ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 3rd day of April 1871, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the 34th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:-

- No. 377. An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and to appropriate the supplies granted in this Session of Parliament and for other purposes. [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 378. An Act to amend the "Real Property Statute 1861" [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 379. An Act to amend the Law relating to Insolvents and their Estates. [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 380. An Act to repeal the Act intitled "An Act for the Establishment of a Board of Agriculture." [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 381. An Act for enabling the Council of the Shire of Ararat to erect a Shire Hall and buildings connected therewith, and to purchase land for such purpose. [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 382. An Act to sanction the issue and expenditure of certain sums from "The Public Works Loan Account" for Salaries Wages and Contingencies for the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one. [Assented to 29th December 1870.]
- No. 383. An Act to provide for reimbursing Members of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly their expenses in relation to their attendance in Parliament. [Assented to 29th December 1870.]

THE SHIRE OF DAREBIN DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of June 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Sir James McCulloch
Mr. Wilson
Mr. Wrixon.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 23) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by not less than one third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of any one or more ridings of a united shire for all ridings of which a voters' roll shall be in force, to divide anew such united shire into such separate ridings as to him may seem fit by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by such Order in Council be assigned to the same and equal in number to the whole number of councillors hereby or hereunder assigned to such united shire divided by three, and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the original ridings which shall have become such upon the union: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the twenty-sixth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy the united Shire of Darebin was constituted and the boundaries thereof were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons whose names appear on the voters' rolls of the said united shire: And whereas notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth divide anew the said United Shire of Darebin into six several ridings, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the names and boundaries of such ridings in manner following, that is to say:—

1st. THE NORTHCOTE RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 136 in the parish of Jika-jika; thence east to the Darebin Creek; thence southerly by the centre of that Creek to the north angle of portion 119 of the aforesaid parish; thence westerly to the north-west angle of portion 113 of the same parish; thence southerly to the south-east angle of portion 89 of the said parish; thence west to the south-west

angle of the same portion; thence south to the Merri-merri Creek; thence northerly by the centre of that creek to the commencing point.

2nd. THE PRESTON RIDING.—Commencing at the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Woolbert; thence east to the Darebin Creek; thence by the centre of that creek southerly and by the western boundary of the Gowersville Riding to the south-east angle of portion 139 in the parish of Jika-jika; thence west to the Merri-merri Creek; thence by the centre of that creek northerly to the north-west portion of 139; thence east to the south-west angle of portion 144 in the last-named parish; thence north to the north-west angle of portion 147 of the same parish; thence west to the Merri-merri Creek; thence by the centre of that creek to the point of commencement.

3rd. THE GOWERVILLE RIDING: Commencing at the south-west angle of section 7 in the parish of Morang; thence east to the Plenty River; thence southerly by that river and the boundary line of the late Morang Road District to the south-east angle of portion 138 in the parish of Jika-jika, being a point on the Darebin Creek; thence west to the south-west angle of the same portion; thence by the centre of the Epping road, and further north-easterly to the south-east angle of section 14 in the parish of Keelbundoora, being a point in the Darebin Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek northerly to the north-west angle of section 27 in the last-named parish; thence east to the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Morang; and thence north to the starting point.

4th. THE MORANG RIDING: Commencing at the north-west angle of section 10 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence east by the centre of the Yan Yean road to a point on the Plenty River; thence southerly by the centre of the said river to the south-east angle of section 6 in the parish of Morang; thence west to the south-west angle of section 7 of the last named parish; and thence north to the commencing point.

5th. THE EPPING RIDING: Commencing at the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence west to the north-west angle of section 16 in the parish of Woolbert, being a point on the Merri-merri Creek; thence southerly by the centre of that creek to the south-west angle of section 2 in the last named parish; thence east to the south-east angle of section 1 in the parish of Morang; and thence north to the commencing point.

6th. THE WOODSTOCK RIDING: Commencing at the north-west angle of section 28 in the parish of Merriang; thence north to the centre of the road; thence by the centre of that road to half a chain north from the north-east angle of section 31 of the same parish; thence south to the north-east angle of section 18 of the same parish; thence east to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 9 in the parish of Tarrywong; thence south to the south-west angle of section 2 in the parish of Yan Yean; thence west to the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Kal-kallo; thence north to the north-west angle of section 9 in the last-named parish; thence west to the south-west angle of section 15 in the same parish; thence north to the Merri-merri Creek; thence by the centre of the said creek to the south boundary of section 9 in the parish of Merriang; thence west to the south-west angle of the said section 9; and thence north to the point of commencement. The Woodstock Riding being identical with the late Road District of Woodstock.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND FOR THE BENEFIT OF PILOTS, PILOTS' WIDOWS, AND CHILDREN OF PILOTS, MADE UNDER "THE PASSENGERS, HARBORS, AND NAVIGATION STATUTE 1865," AMENDED 6TH SEPTEMBER 1867, NO. CCCXII.

1. *Superannuation*.—No pilots unless they shall have completed a term of ten (10) years' service shall be entitled to be placed upon the superannuation list, and in the event of their decease before the completion of such service their widows and children shall not be entitled to participate in the benefit of the fund.

2. *Superannuation*.—Pilots who having attained the age of sixty (60) years shall have become in the opinion of the board incapacitated from following their calling, or pilots after serving ten (10) years and upwards who from infirmity or other grounds of incapacity shall have become in the opinion of the board unfit for duty, shall be entitled to an annual pension from the superannuation fund according to the annexed scale:—

3. *Provision for widows of pilots*.—Widows of pilots whose husbands have served ten years and upwards shall receive remuneration from the fund, in proportion to the annexed scale.

On the decease of a pilot, either in the exercise of his calling or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, leaving a widow him surviving, such widow will become entitled to a pension, having reference to the term of service of her deceased husband, according to the annexed scale:—

The above scale is subject to the proviso that the pension to the pilot's widow shall in no case exceed £40 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him 10 years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever shall first happen; and shall in no case exceed £50 per annum unless she shall have been married to him at least 15 years at the time of such decease or superannuation.

4. *Provision for children of pilots*.—If a pilot shall die, leaving a widow and children, a capitation allowance shall be made in favor of the children at the rate of £5 per annum to each child, until he or she shall have attained the age of 15 years, as long as the widow shall continue in existence. On her decease, should there be any children under the age of 15 years her surviving, the pension payable to the widow is to be divided into as many equal portions as there are children, and each such portion is to be continued as a yearly allowance in addition to the capitation allowance payable as aforesaid to each such child to be continued until the age of 15 is attained, but without benefit of survivorship between the children, and subject to the

further proviso that no child shall in any case receive a larger allowance (capitation money included) than £15 per annum.

In the event of a pilot dying leaving children under 15 years of age, but no widow him surviving, the allowance to each child is to be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow surviving him for a period of twenty-four hours.

5. *Scale for the future relief of those persons who have from time to time been receiving bounty from the fund*.—The following is the scale of payments adopted by the board for the persons hereinafter named, who have for a period of time received bounty from the fund:—

- Mary Steele, widow of John Steele (pilot), deceased. £20 per annum.
- Louisa Jones, widow of William Jones (pilot), deceased. £25 per annum.
- Janet Poole, widow of John Poole (pilot), deceased. £20 per annum.
- Margaret Williams, child of Hugh Williams (pilot), deceased; born 17th May 1857. £15 per annum.
- John Neil Nicholson, child of William Nicholson (pilot), deceased; born 27th April 1859. £11 5s. per annum.
- William Margaret Nicholson, child of the aforesaid William Nicholson; born 23th August 1860. £11 5s. per annum.
- Alexina Elizabeth Nicholson, child of the aforesaid William Nicholson; born 4th April 1862. £11 5s. per annum.
- Margaret Lang Nicholson, child of the aforesaid William Nicholson; born 25th April 1863. £11 5s. per annum.

N.B.—The children being orphans, the calculation is made as £5 per annum for each child, and the widow's allowance of £25 per annum additional, pilot Nicholson at his decease having been twelve years in the service.

6. *Sick allowance*.—A sick allowance of One pound (£1) per week shall be paid to each pilot so long as he shall give satisfactory evidence to the board that he is incapacitated by reason of illness from performing his duty.

7. *Retiring allowance*.—A retiring allowance of Twenty-two (£22) pounds ten (10s.) shillings is fixed as the retiring allowance to any pilot leaving the service for each year that he shall have served, provided such term of service shall have been not less than ten (10) years, and also that he grants a release to the board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself, his wife, and children.

8. *Suspension of widow's allowance on her re-marriage*.—In all cases of a widow of a pilot re-marrying, her pension shall be suspended from the date of her re-marrying; but in the event of her again becoming a widow, her pension may be restored to her upon proof being adduced to the satisfaction of the board that she is in circumstances needing assistance and is otherwise deserving of bounty, but it will be again liable to suspension during future re-marriages.

9. *Increase of fund by contribution from pilots' earnings*.—With a view of increasing the fund, all pilots shall pay towards its maintenance a sum of one and a quarter per cent. on their gross earnings, to be deducted by the secretary with the administrative expenses.

10. *Gratuity inalienable*.—The provision hereby made for pilots, their widows and children, are intended to be personal and inalienable by charge, mortgage, executions under judgment, insolvency, or other voluntary or involuntary disposition, and notwithstanding any assignment which may purport to have been made thereof, the board shall pay the person entitled irrespective of any such assignment; or, if necessary for the protection of such persons under this clause, the board may apply the same at their discretion for the benefit of such persons, or of other members of their families.

11. *Reservation of board to rescind, alter, or amend preceding rules*.—The board reserves to itself the power of rescinding, modifying, or altering the preceding provisions in any particular (if the condition of the fund, or other circumstances should in their opinion make it desirable so to do) both as to the then existing or inchoate claims upon the fund, and as to future claims.

QUARANTINE DISTRICT UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

NARRAPORT RUN.—Commencing at the north-west angle, and bounded on the north by the Karyria run, bearing easterly about eight miles; thence southerly about eight miles twenty-six chains; thence westerly to the eastern boundary of the Morton Plains run about two miles and a-half; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Morton Plains to the eastern boundary of Wirumbirchip, bearing north-westerly about seven miles and a-half; and thence by the eastern boundary of Wirumbirchip run, bearing northerly about three miles to the commencing point.
