## TRANSFER FEE UNDER § 42 OF "THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865."

IN pursuance of the provisions of the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869*, the Governor in Council has made the subjoined Regulation, viz.:-

The Fee to be charged for the Transfer of a License issued under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865* is hereby fixed at One pound (£1) for each License transferred. This Regulation is to take effect from and after the 16th day of November 1870.

## DIVIDING INTO COUNTIES TERRITORY NOT ALREADY INCLUDED IN ANY COUNTY AND ALTERING THE COUNTY OF BENDIGO.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS Viscount CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid. The Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bar, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to diminish or extend the area of any county or to alter the boundaries or name of any county, and to add the territory taken away from one county to any other adjacent county, and to divide any county into two or more counties and to give to each a distinguishing name: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand and seal of the Governor of New South Wales and its Dependencies, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, certain parts or portions of land in the said territory of New South Wales (including the Port Phillip or Southern District) were declared to have been admeasured and laid out as separate and distinct counties to be known or called by the names therein mentioned, with the boundaries and limits therein described; subject, nevertheless, to such more exact determination thereof, with reference to the natural features of the country as might thereafter be deemed expedient: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor of Victoria and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the territory therein described was included in a county which was distinguished by the name of

the county of Bendigo: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy, the counties of Talbot and Bendigo were altered: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seventy, a portion of the territory of Victoria was included in the county of Gladstone: And whereas it is expedient to divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and again to alter the boundaries of the county of Bendigo: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act hereinbefore recited, do by this my Proclamation define the boundaries of the counties into which I have divided the territory not already included in any county, and do distinguish each county by the name prefixed to the boundaries thereof; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do also alter the said county of Bendigo and do re-define the boundaries thereof, as hereinafter set forth, that is to say:-

**COUNTY OF BENAMERA.**—Commencing at the junction of the Mitta-mitta River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to Livingstone Creek; thence by that creek to its southernmost source; thence by the great Dividing Range north-easterly to the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales; thence by that line bearing north-westerly to the source of the Murray River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF BENDIGO.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon River bearing west from the centre of the road which forms the boundary between the parishes of Lamecoorie and Neereman; thence by a line passing through the centre of that road, being the boundary between the shires of Maldon and Marong, bearing east to the western boundary of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway; thence by that railway bearing south-easterly to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of the parish of Harcourt; thence by a line and the boundary between the shires of Maldon and Strathfieldsaye bearing east to Barker's Creek; thence by the boundary between the shires of Metcalfe and Strathfieldsaye, being the north boundary of the parish of Harcourt, bearing east to the south-east angle of the parish of Mandurang, the south-east boundary of that parish bearing north and east to the south-west angle of the parish of Sedgwick, the south boundary of that parish bearing easterly to the west boundary of the parish of Lyell, the said boundary of that parish bearing southerly to Myrtle Creek, that creek downwards to the Coliban River, and the centre of that river downwards to the Campaspe River; thence by the centre of that river downwards to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 25, parish of Millewa; thence by a line, by the road which forms the south boundary of the said allotment, and the road which forms the north boundaries of the parishes of Hamawm, Pannooamawm, Wanurp, Mitiamo, Hayanmi, Calivil, and Jarklan, bearing west to the Loddon River aforesaid; and thence by the centre of that river upwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF BOGONG.**—Commencing at the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to its source, near the Twins Mountains; thence by the Great Dividing Range bearing north-easterly and south-easterly to the southernmost source of Livingstone Creek; thence by that creek to the Mitta-mitta River; thence by that river downwards to the Murray River; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF BORUNG.**—Commencing at the source of Mount Cole Creek in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that creek to the Wimmera River; thence by that river downwards to the centre of the road which forms the boundary between the parishes of Glynwillm and Kirkella; thence by the centre of that road bearing true north to the Richardson River; thence by that river downwards to the Avon River; thence by that

river downwards to Lake Buloke; thence by the southern and eastern shores of that lake bearing easterly and northerly to a point bearing magnetic west from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Banyenong; thence by a line and the north boundary of that allotment bearing magnetic east to the 143rd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing north to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing west to the eastern shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by that lake bearing southerly to the Wimmera River; thence by that river upwards to Norton's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its most eastern source; thence by a line bearing true south to the Glenelg River; thence by that river upwards to a point bearing true west from the Mount William Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence by a line bearing true east to that station; thence by the Mount William Range bearing southerly and easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 90, parish of Nekeeya; thence by that allotment bearing S. 89° 58' E. six chains ten links, S. 74° 46' E. seventeen chains twenty-eight links, S. 86° 33' E. four chains thirty-eight links, N. 81° 33' E. four chains sixty-four links, S. 78° 48' E. three chains twenty-five links, N. 88° 9' E. four chains thirty-six links, N. 81° 15' E. two chains thirty-five links, and N. 63° E. forty-three chains twenty links; thence by a line, by allotment 81, by a line, and by allotment 80 bearing N. 63° E. 92 chains two links; thence by allotment 80 bearing east 80 chains; thence by a line and allotment 61 bearing N. 75° 58' E. eighty-two chains forty-eight links; thence by allotment 1 bearing N. 45° E. fifty-six chains fifty-seven links; thence by a line bearing east three chains to the north-west angle of allotment 2; thence by the south side of a road one chain wide bearing east four hundred and eighty-three chains, more or less, to the Great Dividing Range; and thence by that range to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF BULN-BULN.**—Commencing at the entrance of the La Trobe River into Lake Wellington; thence by the southern shore of that lake, by McLennan's Straits, and by the south-eastern shore of Lake Victoria to a point on a line passing through the Stockyard Hill Trigonometrical Survey Station, and bearing S. 45° E.; thence by that line to the Southern Ocean; thence by the Southern Ocean to Cape Patterson; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to the source of the Bunee River in the range which divides the waters of the Yarra-yarra River from the waters of the Bunee and La Trobe rivers; thence by that range being part of the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn easterly to the source of the Tanjil River; thence by that river to the La Trobe River; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement. Including the inlets, together with all islands off the sea-board of the county.

**COUNTY OF CROAJINGLONG.**—Commencing at Conference Point, Cape Howe; thence by the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, bearing north-westerly to the Snowy River; thence by that river downwards to the Southern Ocean; thence by the Southern Ocean to the point of commencement. Including the inlets, together with all islands off the seaboard of the county.

**COUNTY OF DARGO.**—Commencing at the mouth of the Tambo River; thence by that river to its western source near Mount Tambo; thence by the Great Dividing Range south-westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly to the source of the Wongungarra River; thence by that river to the Mitchell River downwards to Lake King; thence by the southern, western, and northern shores of Jones' Bay and the northern shore of Lake King to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF DELATITE.**—Commencing on Hughes' Creek, at the point where it is crossed by the centre of the North-Eastern Railway line; thence by the centre of that railway line north-easterly to the Owens River; thence by that river upwards to its source in the Great Dividing Range, near the Twins Mountains; thence by that range south-westerly and south-easterly to Mount Lowitt; thence by the range dividing the waters of the Howqua River from the waters of the King River, north-westerly to the source of the Delatite River; thence by that river to Branket Creek; thence by that creek to Merton Creek; thence by that creek to Menhau's Creek; thence by that creek to its source in the Strathbogie Range; thence by that range westerly to the source of Hughes' Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF GUNBOWER.**—Commencing at the Junction of the Loddon River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to the north side of the road which forms the north boundary of the parishes of Jarklan, Calvil, Hayanmi, Miliano, Wanurp, Pannocbamawm, and Bamawm; thence by the said side of that road and by the prolongation thereof through the parish of Millewa, bearing true east to the Campaspe River; thence by that river downwards to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF KARA-KARA.**—Commencing at the source of the Avoca River, at the junction of the range which divides that river from the sources of the Wimmera River with the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Avoca River downwards to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing west to the 143rd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing south to the north boundary of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Banyenong; thence by the said boundary of that allotment and a line bearing magnetic west to the eastern shore of Lake Buloke; thence by the eastern and southern shores of that lake bearing southerly and westerly to the Avon River; thence by that river upwards to the Richardson River; thence by that river upwards to the centre of the road which forms the boundary between the parishes of Callawadda and Wallaloo; thence by the centre of that road bearing true south to the

main stream of the Wimmera River which runs between allotments 16 and 91 in the parish Glynwilln; thence by that river upwards to Mount Cole Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Great Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF KARKAROC.**—Commencing on the Murray River at the point where it is intersected by the 142nd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing south to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing east to the 143rd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing north to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF LOWAN.**—Commencing at the point where the Mosquito Creek is intersected by the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia; thence by that line bearing north to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing east to the western shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by the western, northern, and eastern shores of that lake northerly, easterly, and southerly to the Wimmera River; thence by that river upwards to Norton's Creek; thence by that creek to its most eastern source; thence by a line bearing south to the Glenelg River; thence by that river downwards to Power's Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a line bearing westerly to the source of Mosquito Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF MILLEWA.**—Commencing on the Murray River at the point where the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia abuts thereon; thence by that line bearing south to the 35th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing east to the 142nd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing north to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF MOIRA.**—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to Hughes' Creek; thence by that creek to the centre of the North Eastern Railway line; thence by the centre of that railway line north-easterly to the Owens River; thence by that river downwards to the Murray River; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF RODNEY.**—Commencing at the junction of the Campaspe River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to Mount Ida Creek; thence by that creek to its source in the Mount Ida Range; thence by that range and a line, being part of the northern boundary of the county of Dalhousie, north-easterly to the source of Sandy Creek; thence by that creek to the Goulburn River; thence by that river downwards to the Murray River; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF TAMBO.**—Commencing on the Great Dividing Range at the point where it is crossed by the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales; thence by that line bearing south-easterly to the Snowy River; thence by that river downwards to the Southern Ocean; thence by the Southern Ocean westerly to the Reeves' River; thence by that river and Lake King to the Tambo River; thence by that river to its western source near Mount Tambo; and thence by the Great Dividing Range to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF TANJIL.**—Commencing at the entrance of the Mitchell River into Lake King; thence by that river to the Cobbanuah Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a direct line bearing westerly to the Mount Wellington Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the Mount Useful Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence north-westerly by the range which divides the waters of the Macalister River from the waters of the Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range westerly to the range which divides the waters of the Yarra-yarra River from the waters of the Thomson River; thence by that range, being part of the eastern boundary of the county of Evelyn, to the source of the Tanjil River; thence by that river to the La Trobe River; thence by that river downwards to Lake Wellington; thence by the southern shore of that lake, by McLennan's Straits, and by the south-eastern shore of Lake Victoria to a point on a line passing through Stockyard Hill Trigonometrical Survey Station, and bearing S. 45° E.; thence by that line to the sea; thence by the sea north-easterly to the Reeves' River; thence crossing the mouth of that river by a line bearing true north; thence by the northern bank of that river, by the northern shore of Lake King, and by the northern, western, and southern shores of Jones' Bay to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF TATCHERA.**—Commencing at the junction of the Loddon River with the Murray River; thence by the first-named river to latitude 36° S; thence by a line, being the north boundary of the county of Gladstone, bearing true west to the Avoca River; thence by that river downwards to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing west to the 143rd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing north to the Murray River; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.

**COUNTY OF WREAH.**—Commencing at the intersection of the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia by the 35th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing east to the 142nd meridian of longitude; thence by that meridian bearing south to the 36th parallel of latitude; thence by that parallel bearing west to the eastern shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence by the eastern, northern, and western shores of that lake, bearing northerly, westerly, and southerly to the 36th parallel of latitude aforesaid; thence by that parallel bearing west to the aforesaid boundary line; and thence by that line bearing north to the point of commencement.

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**COUNTY OF WONNANGATTA.**—Commencing at the junction of the Delatite River with the Goulburn River; thence by the first-named river to its source; thence by the range which divides the waters of the King River from the waters of the Howqua River easterly to Mount Howitt; thence by the Great Dividing Range north-westerly and north-easterly to the source of the Wungungarra River; thence by that river to the Wonnangatta River; thence by that river and the Mitchell River downwards to the Cobbannah Creek; thence by that creek to its source; thence by a direct line bearing westerly to the Mount Wellington Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the Mount Useful Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence north-westerly by the range which divides the waters of the Macalister River from the waters of the Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Arnold; thence by a range northerly to Mount Torbreck Trigonometrical Survey Station; thence by a line to the nearest source of the Jerusalem River; thence by that river downwards to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.

## GOBUR COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining, or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed: and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**GOBUR COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Gobur Common: Commencing at a point bearing west thirty chains from a point on the western side of the road from Gobur to Alexandra, which last-mentioned point bears west from the north angle of allotment 59, parish of Yarek; thence by lines bearing respectively east ninety chains and north two hundred and eight chains, more or less, to the road from Gobur to Merton; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and seventeen chains, more or less, to the road from Gobur to Longwood; thence by that road southerly one mile and a quarter, more or less, to a point bearing north from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing south one hundred and seventeen chains, more or less: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—Area 2000 acres, more or less.—(70 & 27134.)

**REGULATIONS AND ORDERS MADE UNDER THE ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ABORIGINAL NATIVES OF VICTORIA.**

*At the Executive Council held at Melbourne the 13th day of February 1871.*

**PRESENT:**

His Excellency the Governor  
Sir J. McCulloch | Mr. Wrixon.

**WHEREAS** by the 2nd section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 349, intituled *An Act to provide for the protection and management of the Aboriginal Natives of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make regulations and orders for any of the purposes hereinafter mentioned, and at any time to rescind or alter such regulations, that is to say—

- I. For prescribing the place where any aboriginal or any tribe of aborigines shall reside.
- II. For prescribing the terms on which contracts for and on behalf of aborigines may be made with Europeans, and upon which certificates may be granted to aborigines who may be able and willing to earn a living by their own exertions.
- III. For apportioning amongst aborigines the earnings of aborigines under any contract, or where aborigines are located on a reserve the net produce of the labor of such aborigines.
- IV. For the distribution and expenditure of moneys granted by Parliament for the benefit of aborigines.
- V. For the care, custody, and education of the children of aborigines.
- VI. For prescribing the mode of transacting the business of, and the duties generally of the Board, or any local committee hereinafter mentioned, and of the officers appointed hereunder.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulations and Orders, in which the words "Governor" and "Board" are intended to have the meaning attached to them by the Act:—

**(I).—PLACES OF RESIDENCE.**

1. Provision will be made by the Board for the residence of aborigines and tribes of aborigines at the following places:—

Coranderrk,  
Lake Wellington,  
Lake Tyers,  
Lake Condah,  
Framingham,  
Lake Hindmarsh.

**(II).—CONTRACTS AND CERTIFICATES.**

2. No contract with any aboriginal for any service or employment for a longer period than three months shall be of any validity as against such aboriginal, or as an exemption from the penalty imposed by section 6 of the Act, unless such contract shall have been approved by the Board, or the aboriginal shall, at the making and during the continuance thereof, hold a subsisting certificate to be issued as hereinafter provided; but this regulation shall in no way affect the validity of any such contract as against the person entering into it with the aboriginal.

3. Any person desiring the approval of the Board to any such contract, shall apply therefor by transmitting to the local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board in or nearest to the district in which the applicant resides, an application signed by him in the subjoined form (hereinafter referred to as the contract):—

*Contract submitted for the approval of the Board for the Protection of the Aborigines.*

**Particulars of Contract.**

Name, residence, and occupation of employer.  
Name of aboriginal.  
Nature of work or service to be performed.  
Date from which service under the contract is to commence or has commenced.  
Money payment as wages or otherwise, and the time or times when payable under the contract.  
Rations (if any) to be given in addition to money payment (if any), and quantity and quality of rations agreed to be supplied.  
Name and address to which the applicant desires communications in reference to this application to be posted.  
Date of application.

Signature of Applicant.

4. The local guardian or other authorized agent of the Board, after making such enquiries as he or they may think necessary to enable him or them to judge of the propriety of approving the contract, shall forward the same with his or their opinion thereon to the Board.

5. The Board, if satisfied of the propriety of approval, will cause their approval, signed by the secretary, to be endorsed on the contract, and will return the same to the local guardian or committee, and post a copy thereof with such approval endorsed to the address mentioned in the contract.

6. The Board may modify any such contract at the time of approving the same by directing all or any part of the money payment payable to the aboriginal to be made to some local guardian or other person specified in that behalf instead of to the aboriginal himself, and shall in such case endorse such direction in manner hereinafter provided with respect to their

approval; and after the time at which the approved contract so modified would in course of post have reached the address given in the contract, the contractor shall not be entitled to credit under the contract for any payment so directed to be made unless made as directed.

7. Any money to be received in pursuance of any such direction shall be applied at the discretion of the receiver for the benefit of the aboriginal or of any member of his family, subject to any express direction given by the Board, and shall in every case be accounted for to the Board as hereinafter directed, or upon application by the secretary at any time.

8. The Board may, at their discretion, grant to any aboriginal able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions, a certificate in the subjoined form signed by the secretary, which certificate shall not remain in force for more than six months from its date, or the date of its last renewal; and any such unexpired certificate may be renewed for six months by the endorsement of the date of renewal, and signature of any member of the Board, local guardian, or member of a local committee who, in the exercise of his discretion, shall think fit to renew the same.

**Certificate under the Aborigines Protection Act.**

This certificate was issued on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 18\_\_\_\_ to an aboriginal named \_\_\_\_\_, aged about \_\_\_\_\_, height about \_\_\_\_\_, and known or distinguishable by the following peculiarities [*state if any*], he having represented himself as able and willing to earn a living by his own exertions.

The effect of this certificate, while in force, is as follows:—

It authorizes him to enter into a binding contract of service for any time during which this certificate remains in force.

It permits a European to harbor him without incurring any penalty.

It does not authorize any person to sell or give him any intoxicating drink or affect the penalty for so doing, or confer any other exemption from penalties under the said Act.

This certificate will not remain in force after the day of \_\_\_\_\_ 18\_\_\_\_, unless renewed in the meantime by the date of renewal, and signature of some member of the Board for the Protection of Aborigines, local guardian, or member of local committee being written thereon; and it will not remain in force after six months from the date of the last renewal.

Secretary to the Board for the Protection of Aborigines.

**(III).—APPORTIONMENT OF EARNINGS.**

9. Where a number of aborigines are located on a reserve, and where they cultivate fields and gardens, or raise and keep live stock, or otherwise, by their labors, produce marketable goods, the Board may, from time to time, order the sale of any produce or live stock or goods, and out of the net proceeds of sale pay to the aborigines who have labored on the reserve such sums as the Board may deem right, having regard to the kind and amount of labor performed by each.

**(IV).—DISTRIBUTION AND EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS.**

10. In the third month of every year, or so soon after as practicable, the Board shall submit for approval by the Governor a statement showing in detail the quantities of the rations, clothes, medicines, live stock, and other things which they propose to distribute amongst or employ for the benefit of aborigines for the ensuing twelve months, and an estimate of the amount to be expended in the purchase and carriage thereof, and of the amount to be expended in salaries and wages, and travelling and other expenses, for the like period.

11. Once in every year the Board shall submit to the Governor a statement for the past year, showing in detail the quantities of the several things distributed, and the quantity remaining on hand, and the amount of actual expenditure in salaries, wages, travelling and other expenses for the like period.

12. Every local committee, local guardian, or other person entrusted by the Board with the distribution of any stores or other things, or the application of any moneys received from the Board, or from the employer of any aboriginal, shall furnish the Board with a monthly statement in detail of all stores and other things received and distributed, and of all moneys received and disbursed, and showing the balances on hand of stores or other things, and of moneys unexpended up to, and inclusive of, the last day of each calendar month.

**(V).—CUSTODY OF CHILDREN.**

13. The Governor may order the removal of any aboriginal child neglected by its parents, or left unprotected, to any of the places of residence specified in Regulation I., or to an industrial or reformatory school.\*

**(VI).—SECRETARY.**

14. The person who at the passing of these regulations shall be acting as secretary of the Board is hereby appointed the secretary.

**(VII).—MODE OF TRANSACTING BUSINESS.**

15. An ordinary meeting of the Board shall be held in the first week of every month, on a day to be named by the vice-chairman.

16. A special meeting may be convened at any time by the secretary.

\* By the Act 349 the following are deemed aborigines:—“Every aboriginal native of Australia, and every aboriginal half-caste or child of a half-caste, such half-caste or child habitually associating and living with aborigines, shall be deemed to be an aboriginal within the meaning of this Act; and at the hearing of any case the justice adjudicating may, in the absence of other sufficient evidence, decide on his own view and judgment whether any person with reference to whom any proceedings shall have been taken under this Act is or is not an aboriginal.”

17. Three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

18. The secretary, or one of the members acting as secretary, shall keep minutes of the proceedings at each meeting, which shall, if correct, be confirmed at the next meeting.

19. The directions of the Board to its officers shall be given through the secretary, or, in his absence, in such manner as the Board may think right, and the secretary, or acting secretary, shall conduct all correspondence and certify all accounts approved of by the Board.

And the Honorable Sir James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### CONSTITUTING ROAD DISTRICTS TO BE SHIRES.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of February 1871.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Sir James McCulloch | Mr. Wrixon.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (34 Vic. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of the *Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions if any of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in each of the road districts hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in each of such districts, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be shires: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road Districts hereinafter mentioned to be Shires within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE GISBORNE ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of October 1860, and was altered by another proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August 1863, and was united with the borough of Gisborne and created the Gisborne United Road District by another proclamation bearing date the ninth day of May 1866, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the eleventh day of November 1867, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

# REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISCIPLINE ACT 1870."

THE Governor in Council has, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870* (34 Victoria No. 389, § 8) made the Regulations hereto subjoined, viz. :—

## MILITARY AND NAVAL FORCES IN THE SERVICE OF HER MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN VICTORIA.

### CONSTITUTION AND ESTABLISHMENT.

1. *Authority under which raised and formed.*—These forces are engaged under *The Discipline Act 1870*. They are subject to the provisions of the Act, and to all regulations made thereunder by the Governor in Council.

2. *Appointments and engagements.*—The Military and Naval Forces in the service of Her Majesty's Government in Victoria will, subject to such rules and regulations as may from time to time be made, altered, or amended by the Governor in Council, be under the general direction, control, and supervision of an officer appointed by commission under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, as commandant of the said forces, through whom all communications from or for the responsible Minister administering the department will be made.

3. *Commissions.*—Commissions under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony will be issued to all other members of the said forces above the rank of warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officers.

4. *Appointments and promotions.*—All promotions of officers are to be submitted for the approval of the Governor in Council by the officer commanding the forces.

5. All warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers will, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may from time to time be imposed, be appointed by the commandant of the said forces, on behalf of the Governor.

6. *Submission and acceptance of resignations.*—All proposed resignations of officers are to be submitted for the acceptance of the Governor in Council by the commandant.

7. *Notification of appointments, &c., in the "Gazette."*—All appointments, promotions, and resignations of commissioned officers are to be inserted in the *Gazette*, in the terms conveying the Governor's approval or acceptance of such appointment, promotion, or resignation.

8. *To take oath.*—Every person is required, before he is subject to the provisions of the Act, to take the oath prescribed by the Act.

9. *Transmission of Oaths.*—All oaths administered and subscribed in accordance with the provisions of this Act, shall be transmitted by the justice or officer, as the case may be, before whom the same were taken, to the commandant.

### COMMAND, RANK, AND PRECEDENCE.

10. *Formation on parade.*—It is to be understood that, on parade, forces are to be distributed and drawn up in the mode which the officer commanding may judge most convenient and best adapted to the purposes of the service.

11. *Precedence.*—Relative precedence of forces is determined by the date on which the Governor in Council has accepted their services under the Act.

12. *Precedence in the colonies.*—Precedence among the different branches of the colonial forces is to be regulated in accordance with Her Majesty's regulations and the established principles of military subordination.

### DRILL AND EXERCISE.

13. *Exercise and evolutions.*—The regulations for the exercise and evolutions of the various branches of H.M. service are to be carried out, and the most exact adherence to the system therein established is required of all officers.

14. *Uniformity of system.*—These regulations prescribe the adoption and the practice of an uniform system of exercise and drill, and it is of the highest importance that this principle of uniformity should be strictly observed and maintained.

### ALARM SIGNAL.

15. The general alarm signal on which the forces are to assemble will be as provided by orders to be issued as required by the commandant of the said forces.

### DISCIPLINE.

16. *Prevention of crime.*—A commanding officer cannot pay too much attention to the prevention of misconduct, but he must bear in mind that the positive absence of misconduct, and not its screened existence, is the criterion of a well-established discipline. In all first offences, not of an aggravated character, mild reproof and admonition are to be tried; and punishment is not to be resorted to, until a repetition of the offence shall have shown that the milder treatment has not been productive of the desired effect.

17. *Treatment of subordinates.*—As it is desirable to keep up in all ranks a proper feeling and high sense of honor, by which the correct and willing discharge of duty will be best ensured, officers, warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers of every rank should be impressed with the advantage which they individually, their own force, and the service at large, will derive from the adoption towards their subordinates of a system of command and treatment which shall be free from coarse and irritating language. If reproof be necessary, it is to be conveyed in such a manner, and in such terms, as will make an impression, without hurting the feelings of the individual. If acts of intentional neglect and of insubordination should take place, the means of correction and punishment authorized by the regulations of the service are to be resorted to, and they will have double effect if not preceded by coarse and abusive language; indeed, it will probably be found that such acts will become comparatively rare, as the duty will be done more cheerfully and zealously.

18. *Reproving warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers.*—Officers are to avoid reproving warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers for any irregularity, neglect of duty, or awkwardness, in the presence or hearing of their subordinates, lest they should weaken their authority and lessen their self-respect; unless it shall be necessary for the benefit of example that the reproof be public, or that it shall have been provoked by repeated neglect or irregularity.

19. *Punishment of warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers are not to be subjected to minor punishments; and when it is necessary to confine them for any offence, they are to be placed under arrest and not made prisoners except in extreme cases, when it is necessary, in the interests of the public service, to ensure their safe custody.

20. *Resignations.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers are not to be allowed, by resigning their situation, to escape trial by court, except by the special sanction of the officer commanding the forces. Occasional instances, however, may occur in which warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers, finding themselves unequal to perform the duties of their situation, may be allowed to resign their rank.

21. *Arrest.*—No person placed in arrest has a right to demand a court upon himself, or to persist in considering himself under the restraint of such arrest, or to refuse to return to the exercise of his duty, after he shall have been released by proper authority. It by no means follows that any such person conceiving himself to have been wrongfully put in arrest, or otherwise aggrieved, is without remedy: a complaint is afterwards open to him, if preferred in a proper manner. A person in close arrest is not allowed to leave his quarters or tent. If he be in arrest at large, he may be restricted to such limits as his commanding officer may direct.

22. *Proving men forbidden.*—Men suspected of being drunk are not to be put through their turnings or drill, for the purpose of ascertaining their condition.

23. *Restoring arms to prisoners.*—When a man, either before the investigation of an offence, or whilst undergoing punishment, has been deprived of his arms, they are not to be restored to him without an order from his superior officer.

24. *Defaulters.*—Defaulters are not to be required to bring up any portion of their punishment which they may have been prevented from undergoing by reason of their being in hospital or employed on duty.

25. *Recording characters.*—It is important that a uniformity of system should exist as to the mode of estimating and recording the characters of warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers and men. With this view the following terms only are to be used, viz. :—Very good, good, fair, indifferent, bad; and in order to make an estimate of character, officers are primarily to ground their opinions on the documentary records. A man's deportment, his cleanliness, and the manner in which he has performed his several duties, should at the same time be considered in his favor. On a man being sworn in, any certificate of character he may have produced will be stamped "sworn in," and will be retained by the officer commanding until he leaves the service, when they will be delivered up to him stamped with the name of his corps or vessel, and the words "transferred," "resigned," or "dismissed," as the case may be.

26. *Dress and appearance.*—The dress and appearance as well as the demeanour of persons serving under this Act should, on all occasions and in all situations, be such as to create a respect for the service; men permanently engaged are not, without permission, to go beyond the precincts of their barracks or vessels, unless properly dressed in uniform, and are not to smoke in the streets when in uniform.

27. *Wearing side arms.*—Warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers only are permitted to wear side arms off duty.

28. *Civility and courtesy to be used to all ranks of society.*—A commanding officer should impress upon the men under his command, by every means in his power, the propriety of civility and courtesy in their intercourse with all ranks and classes of society, and should particularly caution them to pay proper deference and respect to magistrates and all civil authorities. All persons in uniform not on duty under arms are to take off their caps in the presence of a magistrate in a civil court.

29. *Praise or censure of superiors forbidden.*—Deliberations or discussions among any class of military men, having the object of conveying praise, censure, or any mark of approbation towards their superiors or any others in Her Majesty's service, are strictly prohibited, as being subversive of discipline and an assumption of power which belongs to those to whom the command and discipline of the troops may be entrusted.

30. *Anonymous complaints.*—Making anonymous complaints or publishing comments on military subjects without permission through the medium of the press is strictly prohibited.

31. *Transfers.*—When any person is transferred to any civil Government department the sheets of the defaulters' book applying to him shall be forwarded to the head of such department.

32. *Persons charged with serious offences.*—A man charged with committing a serious offence should be put in confinement, and ought not to be permitted to perform any duty whatever (except carrying his own arms and accoutrements in marching) until his case is disposed of. If, however, by error, such an offender has been permitted to perform any duty, he shall not thereby be absolved from liability to punishment for his offence; but may, if the proper authority shall think fit, be summarily punished, or be brought to trial before a court, according to the circumstances of the case.

33. *Confinement before disposal.*—Accused persons are not to be kept in custody for a longer period than twenty-four hours without having their cases inquired into, and either summarily disposed of or reported to superior authority.

34. *Taking man in custody.*—When a warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officer has occasion to confine a man for any

offence, he should invariably obtain the assistance of one or more persons of a similar rank to the offender to conduct him to the guard-room, and should himself avoid in any way coming in contact with him—except under unavoidable circumstances.

35. *Drunkenness.*—Men in a state of drunkenness are, if possible, to be confined alone, until sober, and not in the guard room, where they are often provoked to acts of violence and insubordination; they are to be visited at least every two hours by a warrant, petty, or non-commissioned officer, and an escort, in order that their condition may be ascertained; and should any suspicion arise that they are suffering from disease a medical officer is forthwith to be sent for.

#### DISCHARGE OR DISMISSAL.

36. *Dismissal.*—Any person not holding a commission under this Act may by the order of the commandant be discharged for unfitness, reduced in rank, or dismissed for negligence or misconduct, independently of any other punishment to which he may by law be subject.

37. *Discharge.*—On the discharge of any man from the force, his "defaulters' sheet" must be filed for reference, and on the application, written or personal, of any one who has been discharged, a printed certificate of character will be made out, in accordance with his sheet, signed by the commandant, and furnished to him, and no other certificates of character or service are to be given. No certificates of character are given to those who have been dismissed.

38. All dismissals will be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

39. Any person allowed to leave at his own request must make good the cost of his kit and uniform, fair wear excepted, the amount of which his commanding officer shall assess.

#### PUNISHMENTS.

40. *Place of Confinement.*—The commandant of the said forces may set apart any portion of the quarters or camp in which troops are stationed or any portion of a ship or vessel in which persons are serving under this Act as a proper place for infliction of solitary confinement under the 27th clause of the Act.

41. *Awards by officers.*—Commanding officers are in all instances to report in writing to the commandant any punishment awarded by them to men under their command.

42. *Right of option not permitted.*—It would be inconsistent with subordination for a commanding officer to admit of the right of option or appeal from any of the above awards, but he may, if he think proper, vindicate the justice of his first order by resorting to the alternative of a court.

43. *Imprisonment.*—Imprisonment in cells, or in corresponding places on board ship, is, as much as possible, to be reserved for cases of drunkenness, riot, or violence, and, in aggravated cases, should be followed by extra duty and drills.

#### OFFENCES.

44. All persons regularly serving under *The Discipline Act of 1870* will be subject to be brought before the court therein provided if charged with any of the following offences:—

- Mutiny and sedition.
- Violence to superior.
- Disobedience of orders.
- Disrespect to superior officers.
- Desertion.
- Absence without leave.
- Betraying the watchword.
- Giving false alarms.
- Sleeping on post, or quitting it without orders.
- Quitting the ranks without orders.
- Breaking arrest, escape from prison.
- Allowing escape of prisoner.
- Frequent drunkenness.
- Drunk on duty.
- Malingering, &c.
- Signing false returns.
- Any disgraceful conduct.

All acts, conduct, disorders, and neglects which officers, warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officers, and men may be guilty of to the prejudice of good order and military discipline, though not specified in the foregoing cases, shall be taken cognizance of according to the nature and degree of the offence, and the offender shall suffer such punishment as the court may award.

#### COURTS.

45. *Authority for constitution, &c., of courts.*—The Act lays down rules for the constitution of courts, and defines the powers with which they are invested.

46. *Investigation of charges.*—All serious charges preferred against all persons serving under this Act, and the circumstances on which they are founded, are to be carefully inquired into, in order to ascertain that the case is a proper one for investigation by a court, and that there is sufficient evidence to substantiate the charges. It should be borne in mind that to prefer accusations which cannot be maintained is a practice highly inconvenient and injurious to the service.

47. *Courts on officers.*—Whenever it can be arranged without serious inconvenience to the service, the military or naval members of a court assembled for the trial of an officer are to be of equal, if not superior, rank to the prisoner.

48. *Separate trial for each prisoner.*—Any number of prisoners may be tried together for an offence committed collectively, but when more prisoners than one are tried by the same court, and they are arraigned upon separate and distinct charges, the court is to be re-sworn at the commencement of each trial, and the proceedings of each trial are to be conducted and recorded separately.

49. *Adjournments.*—It is important that every trial by court once begun should, as far as possible, proceed with strict regularity, and without interruption, to its conclusion. The court have the power of granting an adjournment, but they should in no case permit an adjournment for the purpose of

obtaining further evidence, either on behalf of the prosecution or of the prisoner, unless they are satisfied that such adjournment and production of further evidence will not render the trial unjust, and ought reasonably to be allowed, in order to assist the course of justice. Great care is therefore to be taken, both by the prosecuting officer and the prisoner, to have ready at the trial all the witnesses and documents which they may desire to produce in support of their respective cases.

50. *Copy of charge to be given to prisoner.*—The accused is to be furnished, within a reasonable time before the trial, with a copy of the charge to be preferred against him.

51. *Instructions in framing charges.*—In framing charges, care is to be taken to render them specific in names, dates, and places, but all non-essential minutiae are to be avoided.

52. *Charges of "disgraceful conduct."*—A charge of "disgraceful conduct" is never to be preferred unless the offence is clearly of a felonious or fraudulent nature, or of a cruel, indecent, or unnatural kind.

53. *Charges of drunkenness.*—No person under the rank of a non-commissioned officer is to be brought to trial by court-martial on a first charge of drunkenness only. If, however, he is to be tried for another offence, a charge of drunkenness may be added as a separate charge. In cases of frequent drunkenness the evidence given from the defaulters' book is to specify the date, place, and circumstance of each previous instance of drunkenness. The entries in the defaulters' book are to be conclusive evidence of the previous instances of drunkenness therein stated.

54. *Plea of prisoner.*—In every case in which a prisoner pleads guilty, the court is, notwithstanding, to receive, and to report in the proceedings, such evidence as may afford a full knowledge of the circumstances, as it is essential that the facts and particulars should be known to those whose duty it is to report on the case, or who have discretion in carrying the sentence into effect.

55. *Former convictions, age, &c.*—After any person has been found guilty of the charge or charges preferred against him, the court is to inquire into and record the prisoner's former convictions (if any), and any sentence which he may be undergoing; also his age, service, general character, and any decorations or other honorary rewards he may be in possession of. These particulars are required for the guidance of the court in awarding punishment, as well as for that of the confirming authority in sanctioning the award. The evidence under this head is to be given, whenever possible, by a commissioned officer who is not a member of the court.

56. *Minutes of proceedings.*—The minutes of the proceedings of all courts-martial are to be fairly and accurately recorded in a clear and legible hand, without erasures. When interlineations, which should be avoided as much as possible, are necessarily made, they are to be verified by the president's initials. The pages are to be numbered, and the sheets, when more than one, are to be fastened together. Care is to be taken that sufficient space, at least half a page, is left, immediately below the signature of the president, for the signature and remarks of the confirming authority.

57. Whenever a court is re-assembled for the purpose of revising their proceedings, the letter, order, or memorandum, or a copy thereof, containing the instructions to the court, and the reasons for requiring the revision, is to be attached to, and form part of, the proceedings.

58. *Sentences remitted or proceedings quashed.*—When any person has been tried and sentenced by a court, and his punishment has been wholly remitted, his conviction, is to be recorded; but when the proceedings of a court are quashed on account of their illegality, or from any other circumstances, such person is to be relieved from all consequences of his trial, and all record of it is to be erased.

#### BOOKS.

59. *General instructions.*—The books to be kept are shown in the annexed table. The authorized forms are supplied on requisition. Each book contains a page of instructions as to the mode in which it is to be kept, and such instructions are to be strictly adhered to. All entries made therein are to be carefully examined by the commanding officer, and the books are always to be produced at the inspection of the corps, and at such other times as the commandant may direct.

- Order book.
- Casualty diary.
- Letter book.
- Return book.
- Register of furloughs.
- Defaulters' book.

60. *Order book.*—All orders received from the commandant and from the officer commanding the corps, are to be pasted in a book in original as they are received. The volumes are each to be numbered and indexed.

61. *Casualty diary.*—A casualty book is to be kept at the head-quarters of every corps and on board every vessel, in which all changes of service are to be inserted daily.

62. *Letter book.*—The letter book is to contain the entry of all official letters. It is to contain an alphabetical index, and a separate index for the public departments.

63. *Return book.*—Copies of all returns transmitted to the Ordnance department or to the commandant are to be kept in a book and arranged in order of date.

64. *Defaulters' book.*—This book is to contain the name of every warrant, petty, and non-commissioned officer and man serving under commanding officers. An entry is to be made of every case of conviction by the court established under the Act or by a court of criminal jurisdiction, or of any punishment involving imprisonment, forfeiture of pay, extra duty in barracks exceeding seven days.

65. *Conviction by the civil power.*—All convictions by a magistrate or by a civil court, whether involving imprisonment or a fine in lieu thereof, are to be entered in the defaulters' book.

## ENROLMENT AND ENGAGEMENT.

## ENROLMENT AND ENGAGEMENT FOR CLASS B OF THE ARTILLERY CORPS.

66. Every person desirous of being registered as a candidate for Class B of the Artillery Corps, from which all appointments to the Police, Penal, or Gaol departments will be made, must present personally a written application for enrolment.

67. Candidates must be under thirty years of age; at least five feet nine inches in height, smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect, and will have to undergo a strict medical examination. If required for subsequent mounted duty in the Police the standard of height will be reduced by one inch.

68. They must be able to read and write well, and must produce satisfactory testimonials of character; and, if they have served in any other force or Government department, must also produce their discharge therefrom.

## ENGAGEMENT OF PERSONS REGULARLY EMPLOYED.

69. The period for which all members of corps regularly employed under the act will be sworn in will be for one year, after the expiration of which period any member of the corps can obtain his discharge on giving three months' notice of his intention to apply for the same: Provided always, that at the time no apprehension of danger to the colony exists, of which the Governor in Council is to be the sole judge.

## ENGAGEMENT OF PERSONS OCCASIONALLY EMPLOYED.

70. Enrolment and engagement of other corps will be as specially provided.

Any volunteer enrolled before the 1st of April next, and who has during the half-year ending 30th June 1871—

- (1.) Attended six mounted parades, one of which shall be an official inspection.
- (2.) Attended six other, either mounted or dismounted parades, or both.

## NAVAL, ARTILLERY, AND RIFLE VOLUNTEERS.

Any volunteer, enrolled before the 1st April next, and who has gone through a course of musketry instruction, and has also during the half-year ending 30th June 1871—

- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
- (2.) Attended and passed one parade for official inspection.
- (3.) Attended six other parades.

- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
- (2.) Attended four parades of the corps.
- (3.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
- (4.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
- (5.) Attended six musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which three at least were for engineering instruction.
- (6.) Gone through a course of musketry instruction.

## Torres Strait—Great North-east Channel.

Her Majesty's Consul at Batavia has forwarded the following information relative to a danger near the fairway track through Torres Strait by the North-east Channel, obtained from Captain James Farquhar, of the barque *Loch Awe*.

(All bearings are magnetic. Variation  $4^{\circ} 50'$  easterly in 1870.)  
*Wreck shoal*.—On the 20th July 1870, the barque *Loch Awe*, on her passage from Newcastle, New South Wales, to Batavia, observed the North German schooner *Honolulu* stranded on a shoal off Saddle Island, near the position of a "wreck" marked on Admiralty chart, No. 2422, and abandoned.

The position of the *Honolulu* taken when passing was Saddle Island bearing W.S.W., and Ninepin Rock S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. These bearings place the shoal in lat.  $10^{\circ} 09' S.$ , long.  $142^{\circ} 45' 30'' E.$ , and about a mile to the northward of the course recommended in passing through the North-east Channel of Torres Strait.

## NEW ZEALAND—MIDDLE ISLAND. REVOLVING LIGHT ON CAPE CAMPBELL.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 61, dated 26th August 1869, respecting the proposed establishment of a light on Cape Campbell, south side of the eastern entrance to Cook Strait, the Government of New Zealand has given notice that, from the 1st day of August 1870, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the cape.

The light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, elevated 155 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower, 73 feet high, is a wooden structure, painted with alternate bands of red and white. It is situated on a knoll at the extremity of Cape Campbell, in lat.  $41^{\circ} 43' 15'' S.$ , long.  $174^{\circ} 18' 30'' E.$

# QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

**BARTON RUN.**—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchell run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannon run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarran-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumburp run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.
