A REPRESENTATION having been made to Her Majesty's Secretary of State on behalf of the present lessees of the Western Half of Starbuck Island, in the South Pacific Ocean, that certain persons are in unlawful occupation of a portion thereof, using even the houses, tramway, and plant erected and provided by the lessees, and appropriating the guano which had been collected and stored by them for future shipment: Notice is hereby publicly given that Mr. E. S. Houlder is the Crown Licensee of the Western half of this island, and that any one intruding thereon is a trespasser; and further, that if the trespass is committed by persons acting under the direction, or on the authority of the licensee of the Eastern portion, the license of that portion of the island will become subject to forfeiture.

RHYMNEY COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed: and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

RHYMNEY COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Rhydney common, viz: Commencing at the junction of the north side of the road which forms the north boundary of section 9, parish of Lexington, with the road from Moyston to Great Western; thence by the first-named road and a line bearing east two hundred and ninety chains, more or less, to the west boundary of the Ararat Gold-field Common; thence by the said boundary of that common bearing north two hundred and thirty-three chains, more or less; thence by the north boundary thereof bearing east thirty chains, more or less, to a range; thence by that range north-westerly to the road which forms the south boundary of section 2, Great Western; thence by that road bearing west twenty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of the land licensed to Thomas Johns; thence by that land bearing south twenty-four chains seventy-four links and west thirty-two chains twenty-six links; thence by a line bearing south-easterly twelve chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of the land licensed to James Hutton; thence by that land, by a line, by the land licensed to Samuel Young, and by a line bearing south two miles; thence by a line bearing south-easterly thirty-two chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of the land licensed to Ferdinand Weidemann; thence by that land easterly and south-easterly and by a line bearing south-easterly to a creek; thence by that creek downwards to a point bearing south from the east boundary of the land licensed to Martin Pola; thence by a line, of which the said boundary of that land forms part, bearing north thirty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of that land; thence by a line bearing northerly forty-three chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of the land licensed to Thomas Telfer; thence by that land and a line bearing west one hundred and fifty-three chains, more or less, to the road from Moyston to Stawell; thence by that road bearing S. 24° 30' E. thirty chains, more or less, to a point bearing east from the north-east angle of the land licensed to John C. WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four the Shire of Warrnambool was divided into three separate ridings the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the east riding of the Shire of Warrnambool therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Warrnambool described in such petition, from such Shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the central and west Ridings of the Shire of Mortlake: And the

Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said central and west Ridings of the Shire of Mortlake and of the east Riding of the said Shire of Warrnambool in manner following, that is to say:—

THE CENTRAL RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.—Commencing at a point in the centre of the road bounding the parish of Keilambete, on the south, opposite the south-west angle of said parish; thence east by said road to a point opposite the south-east angle of said parish of Keilambete; thence northerly and north by the east boundaries of said parish and the parishes of Kolora, Mortlake, Toorak, Ligar and Eilyar, and due north through the parish of Nerrin-nerrin to the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the north-east angle of the parish of Woorndoo; thence southerly by the Salt Creek to the south-west angle of the parish of Ligar; thence east to the north-west angle of the parish of Toorak; thence south by the western boundaries of the parishes of Toorak, Mortlake, Kolora, and Keilambete, to the point of commencement.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BAMBRA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or her representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission is to be made at the office of the secretary. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for the same, upon the payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the secretary on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug not less than five feet in depth, but persons requiring brick graves or vaults, must construct them under the direction of trustees, or of some person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto, must be given with the order.

6. The hour appointed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

7. The usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the remainder of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, graveboards, headstones, and fences, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or bricked grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. The cemetery will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
