REGULATING THE IMPORTATION OF CATTLE INTO CANTERBURY, NEW ZEALAND.

HIS Honor the Superintendent of Canterbury, having declared that (*inter alia*) the colony of Victoria shall be deemed to be an infected district within the meaning of the New Zealand Diseased Cattle Acts, the following regulations respecting the importation of cattle into the above-mentioned province, which have been extracted from the *New Zealand Gazette*, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

1. If any person shall import any cattle from either or any of the infected districts into the province of Canterbury, unless upon quarantine ground, and after having obtained from an inspector of cattle a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds for every head of cattle so imported into the province of Canterbury.
2. If any person shall land, or cause to be landed, or assist in landing, any cattle coming from either of the infected districts in or upon any part of the province of Canterbury, unless into a quarantine ground, and after having obtained a quarantine certificate, he shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds for every head of cattle so landed.
3. It shall be lawful for and the duty of any inspector of cattle or police constable to destroy, or cause to be destroyed, any cattle which shall be imported or landed contrary to these regulations.
4. If any person shall wilfully impede or obstruct any inspector of cattle or police constable acting under the authority of these regulations, every person so offending shall be liable to a penalty of fifty pounds.
5. These regulations shall take effect from and after the day following the date of publication in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

THIS boat has been provided by subscription, and placed here for the purpose of succouring any cast-aways who may be wrecked on the reef. She is provided with all the necessary articles for making a voyage to the Australian Continent; and in the water-tight chest supplied with provisions, pannikins, knives, fishing tackle, medical stores, matches, carpenter's tools, blankets, candles, chart, compass, pens, ink, and paper. There are also six casks of fresh water (each containing fifteen gallons) fitted to ballast the boat as well as for use. And every piece of wood used in the boat's construction, as well as her stores, has (to prevent misappropriation) been branded "Life Boat Elizabeth Reef"; and it is requested that the following instructions be observed:—

INSTRUCTIONS.
Cast-aways will write a detailed account of their disaster, with the names of the survivors and lost, if any, also the place they intend to steer for, deposit this document in the Nun-buoy and leave it floating at the moorings. The galvanized iron cover may be unscrewed and carried in the boat, or fastened to the moorings.

Parties visiting the boat are requested to leave a report of their visit, with any other intelligence they wish communicated; and if bound direct to an adjacent port, to forward any reports that may be thus found in the Nun-buoy. Whaler reports may thus be forwarded.

In the N.E. segment of the reef is a clear channel with deep water.

THE LAND ACT 1869.
DETERMINATION OF THE RENT TO BE PAID FOR PASTORAL
OCCUPATION OF RUNS.

1. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief, the Traffic Manager, and the General Overseer of Locomotives. The Goods will be subject to the examination and test of an Inspecting Officer appointed by any of the above. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in schedule but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from the contractor from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than the orders which have been issued during the year; nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedule for which orders have not been issued. 2. All orders for supplies under this contract must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered

free of charge to the Stores or other part of the Railway premises, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the Secretary.

3. The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the exercise of the right to purchase reserved in the specification or the special conditions to any of the schedules, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal or other Government establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

5. In the event of supplies ordered under this contract not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

6. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

7. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

8. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within twenty-four hours after notice has been given of such rejection, and, if not so removed, the Railway Storekeeper is hereby empowered to send same to Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. 12. RULES OF THE MANSFIELD PUBLIC HOSPITAL.

THE object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for accidents; but no person able to pay for the same shall meet with further than temporary assistance; provided also that if there is room for patients capable of paying may be admitted on payment of £2 per week in advance.

2. The institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Auditors, Governors, and Subscribers.

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of Governors and Subscribers:—£25 in one sum, Life Governor; £15 in one sum, Life Subscriber; £25 corporate body, Governor; £20 corporate body, Subscriber; £25 first executor under a will, Governor for one year; £15 minister collecting in one year, Governor for one year; £15 layman or corporate body collecting in one year, Governor for one year; £2 2s. yearly subscriptions, Governor; £1 1s. yearly subscriptions, Subscriber—with power to recommend patients as follow:—Life Governor, 1 in-patient and 3 out-patients always on the books; Life Subscriber, 1 in-patient and 1 out-patient always on the books; Governor for one year, 3 in-patients and 4 out-patients annually; Governor, 2 in-patients and 2 out-patients annually; Subscribers, 1 in-patient and 2 out-patients annually.

4. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee, and be made by tickets only to be issued by the secretary or collector. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and be available twelve months after issue.

5. Members of committee, honorary and medical officers shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee.

6. Accidents and cases deemed of decided emergency by the honorary or paid medical staff may be admitted at any time, but the admission of patients recommended shall be restricted to Mondays between the hours of Three p.m. and Four p.m. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no child under five years of age; no insane person; no person afflicted with syphilis or any infectious disease; any person who in the opinion of the medical staff is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient within the walls of the hospital under any circumstances. Provided always that zymotic diseases may be treated outside the walls of the hospital in tent accommodation.

7. Any person guilty of gross conduct may be summarily dismissed by any three of the committee upon its being substantiated.

8. The committee or sub-committee shall have power to discharge any patient who is not in their opinion a proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

9. Annual subscriptions must be paid for the current year—to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no governor or subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription is paid.

10. The subscribers to the Mansfield Public Hospital shall be entitled to vote in proportion to their subscriptions according to the following scale, viz.:

- £1 ls. and less than £3 3s., One vote.
- £3 3s. and less than £5 5s., Two votes.
- £5 5s. and upwards, Three votes.

11. The general committee shall direct the affairs of the institution, frame bye-laws for its internal regulation (the same not to be contrary to the general rules), and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution. They shall meet the first Monday in every month, and on such days as they may appoint, four to form a quorum, and shall have the power to admit patients. In the event of there being no quorum within half an hour of the time specified for a meeting of the committee, those members present shall record their attendance in the minute-book, and adjourn the meeting for a period not less than seven days,—to be notified to the committee by the secretary.

12. The president shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees.

13. Any member of committee absenting himself from four consecutive ordinary monthly meetings of the committee his office shall be vacant; and the same rule shall apply to the President, the two Vice-Presidents, and the Treasurer. Any such vacancy occurring shall be filled up by the general committee.

14. The general committee shall choose a sub-committee from amongst themselves, consisting of five members, three to form a quorum, who shall attend to the financial, medical, and domestic arrangements, and shall meet on such day and hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts and discharge servants and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

15. That the whole of the general committee, exclusive of those members whose election may be in dispute, be a committee for determining disputed elections.

16. The general committee shall annually present a report of the affairs of the hospital, together with a balance-sheet, duly audited, in the month of January.

17. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer and deposited in such bank as the committee may determine.

18. The officers of the institution shall consist of a duly qualified medical practitioner, collector, dispenser, secretary, house steward, or matron.

19. That the ministers of all the religious denominations be allowed access at all hours, under certain regulations to be made by the general committee.

20. It shall be competent for three members of the committee, by a written requisition, to call upon the president, or, in his absence, a vice-president, to convene a special meeting of governors and subscribers. The object of such meeting to be

stated in the requisition, and the same to be advertised at least seven clear days; and no other business than that set forth in the requisition shall be entertained.

21. That general visitors to the hospital shall be admitted at such times and under such regulations as the committee shall appoint.

22. All cheques shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account is passed, the secretary and the treasurer.

23. None of the foregoing rules to be altered, or any rule made, except the same shall have passed a general or special meeting of governors and subscribers.
