of the parish of Bairnsdale, south by that line sixty chains; thence east to the Mitchell River, and down that river and by the shores of Lakes King and Victoria to the starting point.

THE CENTRAL RIDING.—Starting on Mitchell River at the western boundary of the parish of Bairnsdale; thence sixty chains south along this boundary east to the Mitchell River; down this river, the shore of Lake King, to the Nicholson River; up this river to its source by the nearest range to the junction of Mount Baldhead and Angora runs, the south-western and western boundaries of the latter run to the Main Dividing Range; by this range to Mount Biregun, west to the Dargo River; down this river and the Mitchell to the starting point.

THE EAST RIDING.—Starting at the mouth of the Nicholson River; thence up that river to its source, by the nearest range to the junction of Mount Baldhead and Angora runs, to the south-western and western boundaries of Angora run to

the Main Dividing Range; by this range to Mount Smythe; thence to Mount Featherston, the Great Bogong Range, to Mount Nelson; thence by the Big River Range to Mount Wills; thence to Mount Cooper, and a direct line to Mount Gibbo; thence north-east to the eastern boundary of the colony; along that boundary to the Snowy River; by this river to the Southern Ocean, and westward by the ocean and northern shore of Lake King to the starting point.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has, by Orders in Council, made on the 17th and 31st of October 1870, directed that the portion of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be a Clean District within the meaning of the said Act, such Orders to take effect on the first day of November 1870; and that thereupon the Order of 29th September last constituting a Clean District in the West Wimmera District (which is included in the above-mentioned district) be revoked.

BOUNDARIES OF THE NORTHERN CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point at which the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia strikes the River Murray; thence southerly along such boundary line to the south-west corner of the Doorong Creek run; thence along the southern boundary of that run to Roseath run; thence by the western boundary of that run south-easterly to Nangeela run, and by the western and southern boundary of that run eastward to the Glenelg River; thence by that river southerly to the junction of the Wannan River; thence by the Wannan

River easterly to the Murndal run; thence by the western northern, and eastern boundaries of that run again to the Wannan River; thence by that river easterly and northerly to the south-west corner of Kenilworth North run; thence by the western boundary of that run northwards to Glendinning run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to the River Glenelg, by that river northerly to Brim Spring run; thence by the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of that run to the south-west corner of Rosebrook run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to Ledcourt run; thence by the southern boundaries of Ledcourt, Newington, and Glenwillan runs to the south-east corner of the last; thence by the eastern boundary of Glenwillan northerly to Bolangum run; thence by the southern boundaries of Bolangum, Tottington, and Ramsbottom easterly to the south-west corner of Mount Teddington run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to Moyreisk run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run eastwards to the Avoca River; thence by that river northerly to the north-west corner of Natta Yallock run; thence by the northern boundary of that run easterly to Norwood run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run easterly and northerly to the Bet-bet Creek; thence along that creek northerly to the Loddon River, and by that river southerly to the south-west corner of Llanecoorie run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to Mount Alexander or Ravenswood run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to Axedale run, and by the southern boundary of that run to the Campaspe; thence along that river northerly to the Burnewang run; [thence easterly to the railway line and northerly along that line to the northern boundary of the Burnewang run; thence easterly along such boundary line to] Caragarang run, and by the southern boundary of that run to Wanaita run; thence by the west and south boundaries of that run to the south-west corner of Toolamba run, and by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence by that river northerly to the junction of the Broken River, and by that river easterly to the south-west corner of Benalla run; thence by the western boundary of that run northwards to Yabba-yabba run, and by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to Cobram run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run northwards to the River Murray and by that river westerly and northerly to the point of commencement. Provided always that when the courses of the Avoca River or the Campaspe River, as above described, intersect any station, such station shall be wholly and not in part excluded from the above declared Clean District, and that the run known as Narraport be also excluded from such district.

REGULATIONS FOR DIPPING SHEEP UNDER
"THE SCAB ACT 1870."

WHEREAS by section 36 of *The Scab Act 1870* it is enacted that every owner of infected sheep shall (under the penalty thereby provided), within fourteen days after he has become aware that such sheep are infected, dip them in a suitable manner and with approved medicaments, as provided by section 73 of the said Statute; and whereas by section 73 of the said Statute it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for prescribing the mode of dipping and the medicaments to be used for the same: Now the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the regulations following:—

1. *Mode of Dipping.*—Two immersions (in the medicaments specified by Regulation 2), with not less than seven nor more than fourteen days between each immersion. Each immersion to be for not less than one minute, and the neck and head of the sheep to be saturated on each immersion.

2. *Medicaments to be used for Dipping.*—The mixture commonly known as "Tobacco and sulphur sheep-dressing stuff," at a strength of not less than one pound of good manufactured tobacco and one pound of sulphur to five gallons of water; or the mixture commonly known as "Lime and sulphur sheep-dressing stuff," at a strength of not less than two and a quarter (2¼) ounces of good roche lime and two and a quarter (2¼) ounces of sulphur to one gallon of water. The mixture in either case to be at a temperature of not less than one hundred degrees Fahrenheit at the time of dipping therein.

No. 7. To prevent the nuisance of cattle being at large within the streets or public places.

No. 11. For conducting the elections for members of the council.

No. 15. For compelling the fencing-in of purchased lands abutting upon the public footpaths in the Municipal District of Carisbrook.

No. 23. To prevent the nuisance from goats being at large within the township of Carisbrook.

No. 33. To repeal so much of bye-law No. 1, intituled "A bye-law to regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the Council for the Municipal District of Carisbrook," as relates to the holding of the meetings of such council, and to make further provision in lieu thereof.
