## CUTTING OR REMOVING CABBAGE-PALMS IN EAST GIPPSLAND PROHIBITED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed, or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any Cabbage-palm (*Corypha Australis*) in East Gippsland.

## PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Campbell's Creek Road District by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of October 1869, to the Fryers Road District and the Indigo Road District by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and to the Borough of Chiltern and the Borough of Guildford by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of January 1870: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of May 1871 the Borough of Chiltern and the Indigo Road District have been constituted one district by the name of the Indigo United Road District: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the fifth day of June instant the Campbell's Creek Road District and the Fryers Road District have been united with the Borough of Guildford, and constitute a Shire under the name of the United Shire of Mount Alexander: And whereas it is expedient to re-extend Part II. of the above recited Act to the collective areas comprised within the Indigo United Road District and the United Shire of Mount Alexander: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned whereby Part II. of the recited Act was extended to the Campbell's Creek Road District, the Fryers Road District, and the Indigo Road District, and to the Borough of Chiltern, and the Borough of Guildford, and do revoke so much of such Proclamations as extends Part II. aforesaid to the said road districts and boroughs; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the united road district and the united shire respectively hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE INDIGO UNITED ROAD DISTRICT, and  
THE UNITED SHIRE OF MOUNT ALEXANDER.

No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Goulburn, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, divide the said Shire of Goulburn into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE TABLIK SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment No. 29, parish of Franjip; thence by a line west to the Goulburn River, being the southern boundary of the parishes of Bunganail and Wahring; thence by the Goulburn River to the junction of Hughes' Creek; thence by Hughes' Creek, the southern, eastern, and north-eastern boundary of the road district to the commencing point.

## PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

The body was wrapped in two portions of an old cotton chemise roughly stitched together in four places with fine white cotton thread, the stitching being puckered in lumps as if done by an awkward hand. These coverings were clean and dry, and had not been exposed to wet. The navel-string was left about 6 inches long and was loosely tied with black cotton thread. The head was thickly covered with black hair. The medical evidence showed that the child was born alive about midnight of the 25th of May, that she had lived less than an hour, and that death had resulted from violence, the appearances being such as would result from the head having been beaten against a stone wall.
