THE TOWN OF FITZROY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359), it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be called such town or city accordingly; provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Fitzroy for the year from the first day of October 1869 to the thirtieth day of September 1870, both days inclusive, was not less than Ten thousand pounds: And whereas the boundaries of the said borough are amongst others described in the first schedule of the Act hereinbefore recited, and it is deemed expedient to proclaim the said borough to be a town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by this notice proclaim the Borough of Fitzroy to be a Town, by the name in and by the Order in Council made in this behalf assigned thereto, that is to say—

THE TOWN OF FITZROY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute* 1864, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or

licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough hereinafter mentioned as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine, that is to say:—

GLENTHOMPSON CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Glenthompson General Cemetery.

1. The cemetery shall be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.
2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
3. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
4. Orders of interments to be given at the office of the trustees; such notice to be given before the hour of Five p.m. the previous day.
5. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument to be made at the office of the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the cost and charges.
7. The trustees will cause common graves to be dug, but the parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
8. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
11. Every coffin in a vault or a brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered in to the satisfaction of the trustees.
12. A plan of every monument or tomb-stone proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission and prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.
13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchase and other graves, is kept at the office, and a register of all grants is kept by the secretary.
15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

HEATHCOTE HOSPITAL.

BYE-LAWS of the Heathcote Hospital, incorporated under 27 Vict. No. 22, for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions. Confirmed at a General Meeting of Contributors held 9th December 1870.

It was resolved that all existing general and bye laws be repealed.

GENERAL LAWS.

OBJECT.

That this institution shall be for the purpose of affording gratuitous medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring the same in the case of accident or disease.

Extracted from the Act of Incorporation.

1. (Sec. 4.)—The governing committee, in whom are vested all powers and authorities of this corporation, consists of the president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and twelve contributors, each of whom shall be a subscriber of not less than £1 sterling per annum.

2. (Sec. 7.)—The general committee shall direct the general business of the hospital, frame bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, and generally for all matters affecting the management of the institution, the same not being inconsistent with the laws of the colony.

3. (Sec. 11.)—The president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer, and one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall retire annually on the second Thursday in January, but may nevertheless be re-elected, and the members who go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election, or where two or more have been in office the same length of time, then those who go out of office shall be determined by lot.

4. (Sec. 12.)—If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provision of the Act are required to go out of office.

5. At the annual meeting of contributors, to be held on the second Thursday in January each year, an election shall be held for filling the vacancies in the committee, as also those of president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and two auditors being contributors.

BYE-LAWS.

GENERAL COMMITTEE.

1. The committee shall have power to enter into contracts for the supply of provisions, &c., &c., for the use of the hospital, authorize the payment of all just claims and accounts, appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution, fill all honorary vacancies and appoint all sub-committees, superintend and give the necessary instructions for the admission and discharge of patients in accordance with the regulations.

2. The committee shall meet on the second Tuesday in each month, at the committee-room at the hospital, for the purpose of general business, at such hour as may be from time to time determined on, five members being present to constitute a quorum, which so soon as it shall have been formed the chair shall be taken by the president, or in his absence by either of the vice-presidents or treasurer, or in their absence by a chairman appointed by a majority of the members present. But if no quorum shall be present within half an hour of the time named for such meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour, and so on from week to week until the next monthly meeting, when it shall be considered to have lapsed. Provided that this clause applies to all special meetings of the committee.

3. Any three members of the general committee, by writing under their hands, stating for what purpose, shall be at liberty to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of the committee, to be held within one week of the date of such notice. Two days' notice at least shall be given to each member by circular of the secretary, the object of such meeting being therein stated, and no other business beyond that indicated shall be transacted at such meeting.

4. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law or frame or alter any regulation, or to repeal any bye-law or regulation, shall be entertained, unless notice of the same shall have been given at the previous ordinary meeting of the committee; and no motion to alter a bye-law or to rescind a resolution shall be submitted within three months from the date of such resolution being passed, nor unless one month's notice of the same be given at an ordinary meeting, and then altered or rescinded only by an absolute majority of the elected committee.

5. At the first meeting of every quarter the committee shall appoint four of its members as a visiting committee for the ensuing three (3) months.

6. The committee shall, at the annual meeting of contributors, present a general report of the affairs of the hospital, with a full statement of receipts and disbursements duly audited for the preceding year ending 31st December.

7. At all meetings of the committee the votes shall be taken by show of hands, each member having one vote only, except the chairman, who, in addition, shall have a casting vote.

8. Any contractor or tenderer to the hospital, being a member of the committee, shall absent himself from its sittings whilst any subject relating to his contract or tender is under consideration.

9. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the office of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, or auditors, the secretary shall report the same at the next ordinary meeting of committee, who shall direct the secretary to summon a meeting of contributors for the election of a successor.

10. The president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and secretary shall be *ex-officio* members of all sub-committees.

CONTRIBUTORS.

11. Every benefactor of £10 and upwards and every yearly contributor of £1 and upwards shall and be alone regarded as contributors for the time being under the second section of the act of incorporation, and be eligible to be members of the general committee.

12. At all meetings of contributors every benefactor of £10 and every contributor of £1 per annum shall be entitled to one vote; every benefactor of £30 and every contributor of £3 per annum shall be entitled to two votes; and every benefactor of £50 and every contributor of £5 and upwards per annum shall be entitled to three votes: Provided that no such contributor shall be entitled to vote at any such meeting within (30) thirty days of the date of payment of such contribution, unless the same be a renewal of the subscription of the year preceding.

13. The current year shall, with respect to such benefactions and subscriptions, be reckoned from the date of payment.

14. Every corporate body, society, firm and partnership, becoming contributors, shall exercise their privilege through some one member of the same appointed by such body, society, or firm.

15. Benefactors and contributors shall, if the funds and accommodation of the hospital permit, be at liberty to recommend every current year free patients, as follows:—

For every donation of £10 or annual subscription of £1, two outdoor patients; for every additional donation of £10 or additional subscription of £1, one indoor and two outdoor patients.

16. It shall be competent, for the general committee, or any ten or more contributors, by writing under their hands stating for what purpose, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors to be held not less than (14) fourteen days from the receipt of such notice, the object of such meeting to be stated in such summons. And no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall be summoned.

17. All votes at annual or other meetings of contributors shall be taken by show of hands unless a ballot shall have been previously determined on by the majority of contributors present, in which case the vote or votes referred to shall be by ballot.

18. Every meeting of contributors shall be called by the secretary by advertisement in one or more of the newspapers published in the district at least one week previous to such meeting. And at all such meetings the president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents or the treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman from amongst the contributors present, who, in addition to his own, shall have a casting vote. And every question submitted to such meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of contributors present.

19. At all meetings of contributors, ten or more being present shall form a quorum, which so soon as it shall be formed the chair shall be taken; but if there be no quorum present within half

an hour of the time named for such meeting, the majority of the contributors present may adjourn such meeting to such time and place as they may think fit.

TREASURER.

20. The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same fortnightly in such a bank, to the credit of the hospital, as the committee may direct.

21. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by draft on the bank, countersigned by the president or a vice-president.

22. He shall keep proper accounts of all moneys received and paid, and report the same to the committee at each monthly meeting; and he shall issue certificates to contributors for the admission of patients.

23. He shall previous to each monthly meeting of the committee examine the collector's book-keep, and he shall lay before the contributors at the annual meeting a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past year.

COLLECTOR.

24. The collector shall canvass the district to obtain donations and contributions. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt. He shall hand over to the treasurer fortnightly all moneys received by him during the previous fortnight, and at the same time furnish the treasurer with a list of contributors and the respective sums paid by them; and he shall enter into a bond of £50 for the due fulfilment of his office.

AUDITORS.

25. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books, accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall certify to their correctness and report thereon to the annual general meeting.

SECRETARY.

26. The duties of the secretary are to keep proper minutes of all meetings and record them in a book for the purpose, to call meetings, to introduce and explain the business to be transacted, and to conduct and record all such correspondence as may be directed by the general committee, and to prepare, in conjunction with the treasurer and medical officer, the report for the annual meeting. The office of the secretary may become vacant in any of the ways to which the office of an ordinary member of the committee may become vacant. He shall be appointed annually by the general committee from one of their own body or otherwise, as they may think fit, at such remuneration as they may determine on.

27. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a strong box, "to be deposited at the bank where the hospital account is kept," with two locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the treasurer, the other by the secretary. The seal shall not be affixed to any deed, document, or instrument, except by order of the general committee.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

28. The visiting committee shall meet at the hospital every Tuesday at 4 p.m., three to form a quorum. They shall, on the day of the monthly meeting of the general committee, examine all accounts and certify to their correctness, and that the expenditure has been duly authorized.

29. They shall be authorized to suspend any paid officer or servant of the institution (except the medical officer) who may be considered by them to be guilty of neglect of duty or gross misconduct, and they shall provide a proper substitute until a special meeting of the general committee, which meeting shall be forthwith convened. They shall, at least once a week, visit the hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, inspecting the quality of the provisions, medical comforts, &c., supplied to the hospital; ascertaining that the patients are properly attended and cared for, and generally the management of the hospital, reporting the same for the information of the general committee.

MEDICAL OFFICER.

30. The medical officer shall admit all applicants who shall produce certificates from contributors, except as hereinafter provided, provided always there is sufficient accommodation, and he shall discharge all patients so soon as he considers they are fit to be discharged.

31. He shall superintend and control all servants in the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination shall forthwith report the same to the visiting committee. He shall supervise all matters requisite for the cleanliness, ventilation, and temperature of the hospital and wards. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and shall be answerable for the prompt and accurate dispensing of the medicines, &c., required.

32. He shall, at each monthly meeting of the committee, furnish a general report of the state of the hospital. At the end of every year he shall furnish the committee, to be brought before the annual meeting of contributors, with a detailed report of all cases which have been under treatment during the year, with the number of deaths with the causes thereof, and the number of patients admitted and remaining in the hospital, and generally all matters relating to his department.

PATIENTS.

33. Every person claiming the benefits of this hospital, either as an indoor or outdoor patient, must produce a recommendation from a contributor. Accidents and such cases of decided emergency as admit not of delay, shall be received at any time without a recommendation from a contributor.

34. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement—no child under six (6) years of age—no insane person or one having a contagious, infectious, or other disease, which in the opinion of the medical officer is unfit for an indoor patient—shall be

received under any circumstances, except with the express sanction of the majority of the committee.

35. In the absence of satisfactory reasons to the contrary being offered to the general committee, no person shall be allowed to remain in the hospital who, in the opinion of the medical officer, may receive equal benefit as an outdoor patient. Outdoor patients, on production of a certificate from a contributor, can obtain medical advice, &c., daily.

36. Every person obtaining the benefits of this institution will be compelled, so far as their circumstances will enable them, to pay towards the actual expense of their maintenance at the rate of thirty shillings per week; and all property found on the persons of deceased patients will be appropriated towards defraying the expenses of their burial and maintenance, the residue to be handed over to their legal representatives.

37. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such times as shall be appointed by the committee, and any minister may at the special request of a patient attend at any time.

For examining and comparing balances, beams, steelyards, and other weighing machines, including stamping when necessary—

For each balance not capable of weighing above 56 lbs. ...	6d.
For each balance capable of weighing above 56 lbs., and up to 6 cwt. ...	9d. per cwt.
Above 6 cwt. and under 10 cwt. ...	6d. per cwt.

The above fees apply to examinations and comparisons performed at the office of the inspector.

For examining and comparing any weighbridge on the premises of the owner, if within the boundary of the Borough of Stawell—

For each cwt. up to a ton ...	6d. per cwt.
For each additional cwt. over a ton ...	3d. per cwt.

For examining and comparing any weights or measures, or any balance, beam, steelyard, or other machine (except weighbridges within the Borough), including stamping when necessary, on the premises of the owner, provided the same be done at the request of such owner, the fees will be in accordance with the above scale of charges, with one-half additional added thereto; provided also that the premises of such owners are situated within a radius of one mile from the site of the Town Hall reserve, Stawell; if beyond that distance, mileage at the rate of one shilling and sixpence per mile shall be charged. Provided any two or more persons residing at a distance make application at the same time, requesting the services of the inspector, the mileage fee in such cases shall be fairly divided amongst those who make the application.
