CERTIFICATION OF ACCOUNTS.

CLAUSE 18.—No dealer in gunpowder shall have or keep, within the city of Melbourne, or any town, township, or borough, at any one time, more than two hundredweight of gunpowder, and no person not being a dealer more than twenty-five pounds, within any house, storehouse, warehouse, shop, cellar, yard, building, or enclosed space occupied by the same person or persons; and if any gunpowder be kept contrary hereto the owner or person in charge shall forfeit all the gunpowder found on the premises, and the sum of five shillings for every pound beyond such allowed quantity.

ST. VINCENT'S GULF—CAPE JERVIS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after 1st May 1871, a fixed bright light will be exhibited from a lighthouse on Cape Jervis, at the entrance of Backstairs Passage from St. Vincent's Gulf.

The light-tower will be in latitude 35 deg. 37 min. 3 sec. S., longitude 138 deg. 7 min. 30 sec. E., and the light will be visible for a distance of 12 to 14 miles, on an arc from seaward from N. 25 deg. E. to S. 4 deg. E.

The outer extremity of the reef, projecting from Cape Jervis, lies 1600 feet to the S.W. of the lighthouse.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—
