## COMMONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter

to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the notices prescribed by the said Act have been given: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

**BEECHWORTH UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLDFIELD COMMON.**—The Beechworth United Borough and Goldfield Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 2nd day of March 1863 and the 25th day of September 1865, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the point where the west boundary of the existing common abuts on the southern boundary of the Woolshed Goldfield Common; thence by the last-named common bearing N. 78° W. sixty-three chains; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and forty chains to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section I, parish of Beechworth; thence by allotments 1 and 2, bearing S. 87° 50' E. twenty-three chains five links, S. 2° 10' W. fifty-two chains twenty links, and N. 87° 50' W. twenty-three chains five links; thence by a line bearing south three hundred and forty-two chains, more or less, to the range which forms the northern boundary of the Bowman's Forest Farmers' Common; thence by that range north-easterly seventy-six chains, more or less, to the west boundary of the existing Beechworth Goldfield Common; and thence by that boundary bearing north four hundred and eighty-five chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 3000 acres.—(71.B.6616.)

**TARRAWINGEE COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the two areas, the respective boundaries of which are hereinafter described shall be and constitute a common to be designated the Tarrawingee Common: Commencing at the intersection of the north-western side of the road which forms the north-western boundary of allotment 1A, parish of Tarrawingee, by the western side of the road to Eldorado; thence by the last-named road bearing north-westerly and northerly to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of the land licensed under the 42nd section of the Amending Land Act 1865 to John Kneebone; thence west ninety-eight chains, more or less, to the east boundary of allotment 5 of section 22 A, parish of Carraragumungee; thence south three miles, more or less, to Hodgson's Creek; thence up that creek to the south-west angle of allotment 20A, parish of Tarrawingee; thence by the west boundary of that allotment bearing north eleven chains thirty-two links; thence by a line bearing north to the north-western side of the road which forms the north-western boundary of that allotment; and thence by that road bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement. Area, about 2,000 acres. Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 5A, parish of Tarrawingee; thence by that allotment bearing south forty-four chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of the land in the parish of Everton, licensed to John Helmswood; thence by a line and the north boundary of that land bearing east forty-three chains eighty-two links; thence by the east boundary thereof and a line bearing south twenty-four chains sixty-three links to the north-west angle of allotment 6, parish of Everton; thence by that allotment and a line bearing east twenty-two chains sixty-five links; thence by a line bearing north ten chains to the south-west angle of the land licensed to William Morrison; thence by the western boundary of that land and of the land licensed to John Grant and by a line bearing north to the south-eastern boundary of the Eldorado Goldfield Common; and thence by the said boundary of that common bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 600 acres.—(71.A.63.)

# AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st MARCH 1871.

\* The returns of Shires and Boroughs have been furnished by the Local Councils in accordance with the Act 33 Vict. No. 333 and 33 Vict. No. 353. The Shire of Bungee has, up to this time, sent in no returns, and therefore the figures have been taken from those furnished last year. The amount is small, and will only slightly affect the total. Special agents have been employed to collect the statistics of parts of the colony not included in Shires and Boroughs. The compilation of the returns has for the most part been performed in this office, and as the remainder have been revised, it is not likely that any great change will take place in the figures contained in the present Tables.

# THE SHIRE OF METCALFE DIVIDED ANEW.

*At the Executive Council, held at Toorak, the eighth day of May 1871.*

**WHEREAS** by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 353, § 23) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of any one or more ridings of a united shire for all ridings of which a voters' roll shall be in force, to divide anew such united shire into such separate ridings as to him may seem fit by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same and equal in number to the whole number of councillors hereby or hereunder assigned to such united shire divided by three, and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the original ridings which shall have become such upon the union: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the twenty-sixth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy the united Shire of Metcalfe was constituted and the boundaries thereof were therein prescribed: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of the said United Shire: And whereas notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth divide anew the said United Shire into four several ridings, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the names and boundaries of such ridings in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE TARADALE RIDING.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Metcalfe; thence west to the south-west angle of said section 1; thence by a direct line south through portions 46, 45, 44, and 43 to the centre of the Coliban River opposite the centre line of a road forming the south boundary of portion 60 in the parish of Edgewood; thence to and by the centre line of said road west to a point bearing south of a point on the west side of the main line of road from Taradale to Elphinstone, the last-named point bearing S. 52° 37' W. from the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 12, of Taradale suburban allotments; thence north to the north boundary of the parish of Drummond; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone, in the county of Talbot; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Elphinstone to a point bearing west of the south-west angle of portion 1, section 7, parish of Elphinstone; thence east to the centre of a road forming the west boundary to sections 5 and 4, parish of Elphinstone; thence north by said road to the north boundary of Elphinstone parish; thence by the said north boundary east to its north-east angle; thence easterly by the northern boundary of portions 1, 2, 3, and 4, parish of Hawkstone, to the north-east angle of said portion 4; thence south by the east boundary of the same portion and of portion 1, parish of Metcalfe, to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section 7, in the same parish; thence east to a road dividing allotments 22 and 23; thence southerly by that road and a road forming the west boundary to allotments 21 and 8 in the parish of Metcalfe to the commencing point.

**THE NORTH RIDING.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Emberton; thence west by the north boundary of the said parish to the Coliban River; thence south-westerly by the Coliban River to a point east of the south boundary of the Stratford Lodge pre-emptive right; thence to and by the said south boundary to the centre of a road forming the eastern boundary to allotments 2 and 1 in the parish of Hawkstone; thence northerly and westerly by the roads forming the north-eastern boundaries 5, 6, 7, and 8, parish of Hawkstone, to the south-west angle of portion 31, parish of Sutton Grange; thence northerly by the road forming the western boundary of portions 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 23, 22, and 21 to the centre of Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek north-easterly to its junction with the Coliban River; thence northwards by the Coliban River to its junction with the River Campaspe; thence southwards by the River Campaspe to the commencing point.

**THE SOUTH RIDING.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Piper's Creek bearing east from the south-east angle of the parish of Metcalfe; thence west to the said south-east angle; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Metcalfe to the centre of a road forming the west boundary of allotments 8 and 21, parish of Metcalfe; thence northerly by the centre of that road and a road dividing allotments 22 and 23, to the north-east angle of allotment 23 in the parish of Metcalfe; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Metcalfe; thence north to the north-east angle of portion 4 in the parish of Hawkstone; thence easterly to and by the north boundary of allotment 1, parish of Hawkstone, to its north-east angle; thence south-easterly by the eastern boundary of allotments 1 and 2 to a point west of the south boundary of Stratford Lodge pre-emptive right; thence to and by the said south boundary to the Coliban River; thence north-easterly by the Coliban River to the north-west angle of the parish of Emberton; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Emberton and a direct line to the centre of the Campaspe River; thence southwards by the centre line of the Campaspe River and Piper's Creek to the commencing point.

**THE WEST RIDING.**—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence east by the north boundary of said parish to the centre of a road forming the eastern boundary to portions numbering from 47 to 37, parish of Faraday; thence north-westerly by the centre of that road to a point east of the north boundary of the borough of Chewton; thence to and by the said north boundary to the eastern boundary of the borough of Castlemaine; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of the borough of Castlemaine to the boundary of the electoral district of Castlemaine; thence northerly by the said electoral boundary to the north boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence east by the said north boundary to the north-west angle of portion 1, section 8, parish of Harcourt; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of the parish of Sutton Grange to the centre of Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek southerly to a point at the intersection of a road forming the western boundary of portions 21, 22, 23, 27, 28, 29, 30, and 31, parish of Sutton Grange; thence south-easterly by the centre of that road to the south-west angle of portion 31 aforesaid; thence south-easterly, south and westerly by the roads forming the north-eastern, east, and southern boundaries of portions 8, 7, 6, and 5, in the parish of Hawkstone, to the north-east angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence west by the north boundary of the last-named parish to the north-west angle of portion 4, section 4, parish of Elphinstone; thence south to the south-east angle of section C in the same parish; thence west to the west boundary of the parish of Elphinstone; thence by the said west boundary north to the commencing point.

The Council of the Shire of Huntly shall, within twelve months from the 8th of May aforesaid, metal one mile of the Huntly Main Road.

The boundaries above described comprise the Glenelg, Woodford, West Strathdownie, East Strathdownie, Kiladbro, West Ardno, East Ardno, and Limestone Ridge runs.

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH:—

1. That His Excellency the Rt. Hon. John Henry Thomas Viscount Canterbury, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, did, on or about the 2nd day of March last, issue under his hand and the seal of the said colony, a Writ directed to Mars Miller, Esquire, the Returning Officer of the Electoral District of East Bourke Boroughs, appointing a certain day therein named to be the day before which nominations of candidates at and for the said Election were to be made, and commanding him to proceed according to law to the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, and further commanding the said Returning Officer that in the event of the said election being contested the poll should be taken, at the time therein appointed for that purpose, at Brunswick for the Brunswick division; at Northcote (A), for the Northcote (A) division; at Northcote (B), for the Northcote (B) division; and at Pentridge, for the Pentridge division of the said district.

2. That the Governor in Council appointed one place, and not more, within and for each division of the said electoral district for taking the poll at such election.

3. That the said William Thomas Napier Champ was, at the time of the said nomination, election, and return, and still is in receipt of such superannuation allowance, and was not nor is a responsible Minister of the Crown and a Member of the Executive Council, and his services have not been dispensed with.

15. That the said William Thomas Napier Champ, from the time of his said appointment to the said office as aforesaid, up to and at the time of his superannuation, and retirement from active service aforesaid, discharged the duties of the said office, and resided at Pentridge, within the Electoral District of East Bourke Boroughs, and was well known as such Inspector of Penal Establishments in the district, and to be in receipt at the time of the said nomination, election, and return, of the said superannuation allowance aforesaid.

16. That, prior to the nomination, election, and return of the said William Thomas Napier Champ, Thomas Mitchell, of Northcote, an elector of the said district of East Bourke Boroughs, attended meetings of electors called by the said William Thomas Napier Champ, at Northcote, Alphington, and other parts of the Electoral District of East Bourke Boroughs, and stated in the presence of the said William Thomas Napier Champ and a large number of the electors of the said district that he, the said Thomas Mitchell, had taken a legal opinion, and that it was to the effect that the said William Thomas Napier Champ, being still in the service of the Crown, was not capable of being elected, and of sitting and voting in the Legislative Assembly, and that votes recorded for him would be thrown away.

17. That the said Returning Officer, except as aforesaid, did not at noon or at all on the 11th day of March last, the day appointed in and by the said Writ for that purpose, at Miller street aforesaid, publicly announce the several polling-places for the said electoral district, and did not forthwith publish the same in a newspaper published in the district, or in a Melbourne daily newspaper.

18. That, in consequence of the aforesaid announcements of the day for receiving nomination papers and payments in connection with the said election, and the appointment and withdrawal of the said polling-place in and for the Brunswick division, as beforementioned, during the issue and return of the said Writ, several electors in the said division, who would otherwise have done so, were prevented recording their votes at the said election, and were thereby disfranchised.

19. That, notwithstanding such declaration aforesaid, your Petitioner submits, under the foregoing circumstances, that the said William Thomas Napier Champ was not duly elected a Member at said election to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, and that his election was and is absolutely void, for the following reasons:—

(1.) That, at the time of the said nomination, election, and return, the said William Thomas Napier Champ held an office or place of profit under the Crown, or was employed in the public service of Victoria for salary, fees, or emolument, and was not nor is a responsible Minister of the Crown and a Member of the Executive Council, nor were his services dispensed with.

- (2.) That the said William Thomas Napier Champ is directly interested in a contract entered into on behalf of Her Majesty with him in respect of such superannuation allowance aforesaid, or participates directly in the profits of a contract entered into on behalf of Her Majesty with him, or in a certain benefit or emolument arising from the same, namely, such superannuation allowance.
  - (3.) That the said errors, mistakes, misfeasances, and omissions of the Returning Officer, have not nor could they be corrected or amended by the Governor in Council.
  - (4.) That the Governor in Council alone can legally appoint the place or places for taking the poll, and revoke same, in and for each division of the electoral districts, as they from time to time shall think fit.
  - (5.) That by reason of the aforesaid irregularities on the part of the Returning Officer, several electors were prevented recording their votes at the said election.
  - (6.) That the proceedings of the Returning Officer, hereinbefore set forth, were illegal and contrary to law.
  - (7.) That the Petitioner ought, by reason of the premises, to have been returned as duly elected at the said election to serve in the present Parliament as a Member for the said Electoral District of East Bourke Boroughs, or that the said election should be declared null and void.
20. That your Petitioner has paid into the Bank of New South Wales, being a bank carrying on business in Victoria, the sum of One hundred pounds to the credit of the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly in relation to this Petition.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays :—

- (1.) That you will as soon as conveniently may be lay this Petition before the Legislative Assembly.
- (2.) That the Legislative Assembly will be pleased to forthwith refer such Petition to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.
- (3.) That when such reference has been made such Committee will determine and report to the Legislative Assembly that the said William Thomas Napier Champ was not at the time of the said nomination, election, and return qualified to sit or vote in the said Legislative Assembly for the said electoral district, and that his election to serve therein is null and void.
- (4.) That the said Committee will determine and report to the Legislative Assembly that the said William Thomas Napier Champ was not duly elected, and that the Petitioner was duly elected as a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said Electoral District of East Bourke Boroughs.
- (5.) That thereupon the Petitioner may be sworn as a Member of the said Assembly, and may take his seat therein accordingly.
- (6.) Or that the Committee will determine and report that the said election was absolutely void.
- (7.) That thereupon a new Writ may be issued for the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said electoral district.
- (8.) That your Petitioner may have such further and other relief as the nature of the case requires.
