CENSUS OF 1871.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria (34 Victoria, No. 269), entitled *The Census Act 1871*, it is enacted that an account shall be taken of the population and of the live stock in the colony: And whereas the 2nd day of April 1871 has been fixed by the Governor in Council as that on which such account shall be taken: It is hereby notified that, for the purpose of such account, printed forms will be left at each dwelling on or before the 1st day of April 1871, and will be called for on the 3rd day of April 1871, or as soon after as practicable.

All occupiers or persons in charge of dwellings are required to enter the particulars sought for in such forms to the best of their knowledge, information, and belief; and if any person shall refuse or wilfully neglect to fill up such forms, or to sign and deliver the same; or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to answer, or untruly answer, any enquiry made by a sub-enumerator; or shall wilfully make, sign, or deliver, or cause to be made, signed, or delivered, any false return or statement of any particular in such forms; or shall obstruct any person in the performance of his duty under the said Act, the person so offending will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Shire hereinafter mentioned to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The Shire of Alexandra, with the exception of the townships of Alexandra, Gobur, Darlingford, Enoch's Point, and Merton, and with the further exception of the areas comprised within a circuit of one mile around the respective boundaries of those townships.

ELLERSLIE COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas all objections respecting the proclamation of the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

ELLERSLIE TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the town of Ellerslie (the boundaries of which town were set forth in a Proclamation dated the 14th October 1867, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd October 1867), shall be and constitute a Common. Area available for commonage, about 260 acres.—(70.Z.22842.)

BUNINYONG TIMBER RESERVES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the third of October 1870, two areas therein described were reserved for the preservation and growth of timber: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the reservation of one of such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the reservation of One hundred and eighty-three acres one rood three perches, county of Grant, parish of Buninyong, comprising allotments 3 and 6 of section 7, for the preservation and growth of timber in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act.—(70.Z.20441)

At Jamieson, on Friday the nineteenth day of May, in lieu of the twenty-fourth of May 1871.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

QUARANTINE DISTRICT UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870* the Governor in Council has ordered that the portion of Victoria, whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, and which is known as the Narraport run, shall be a Quarantine District within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

NARRAPORT RUN.—Commencing at the north-west angle, and bounded on the north by the Karyic run, bearing easterly about eight miles; thence southerly about eight miles twenty-six chains; thence westerly to the eastern boundary of the Morton Plains run about two miles and a-half; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Morton Plains to the eastern boundary of Wirrumbirchip, bearing north-westerly about seven miles and a-half; and thence by the eastern boundary of Wirrumbirchip run, bearing northerly about three miles to the commencing point.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannon run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarram-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumbeep run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but persons wanting brick graves or vaults, will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto, must be left with the order.

4. The time fixed for the funeral to be, the time when the procession will be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

5. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

6. The usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals is from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours will be from Two p.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

7. All monuments, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument, tablet, or fence, proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

10. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

11. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

12. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in the scale of charges and regulations.
