CERTIFICATION OF ACCOUNTS.

The attention of Heads of Departments is drawn to the responsibility which attaches to them in connection with the duty of certifying to accounts.

The certificate of the Head of a Department to an account for the service of that department not only vouches for the correctness of the amount charged, and to the sufficiency of the funds and authority to which it is made chargeable, but to the genuineness of the signature of the claimant, and to the fact that the claimant signing is the person legally entitled to the payment. Heads of Departments are liable to be culled upon to make good any losses which may accrue to the Government from errors in accounts in any of the particulars above adverted to.

CLAUSE 18.—No dealer in gunpowder shall have or keep, within the city of Melbourne, or any town, township, or borough, at any one time, more than two hundredweight of gunpowder, and no person not being a dealer more than twenty-five pounds, within any house, storchouse, warehouse, shop, cellar, yard, building, or enclosed space occupied by the same person or persons; and if any gunpowder be kept contrary hereto the owner or person in charge shall forfeit all the gunpowder found on the premises, and the sum of five shillings for every pound beyond such allowed quantity.
