## REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulation respecting Public Accounts, viz.:—That the Order in Council of 18th June 1866 forbidding officers in charge of departments and accountants from acting as agents for receipt of moneys due for services rendered to their respective departments, and the operation of which order was on the 16th March 1868 suspended until further notice, be again in force, subject to the following exceptions, viz.:—

1. The Police Department and the Deputy Postmaster-General to be exempted from the operation of the regulation.
2. The Accountant of the Law Department to be permitted to receive from the Treasury advances required by Clerks of Courts at places where no Receipt and Pay Offices exist.

## PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867": EXTENDED TO CERTAIN SHIRES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made; and whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended among others to the Epping Road District by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the eleventh day of November 1868; and to the Alexandra Road District, the Benalla Road District, the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District, the Woodstock Road District, and the Shire of Metcalfe by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869; and to the Borough of Taradale by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of January 1870: And whereas the Epping Road District, the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District, and the Woodstock Road District, now together form the Shire of Darebin; the Alexandra and Benalla Road Districts have been, respectively constituted the Shire of Alexandra and the Shire of Benalla; and the Borough of Taradale and Shire of Metcalfe now form the United Shire of Metcalfe: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamations bearing date respectively the eleventh day of November 1868, the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and the twenty-fifth day of January 1870; and do revoke so much and such parts thereof as extend Part II. of the recited Act to the Borough of Taradale, the Epping Road District, the Alexandra Road District, the Benalla Road District, the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District, the Woodstock Road District, and the Shire of Metcalfe; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective Shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Alexandra  
The Shire of Benalla  
The Shire of Darebin  
The United Shire of Metcalfe.

Parcels containing newspaper despatches will only be charged at one-half the above scale of rates, if the amount to be charged exceed 6d., and 6d. shall be the minimum charge for such parcels. Hat-boxes, empty, in nests, or containing hats, double rates. All parcels to be at the forwarding station fifteen minutes previous to the departure of the train for which they are intended.

The department will not be responsible for any damage accruing to parcels containing glass, when only packed in paper.

## CARRIAGES.

Carriages, gigs, dog-carts, and vehicles of a similar description will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case. Two vehicles belonging to the same owner, and loaded on one truck, 9d. per truck per mile. Three vehicles on same terms, 1s. per truck per mile, minimum, Twenty shillings. For vehicles sent for repair, return tickets available for four weeks will be issued at 50 per cent. additional on these rates.

## EXCESS LUGGAGE IN CHARGE OF PASSENGERS.
